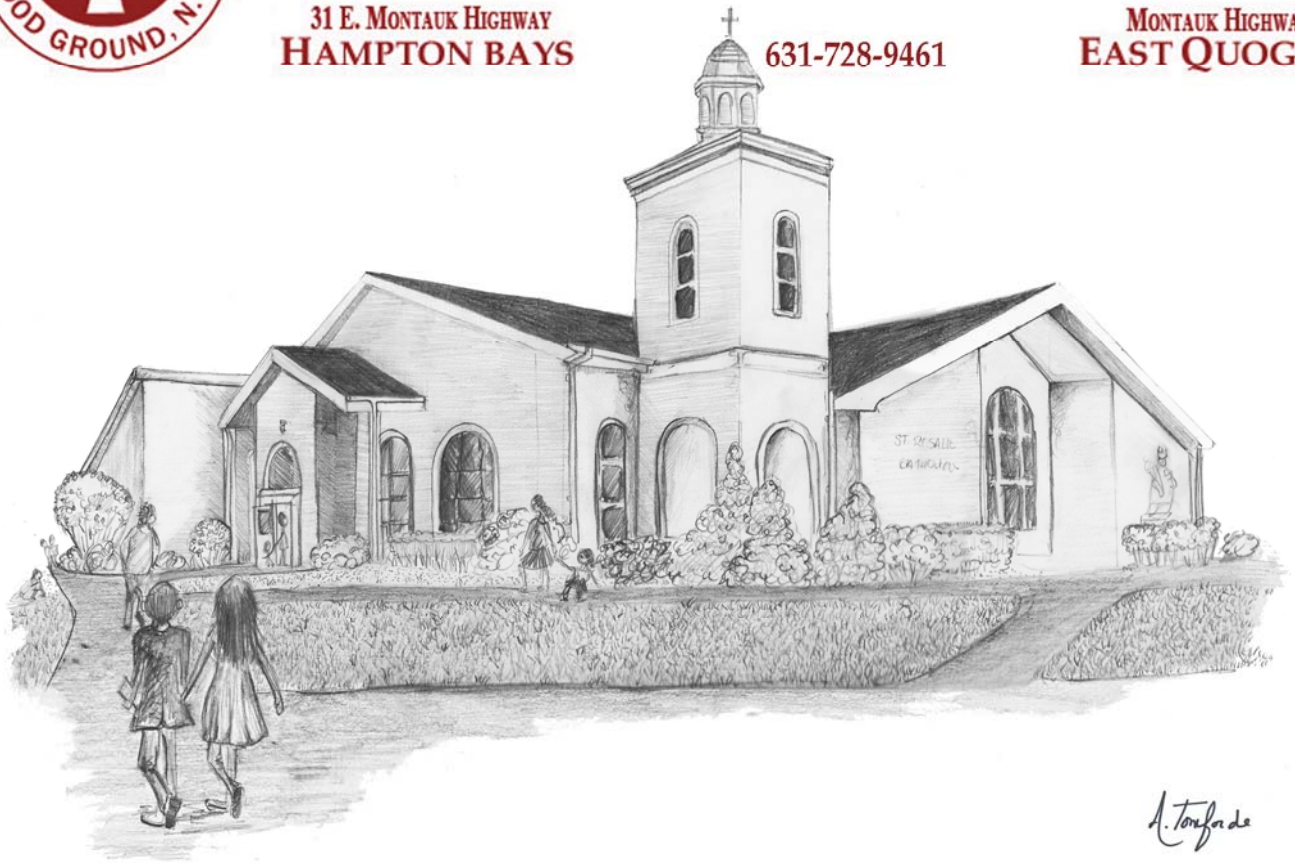

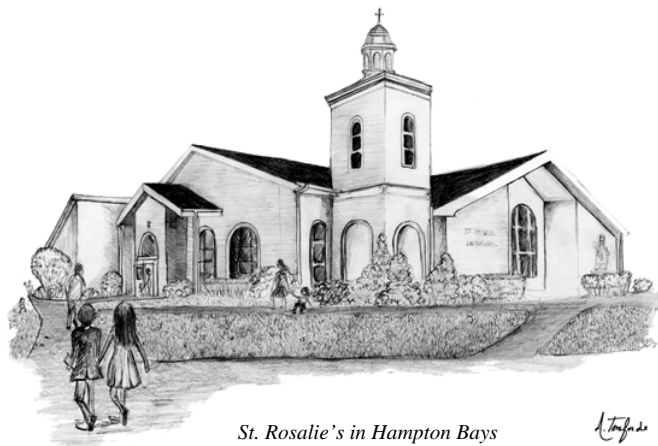

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

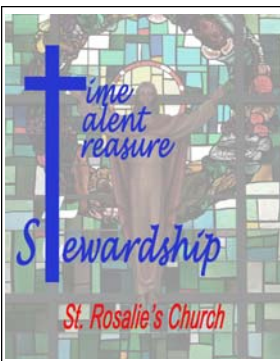
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From The Pastor's Desk

In today's Gospel from Saint Matthew on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, we hear: *Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.* MATTHEW 2:11-12 This

Solemnity of the Epiphany usually falls on the Sunday after the Feast of the Holy Family. This year since Christmas was a Sunday it falls exactly after the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God January 1. The Feast of the Holy Family fell this year on Friday, December 30.

Today we think of the gifts offered to our Lord: the gold signifying His royalty, frankincense, or incense which indicates praise and homage offered to our new-born king. Our prayers like "incense" rise to the heavens. The myrrh is bittersweet as it is the spice which will be used to prepare Christ's body for burial. The life Christ takes up as the God-man; the death He endures for us is His mission. Through His Resurrection all of us may have life and have it to the full!

Today's feast highlights the fact that Christ came for all not just for the Jews. He came for all mankind. Why not ask Christ to illuminate your path this day and this year! Let us give our gifts of ourselves to Jesus Christ our new-born king who came out of love to save and protect us and help us prepare to live one day with Him in heaven. In a very real way, we need to bring Christ's message to others today. This is the whole emphasis that Pope Francis and all of us should have on this Solemnity of the Epiphany to bring Christ's light to the whole world!

Again, I thank all for your generous Christmas gifts to your church. During the winter months especially, your generosity helps us to maintain our parish life when some of our seasonal parishioners are in Florida or away from their spring and summer residence.
