



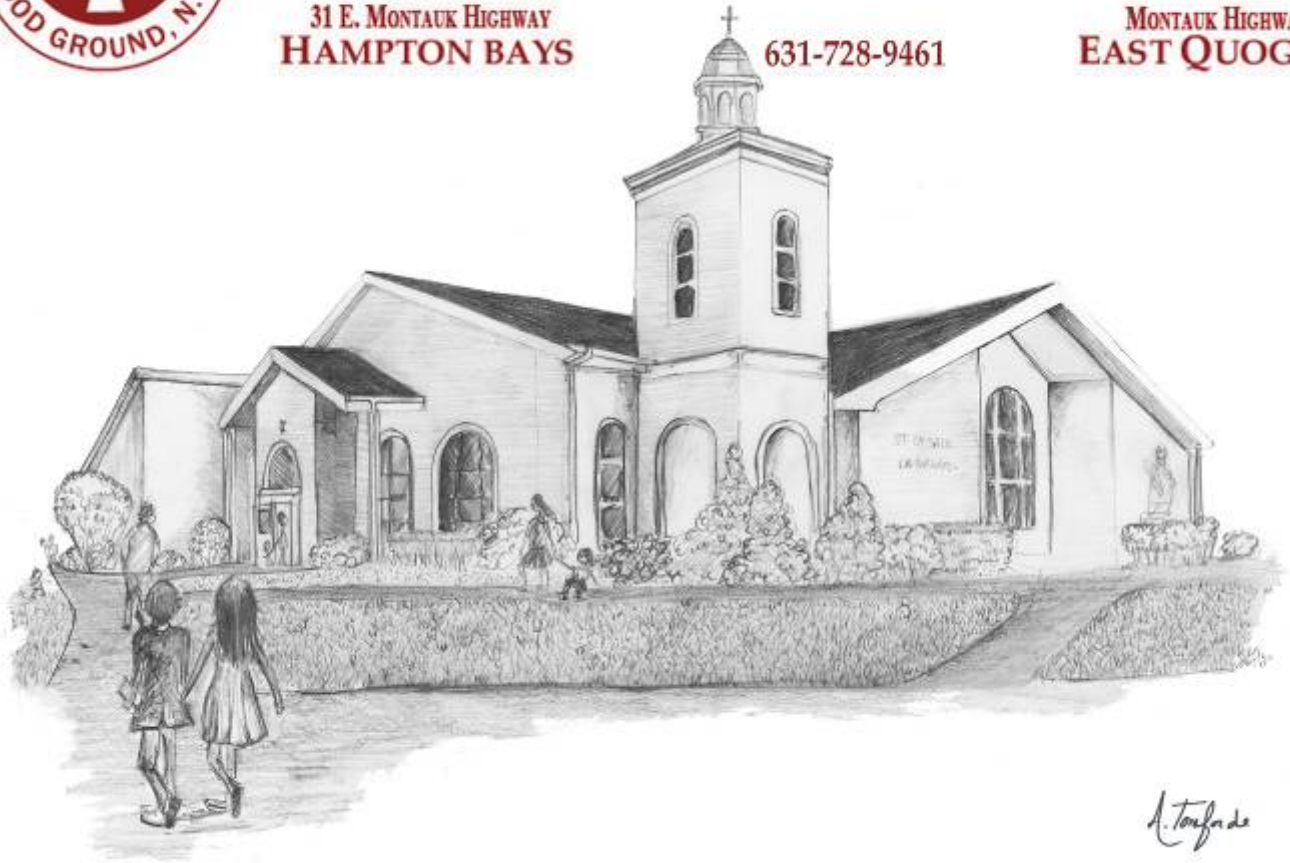

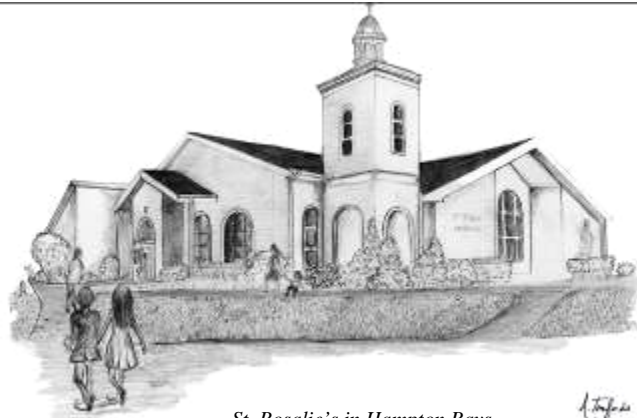

The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program at St. Rosalie's Church

We have all suffered the loss of someone near and very dear to us. It may have been a spouse, child, parent, sibling or friend. Often our grief can be so devastating that we may feel completely lost and alone.

The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program is a nine-week program in which healing can begin. It provides members with an opportunity to understand grief in a way that rebuilds our identity and strengthens our faith in ourselves and in our Lord. Now in its sixth year, the **Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** helps members to understand that grief is experienced in each person differently, and that it often takes a very long time for the pain to heal. Participants will learn strategies for dealing with grief and will receive (and give) valuable group support and fellowship throughout the healing process.

Anyone who has experienced grief will be enriched by attending. **The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** at St. Rosalie's Church will meet on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. in the Parish Center, beginning **March 5**, for nine sessions. We invite all interested parties to call the Parish Center at 631-728-9461 and register now before the maximum enrollment is reached. There are no fees or expenses to participate. This is a Church-sponsored opportunity to heal.

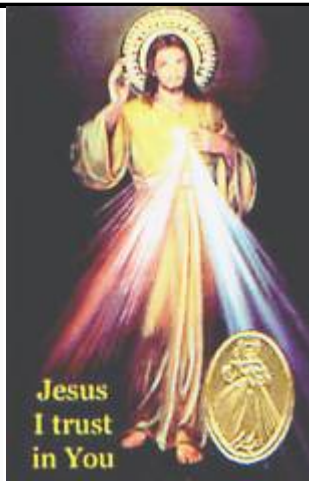

Religious Formation

It is sad that Christmas season is over, and my Christmas wish did not come true. I still need some catechists to cover classes that used to be covered by those who are now in the warmer climate. But I live in hope. I need to have catechists on Monday, for levels 4 and 6 and someone willing to be a substitute as needed for levels 1-6 on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

In this New Year I am happy to list the finalists in grades 7, 8, and 9 for the diocesan Respect Life Contest. Each year we submit those entries who have been selected by our staff to compete against all others in those grades in our diocese, from both Catholic and public schools.

The Level 1 (grades 7 or 8) finalists are: G. Vanderschaaf (bookmark), M. Heaney (poetry), C. Pensa (essay).

The Level 2 (9th grade) finalists are: S. Sutton (essay), A. Jedlicka (photography), N. Heaney (poetry), D. Ottati (bookmark).

We will know if we have any winners at the awards ceremony in May. I will make announcements of any winners. I am very proud to submit their work. It reflects their heart and mind on the theme: "Every life – cherished, chosen, sent." While every student in grades 7, 8 and 9 must submit a project in any of the categories offered: essay, poem, bookmark, photo, collage, mural, music, or video, only one from each category, in each level, can be submitted as a finalist.

All children in levels 1-6 are having a presentation on a new safety program from our diocese. It is called "Child Lures Prevention – Think First and Stay Safe." It is a program adopted for the Diocese of Brooklyn, which has used it for eight years. All of the parents have been given booklets to help them reinforce what is taught to their children using age-appropriate language and materials. It is refreshing to be able to present to our young ones the role that God has in their lives in His desire for their safety, both physically and emotionally, and what can happen to those who turn away from Him, or never knew His love. It is not a subject that can be ignored or a matter to discuss without God's love included in it.

Very soon all of the children will be making St. Valentine's day cards to be distributed. Any homebound Eucharistic Minister that would like to bring Valentines to those to whom they minister should feel free to take one from the box that will be available in the Fellowship Room on February 9 and 10. It is our way of helping our young ones recognize the love they extend to those they do not know. This practice helps bring God's love to others.


