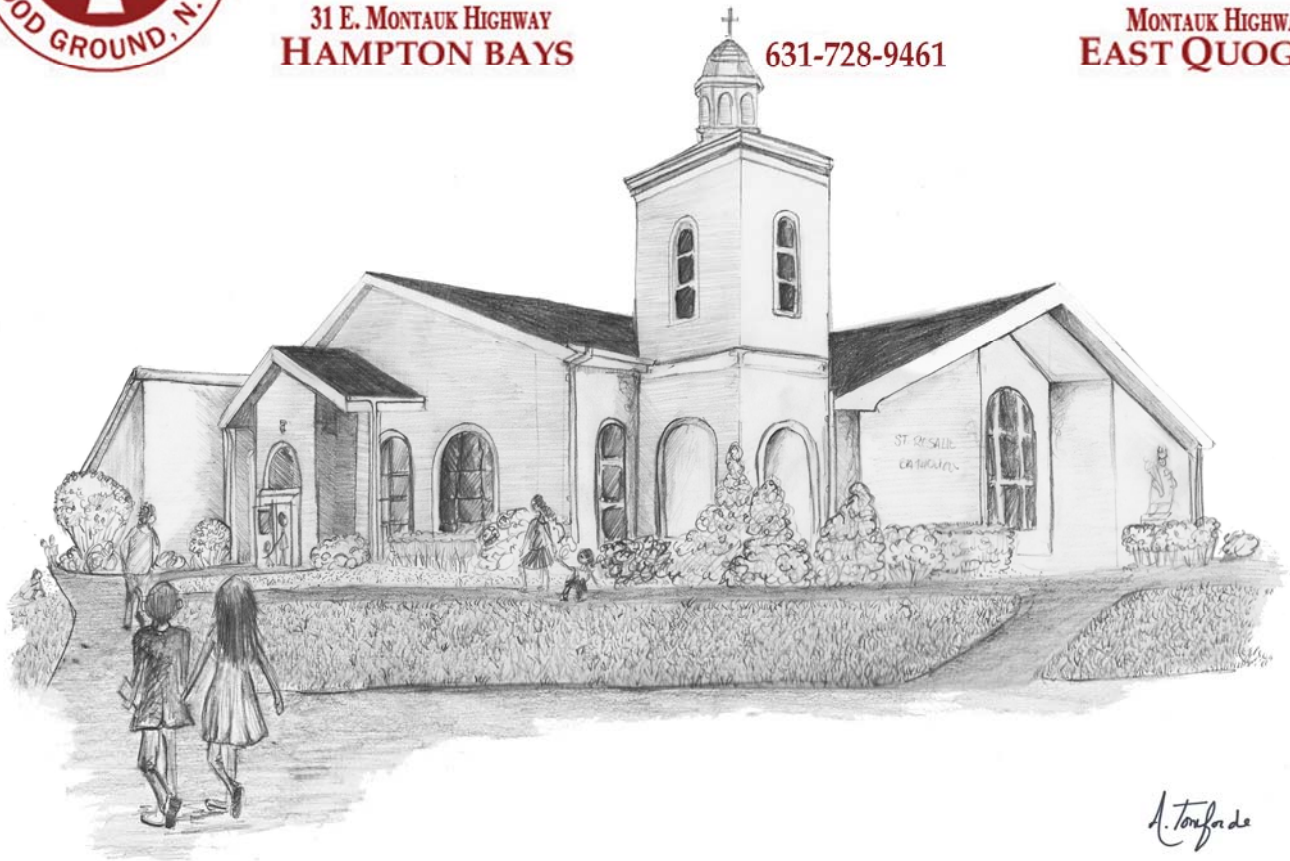

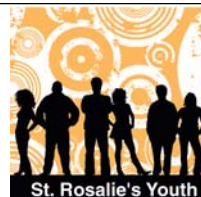

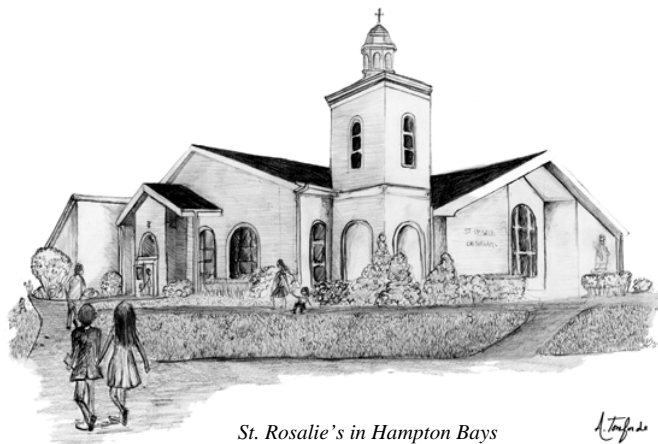

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

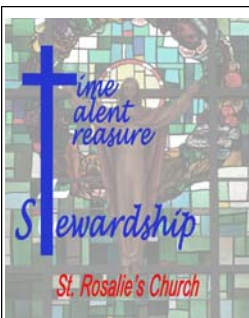
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From The Pastor's Desk

### God's Wisdom

In today's second reading we hear:

*When I came to you, brothers, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive [words of] wisdom, but with a demonstration of spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.*

*Yet we do speak wisdom to those who are mature, but not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away. Rather, we speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew; for if they had known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. 1 CORINTHIANS 2:1-10*

We are all servants of Jesus Christ as we strive to emulate Him. It is God's wisdom that gives us the knowledge to love and serve God. It gives us power – the power to serve and to love! In a few weeks we will enter into the Season of Lent. We have been given a great commission by our God, and we have been entrusted with the Mission that Jesus came to serve. So we think of the poor, and we recognize that since we are made in the image and likeness of God we live in the pursuit of the mission He has entrusted to us. We have been given a share in the eternal promise of our God, a God who loves us more than we can imagine.

Congratulations to our new Bishop, Bishop John O. Barres who was named by Pope Francis on December 9, and installed on January 31 as the fifth Bishop of Rockville Centre at Saint Agnes Cathedral. Bishop Barres was the Bishop of Allentown for seven and a half years. As many of you saw on Telecare, he is very committed to the Church and in particular has invited the Youth of our Island to engage in our faith. We are very blessed to have Bishop Barres. Our new Bishop will celebrate Mass here at Saint Rosalie's on Thursday, March 16, with the entire Peconic Deanery present. It will be at 7:30 p.m. with a Welcome Ceremony at 7 p.m. before the Mass.

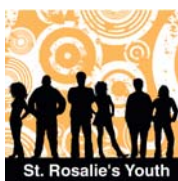

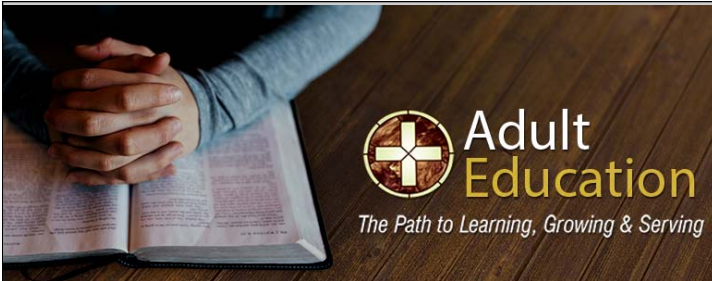

attend one or the other) with an emphasis on prayer, the interior life and a guided reading of the spirituality of five Doctors of the Church and their spiritual journey.

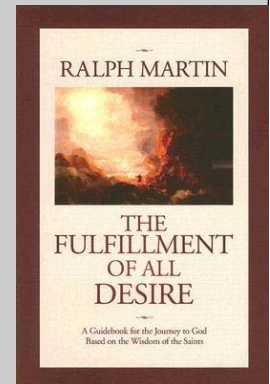

We have all suffered the loss of someone near and very dear to us. It may have been a spouse, child, parent, sibling or friend. Often our grief can be so devastating that we may feel completely lost and alone.

**The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** is a nine-week program in which healing can begin. It provides members with an opportunity to understand grief in a way that rebuilds our identity and strengthens our faith in ourselves and in our Lord. Now in its fifth year, the **Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** helps members to understand that grief is experienced in each person differently, and that it often takes a very long time for the pain to heal. Participants will learn strategies for dealing with grief, and will receive (and give) valuable group support and fellowship throughout the healing process.

Anyone who has experienced grief will be enriched by attending. **The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** at St. Rosalie's Church will meet on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. in the Parish Center, beginning **March 7**, for nine sessions. **"No he venido a abolir la ley o los profetas; sino a darles plenitud"** - El libro de Éxodo nos relata que Dios dio a Moisés la Ley escrita en dos tablas (Ex 32:15-16). La Ley guio el pueblo de Israel, pero el pueblo pecó contra la Ley repetidamente. Finalmente, Dios dijo, en el libro de Jeremías que iba a establecer una nueva Alianza con Israel. Dijo, "pondré mi Ley dentro de ellos, y la escribiré en sus corazones" (Jer. 31:33).

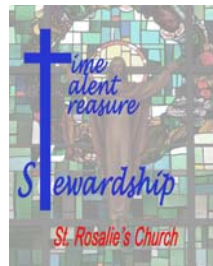
The Alumni Communion Breakfast is the perfect way to catch up with former teachers, reconnect with fellow alums, and see all the beautiful

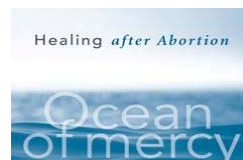

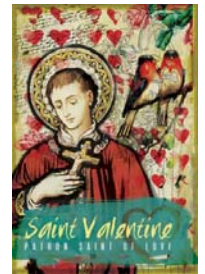
## Boy Scout Valentine's Day Rose Sale
