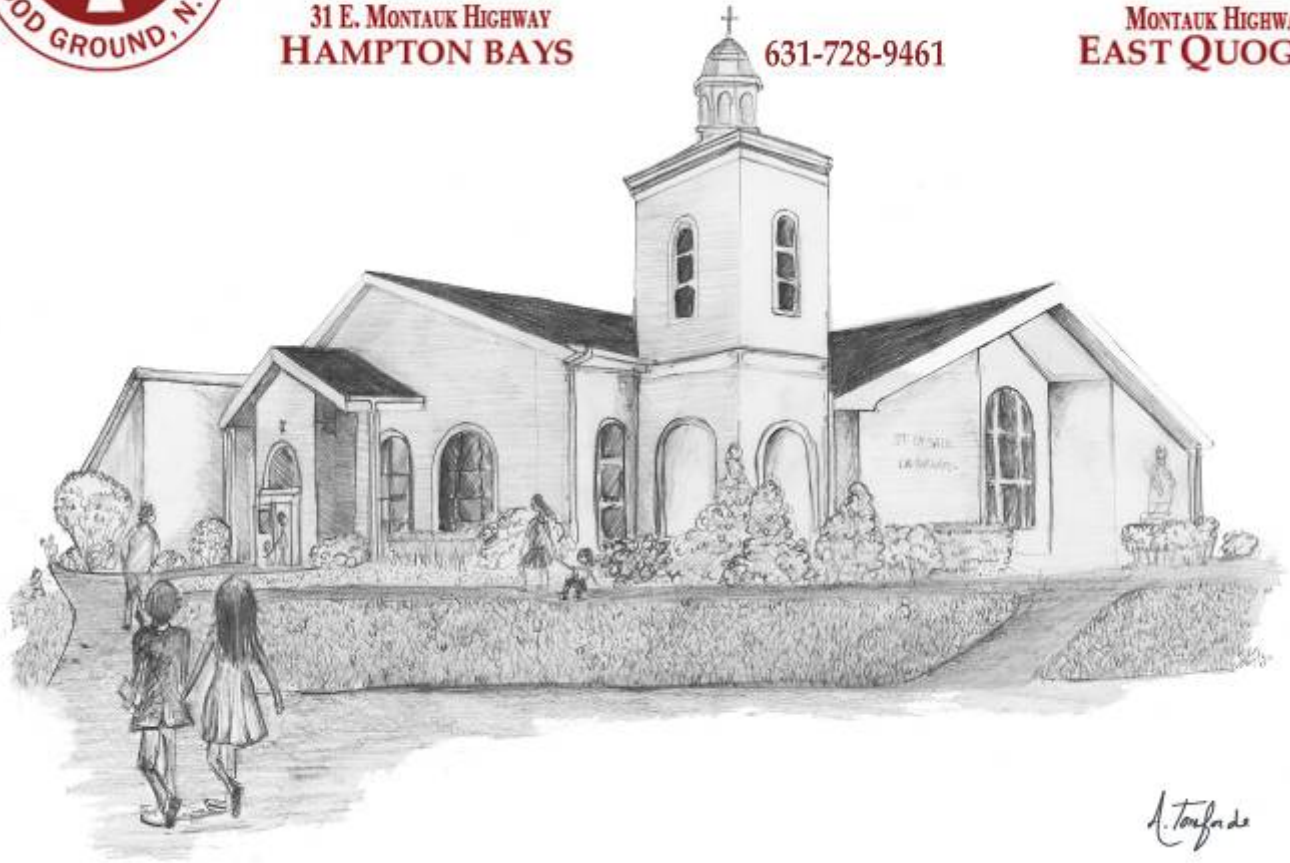

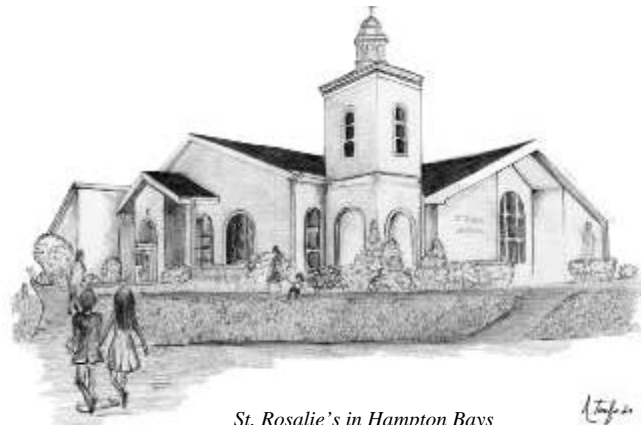

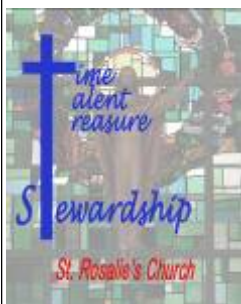

From the Desk of Father Maddaloni

WHERE DOES POOR BOX MONEY GO?

Near the doors of the church, built into the walls, are metal boxes marked "St. Rosalie RCC Poor Box." In East Quogue, the box is free-standing. What happens to the money that is deposited into these boxes?

That money is used exclusively to help those in need. It is separated from funds intended for other purposes – that means *separate bank accounts*. Poor box money is never used for general operating expenses or capital improvements.

In the past, poor box donations were given to our local St. Vincent de Paul conference to be used for their good works helping those in need. The parish of St. Rosalie is blessed to have several organizations devoted to helping those going through difficult times. We have the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Centro Corazon de Maria, both of which operate largely independently of the parish, and our own parish Outreach/Food Pantry. My goal of bringing the poor box funds under the auspices of the parish is to widen the pool of persons in need who may benefit from those funds.

As of February 1 of this year, poor box money is deposited into an account that was established earlier with funds donated to be used to help people in financial straits. The parish generally uses that money to help individuals/families in need with large necessary expenses such as rent, repairs (e.g. to cars, oil burners), and other necessary bills. For such expenses, money is dispersed from that account via checks mailed to the appropriate companies, landlords, etc. Recently, in the unusual circumstance of a long government shutdown and before food arrived from Long Island Cares to help them, St. Rosalie's gave King Kullen gift cards to members of the Coast Guard working without being paid. We provided the bulk of those gift cards thanks to these funds ear-marked to help those in need. As of this month, poor box money will help replenish those funds so that we can continue this assistance.

Can someone still choose to donate to the St. Vincent de Paul Society or to Centro Corazon de Maria? Of course! A check made out to one of those organizations can be mailed to the appropriate organization c/o St. Rosalie RC Church, or it can be dropped off at the Parish Center.

Thank you for your kindness to those going through difficult times.

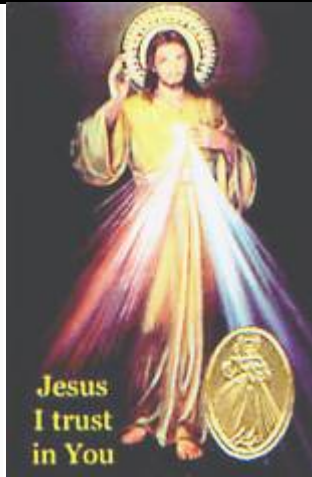

Now in its sixth year, the **Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** helps members to understand that grief is experienced in each person differently, and that it often takes a very long time for the pain to heal. Participants will learn strategies for dealing with grief and will receive (and give) valuable group support and fellowship throughout the healing process.

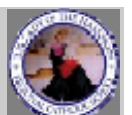

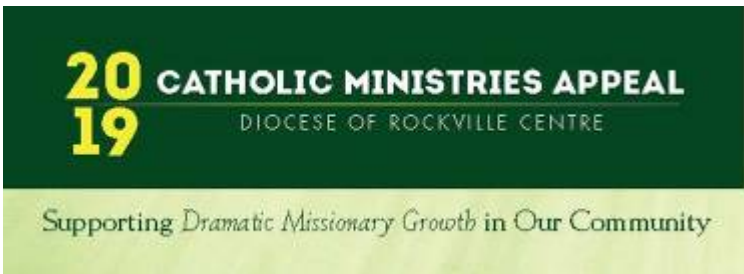

We just wanted to share a little of our Annual Conference Report with you now, a full report will be given in the next few weeks. In 2018 we helped over 600 Neighbors in Need from St. Rosalie's Parish. We also visited patients in the hospital, made elder care visits and provided food cards to emergency calls on weekends. Their needs varied greatly, but thanks to your generosity, we were able to help bury the dead, provide furniture to those that were once homeless, give some rent assistance, emergency dental assistance, legal help through our partner Nassau/Suffolk Law Service. We provided moral support, and always treated our neighbors in need with dignity and respect.



Our Vincentians donated almost 1000 hours and drove over 2500 miles in support of those 600 neighbors. Through parishioner donations, our car wash and Walk for the Poor in September, along with donations from our members, we raised a total of \$19,539.00. A dollar value has not yet been determined for the clothes and furniture you have given through the collection bins in the parking lot, and all the donations given to our thrift store. **Thank You Does Not Seem to Say Enough** about the call from Jesus to do the **Works of Mercy** that you have answered.
