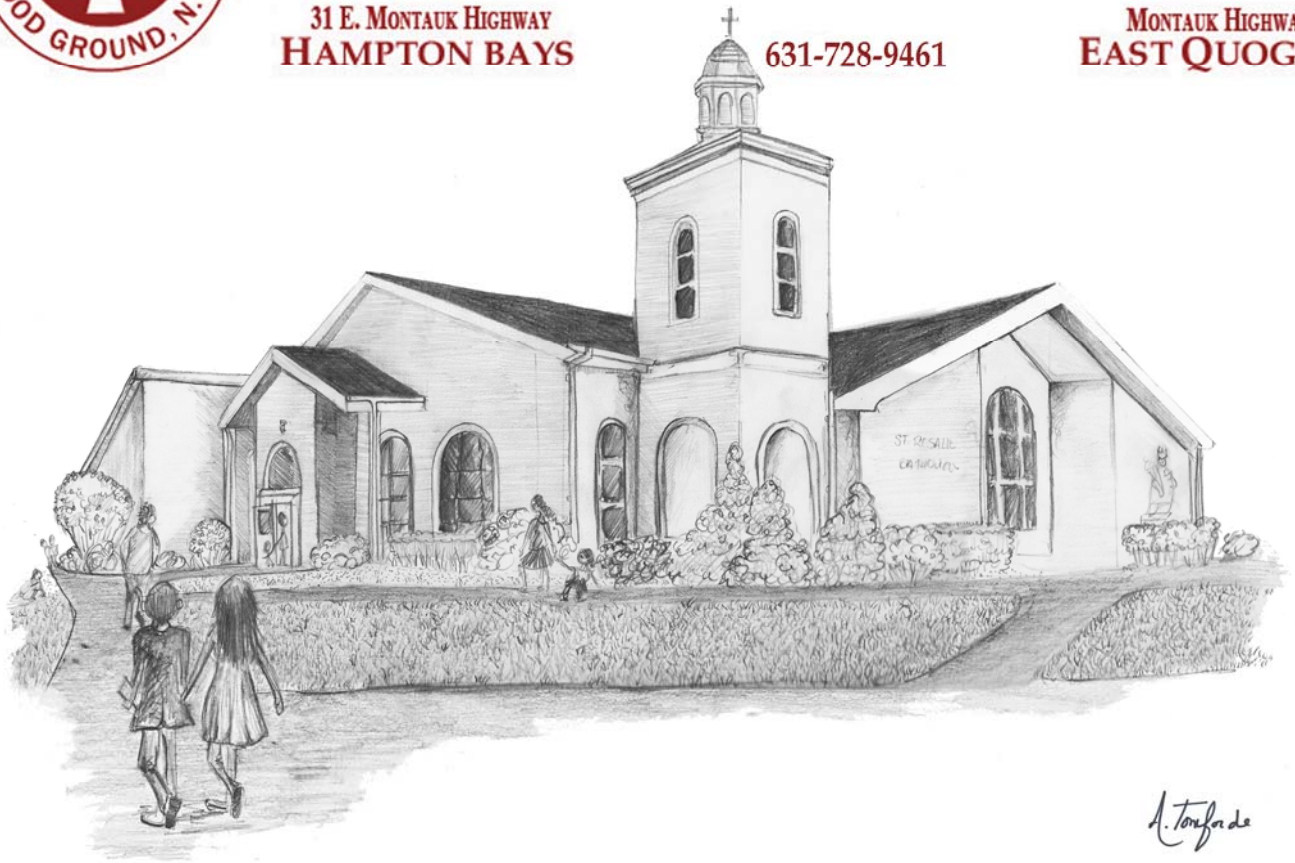

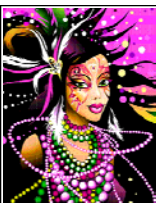

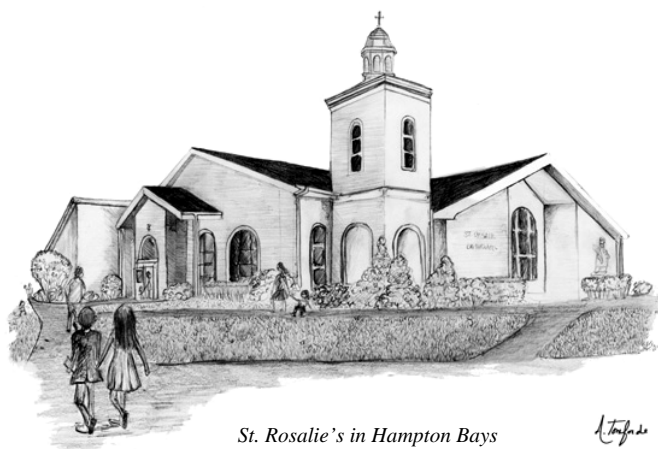

## From The Pastor's Desk

### Our Lives of Service

In today's second reading we hear:

*Thus should one regard us: as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God.*

*Now it is of course required of stewards that they be found trustworthy.* 1 CORINTHIANS 4:1-2

We are all servants of Jesus Christ as we strive to emulate Him. As we prepare in these days to enter into the Season of Lent, we think of how we are good stewards of the mysteries of our faith. 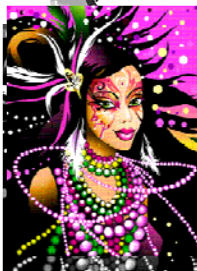
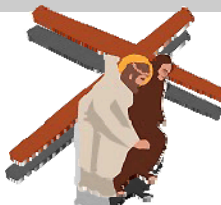

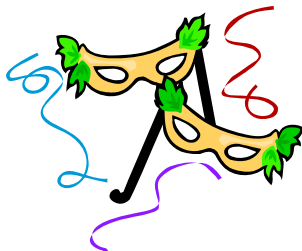

## The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program at St. Rosalie's Church



We have all suffered the loss of someone near and very dear to us. It may have been a spouse, child, parent, sibling or friend. Often our grief can be so devastating that we may feel completely lost and alone.

**The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** is a nine-week program in which healing can begin. It provides members with an opportunity to understand grief in a way that rebuilds our identity and strengthens our faith in ourselves and in our Lord. Now in its fifth year, the **Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** helps members to understand that grief is experienced in each person differently, and that it often takes a very long time for the pain to heal. Participants will learn strategies for dealing with grief, and will receive (and give) valuable group support and fellowship throughout the healing process.

Anyone who has experienced grief will be enriched by attending. **The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** at St. Rosalie's Church will meet on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. in the Parish Center, beginning **March 7**, for nine sessions. ## Lenten Almsgiving

Lent begins this coming week. Ash Wednesday is March 1. Almsgiving and mite boxes are a rich part of Catholic Lenten tradition. Many of you may remember with fondness the mite box traditions from your youth.

To encourage almsgiving as a parish community, our Committee for the Common Good will once again be handing out mite boxes after all weekend Masses this weekend. Parishioners have responded very favorably to this tradition which we revived a few years ago. How you use your mite box is up to you! Two commonly used ways to contribute are to put aside the money you have saved from treats given up during Lent or you may empty the change in your pocket into the box daily.

Most of the alms money donated will go directly to our Social Services Ministry which benefits the community food pantry that helps our neighbors in need. The remainder will be sent to Catholic Relief Services to help the millions in dire need who benefit from their charity. This will help remind us all that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, both near and far, we do unto Jesus.

To help develop this tradition in our youth, we will also be distributing mite boxes at religious formation classes. Most of their money will likewise go to the food pantry with a portion going to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association to help the victims of violence in the Middle East, many suffering as a direct result of their faith. We want to encourage parents to take the lead in making this a family endeavor. Tell them what a difference their contributions can make from the money saved from those small things they choose to give up. Explain to them that our Lord is as interested in the positive things we can do in this world as with the things we give up in His name.

We hope this Lenten season is a time when all in our community can grow in their love for the Lord and their neighbor, for it is a prayer, fasting and giving that we receive the blessings of a grateful heart.

The mite boxes will be collected at all Palm Sunday Masses April 8 and 9.

**"Nadie Puede Servir a dos Amos"** – En el Evangelio de hoy continuamos con la lectura del Sermón del Monte. Jesús dice que no podemos servir a dos amos; no podemos servir a Dios y al materialismo. Nos invita a confiar en Dios y a reconocer que solo Dios nos cuida. En estos días hay mucha ansiedad e incertidumbre en nuestra comunidad. Pero Dios nos dice, "No se inquieten... Busquen primero el Reino de Dios y su justicia... No se preocupen por el día de mañana." Este es un mensaje que necesitamos oír. Unidos en la fe, ponemos nuestra confianza en Dios y juntos podremos luchar para la justicia y para hacer el mundo mejor.

Este miércoles se inicia la Cuaresma. La iglesia nos ofrece este tiempo y nos invita a acercarnos más a Dios. Por medio de sacrificios, ayunas y oraciones cuaresmales podemos centrar nuestro corazón en Cristo y fortalecernos para vivir la fe en tiempos difíciles.

**Ayuno, Abstinencia y Actos de Penitencia para la Cuaresma:** Los obispos de los Estados Unidos prescriben, como obligación mínima, que todas las personas que han cumplido los catorce años y los mayores de catorce están obligadas a abstenerse de comer carne el miércoles de ceniza (el 1º de marzo) y todos los viernes de cuaresma y viernes santo. Además, todas las personas desde los dieciocho años de edad hasta los cincuenta y nueve años, inclusivos, están obligadas a ayunar limitándose a una sola comida completa el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo, mientras las otras dos comidas en esos días deben ser ligeras.

A todos los fieles se les anima, cuando sea posible, a participar en la Misa y recibir la santa comunión; a celebrar con frecuencia el sacramento de la penitencia; a iniciar lecturas espirituales, especialmente el estudio de las Sagradas Escrituras; y a participar en las devociones de cuaresma, así como en programas cuaresmales de educación. La adoración al Santísimo Sacramento es especialmente recomendada.

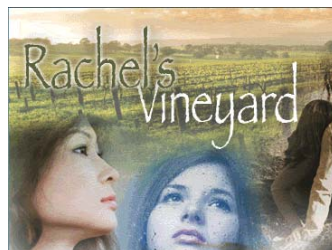

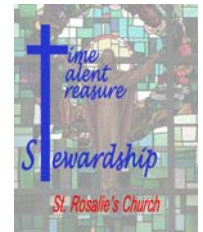

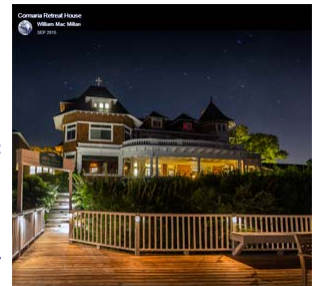
