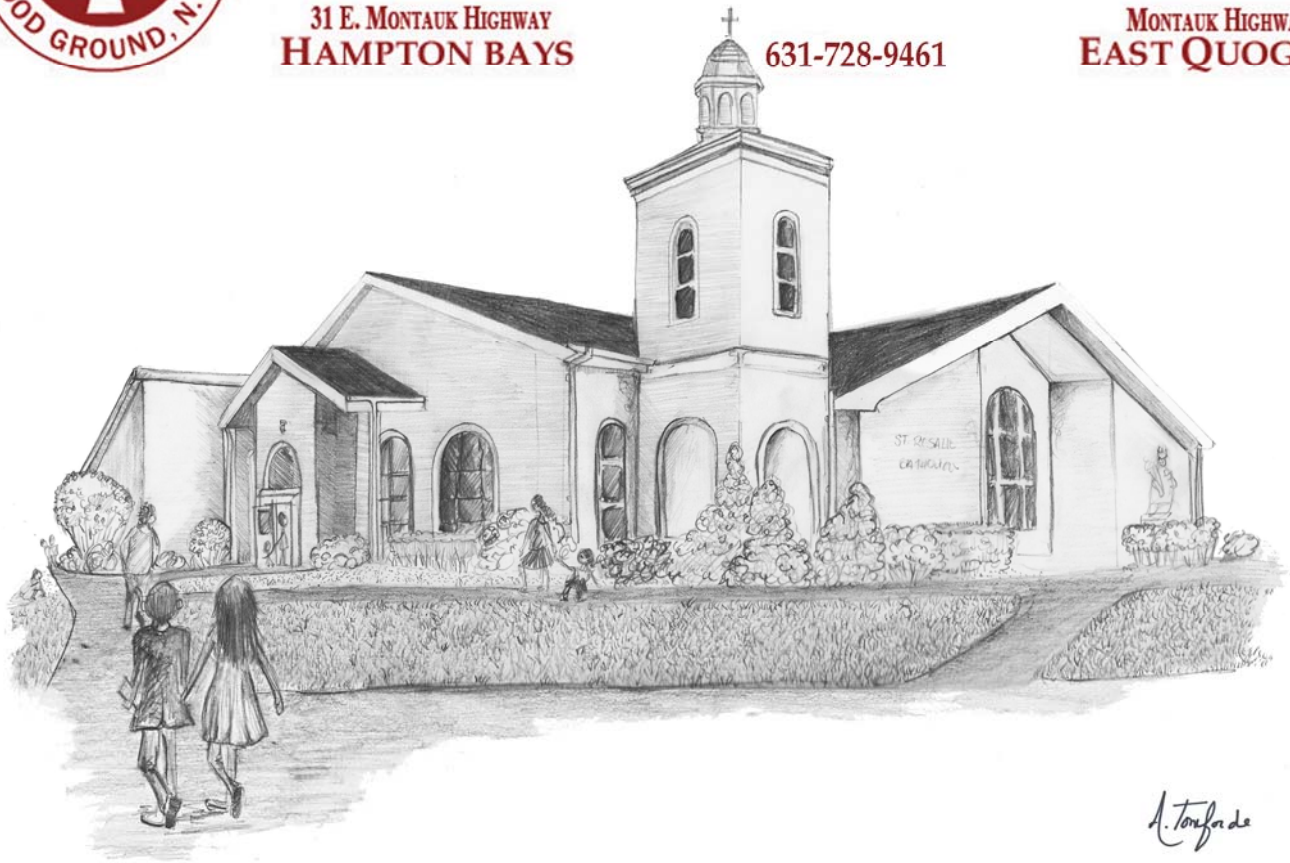

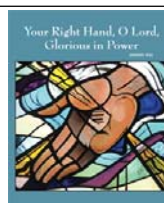

The church in East Quogue is closed and will re-open with the 9 a.m. Mass on Palm Sunday, March 25.



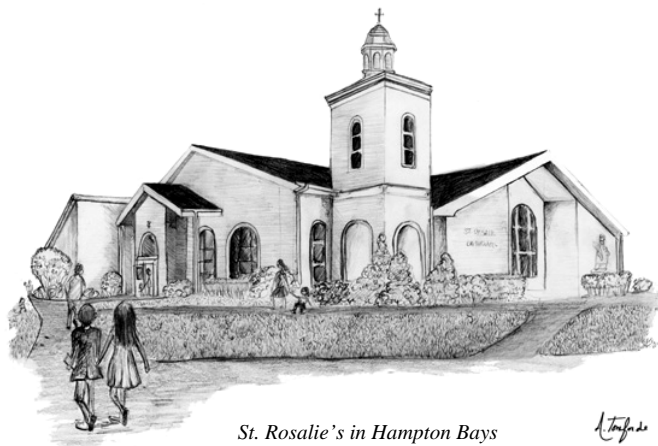

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

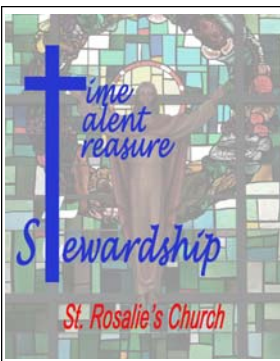
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

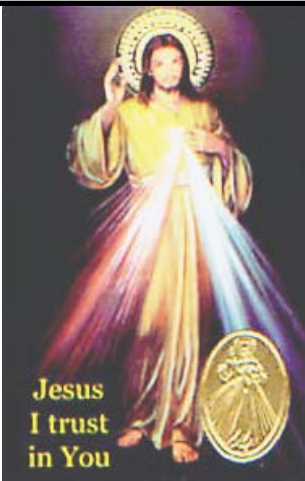

Mardi Gras at St. Rosalie's

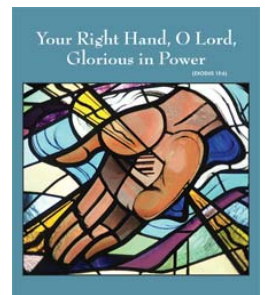
This year we have reserved the Community Center for our Mardi Gras celebration. It will be held on Tuesday February 13, from 6 – 8 p.m.

Respect Life Finalists

Be not Afraid

Each year for the past eight years, levels C1, C2 and C3 (seventh—ninth grades) have been required to submit a contest entry based on a theme chosen by the Diocesan Respect Life Office. This year's theme is: **Be Not Afraid**.

Students can express what that means to them through one of the many category choices: a bookmark, a poem, an essay, a music video, an original song, a photo or a photo montage. Of those submitted, I can only choose one in each category from levels C1 and C2 combined, as well as one from each category in level C3. The Respect Life office then chooses those submissions against others submitted by parishes or Catholic schools in the diocese. Our C3 (ninth grade) submissions are judged with those who have entered from ninth through 12th graders in the diocese. I am very happy to state that in the past we have had one first place winner and one second place winner in the Level 2 categories (ninth-12th grades). This means our ninth graders were chosen over some older students in 10th—12th grades!

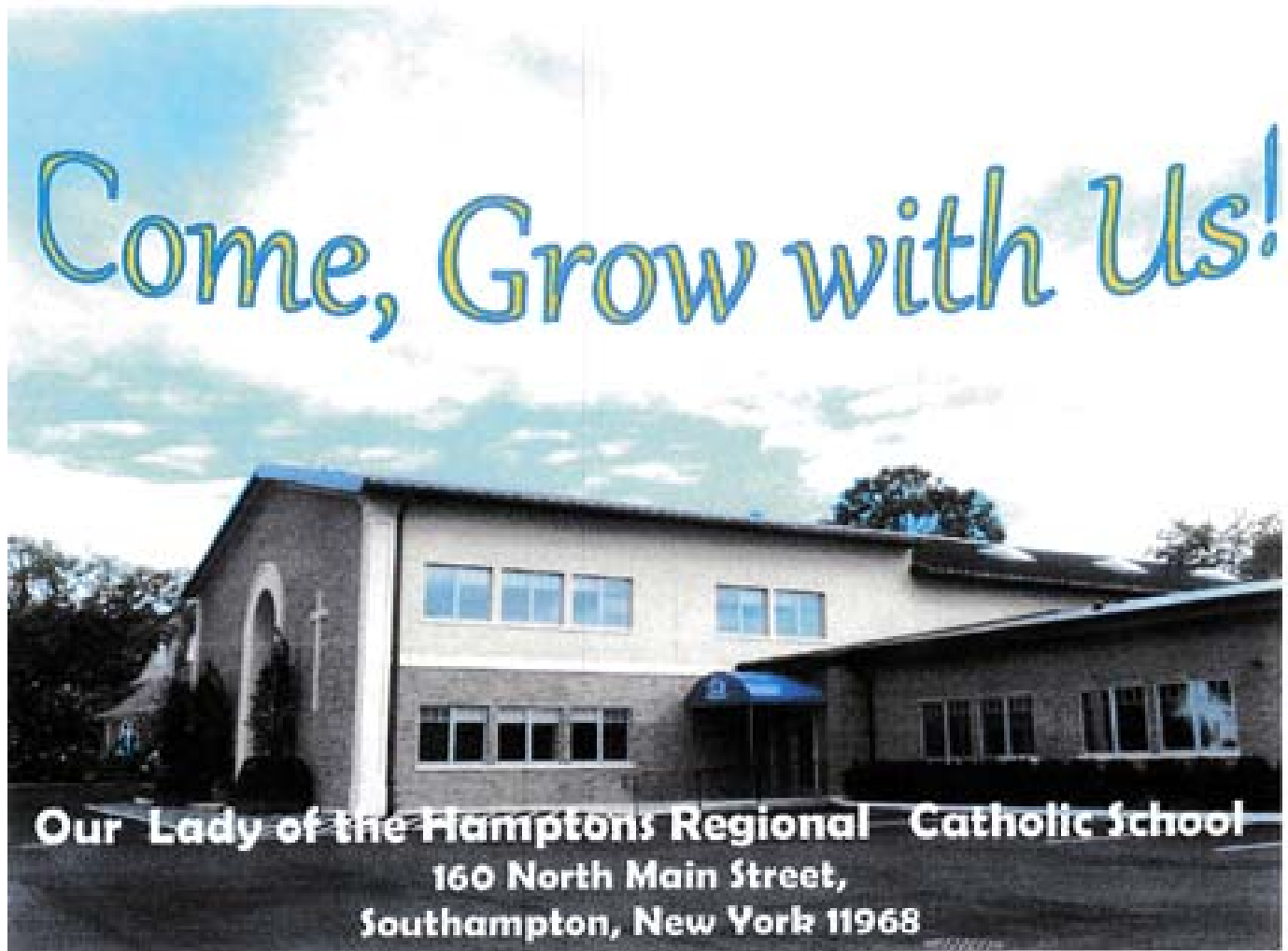
For Level 2 (ninth grade): Katerina Reich for her Essay, James Farrell for his Bookmark, and Sofia Presutti for her Poetry.

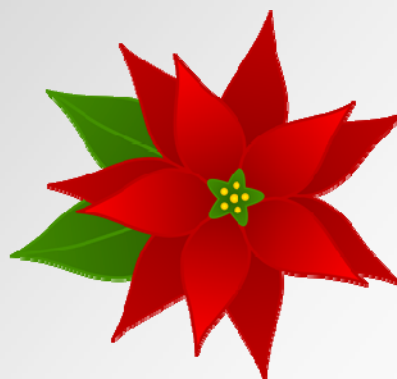
