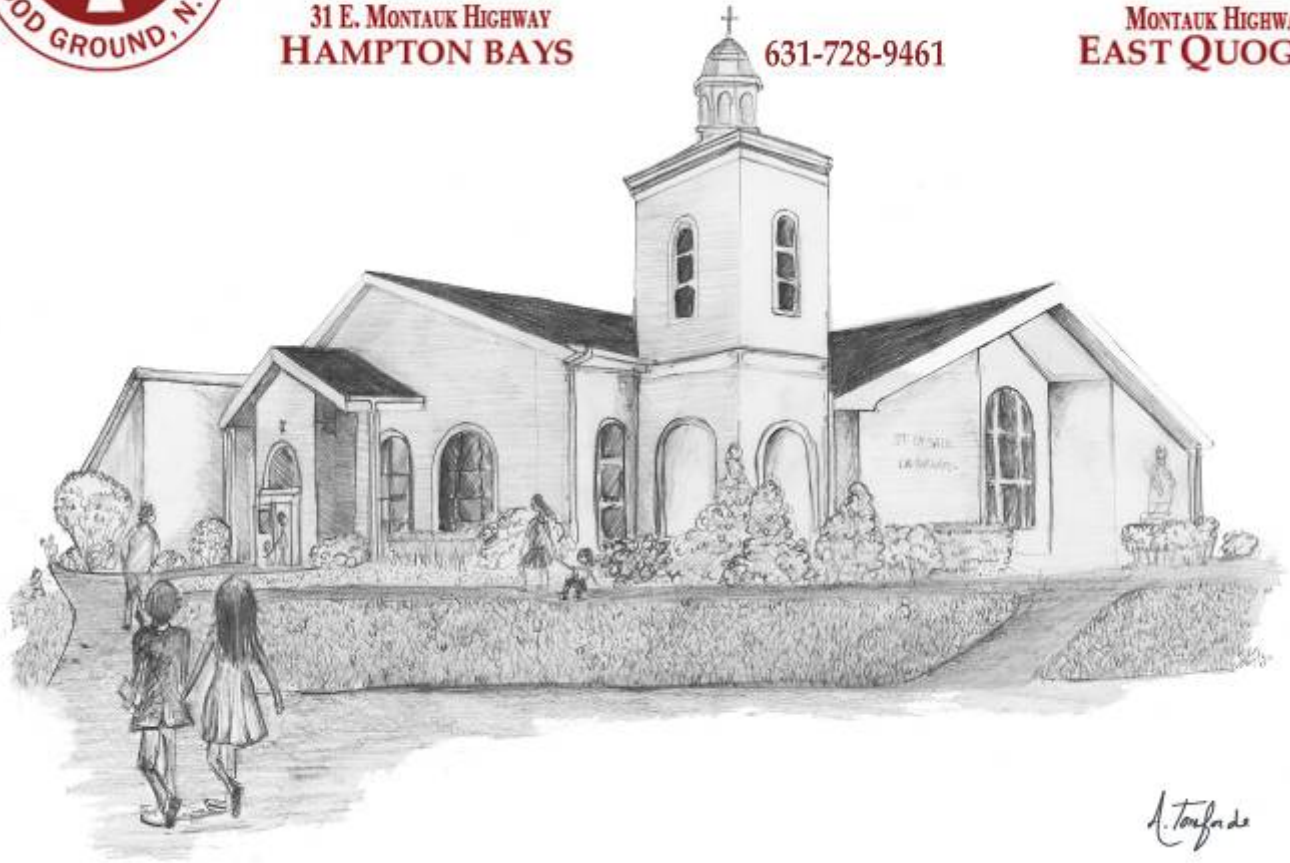

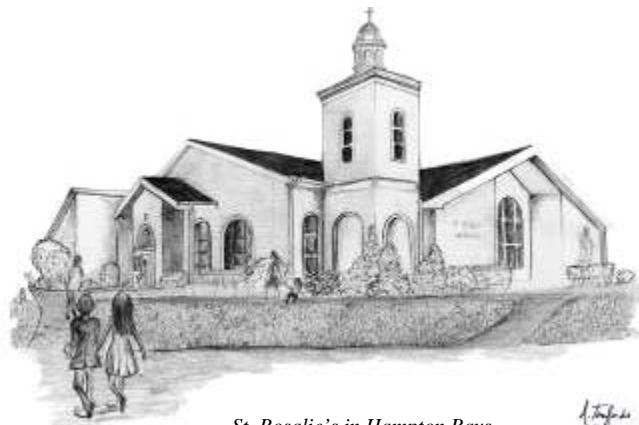

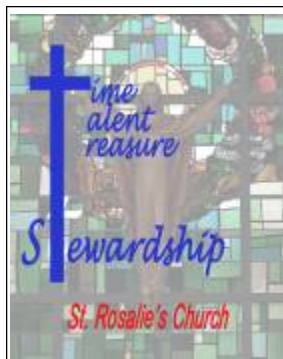

From the Desk of Father John

I would like to thank everyone who came out for my seven part series *Praying Like the Saints*. I learned a lot myself, and was happy to be able to speak to a sizeable number of people every week. For those of you who were unable to make any or all of the sessions, I figured that I would provide the names of the saints we covered, and the topics that we addressed.

Week 1 we spoke about St. John of the Cross, the great Spanish Carmelite. St. John speaks about the three stages of the spiritual life. In the purgative stage, the soul is drawn to God by consolations, graces, and increased knowledge of the Faith. This passes to the illuminative stage, which is often referred to as the 'dark night of the soul,' in which those consolations are withdrawn so that I can make true acts of love and faith with my prayers and good deeds. Finally, a soul in the unitive stage is so closely united to God as to be one with the Trinity. *Saint John of the Cross for Beginners* is an accessible resource on St. John, as his works are famously dense.



Week 2 we learned about what St. Teresa of Avila had to say about vocal prayer – prayers that take the form of structured words (such as liturgies, chaplets, or novenas). St. Teresa teaches that, simply put, we should be attentive to the words we are saying, and make them our own. St. Teresa's *The Way of Perfection* is a good introduction to her thought and personality.

Week 3 we discussed St. Benedict of Nursia and *lectio divina*, a method of prayerfully reading the Scriptures by silently and deliberately focusing on the words of the text and what they mean to me. The *St. Joseph Guide to Lectio Divina* by Karl Schurz is a good resource on this topic.

The following week, **Week 4**, we heard from St. Ignatius of Loyola on another type of Scriptural prayer, Ignatian contemplation. St. Ignatius's method taught us to imagine the Biblical scene, and to place myself into it as either a participant or spectator. *Meditation and Contemplation*, by Timothy Gallagher, is a helpful resource.

In **Week 5** we heard from St. Peter of Alcantara, on praying with particular Truths of the Faith. St. Peter recommends that we spend time mentally considering aspects of doctrine so as to grow in virtue. I cannot recommend his *Treatise on Prayer and Meditation* highly enough.

In **Week 6** we heard from St. Francis de Sales concerning the morning and evening offerings. In the morning, St. Francis recommends anticipating the upcoming day, and preparing for it in prayer. In the evening, he suggests going through the day again, and offering gratitude for good things and contrition for bad acts. His *Introduction to the Devout Life* is an excellent book on spirituality.

Finally, **Week 7**, we spent some time with St. Louis de Montfort on Marian Spirituality and the Rosary. His books *True Devotion to Mary* and *The Secret of the Rosary* are excellent works on the Virgin Mother.

Pamphlets were distributed at each of the sessions, and as of this writing I am looking at ways to put them online for your benefit. They will continue to be available at the parish in hard copy. Please feel free to come to me or any of the clergy here for help in your spiritual growth.

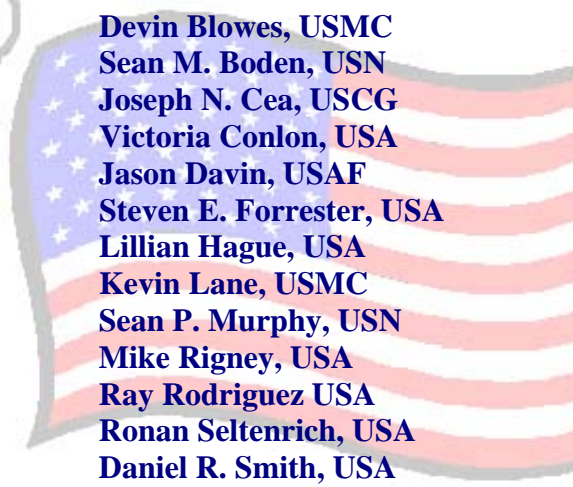

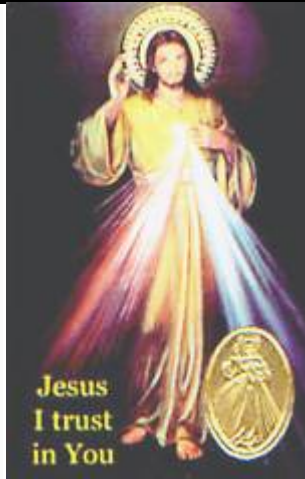

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

Called to Evangelize

For many of us, we publicly display our belief that our faith is a gift from God. How? Some of us may wear a cross or religious medal around our necks; others may give witness when receiving ashes on their foreheads at the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday. These are great things to do because we open the door of faith to those around us... we are witnesses! But, do we also have an unwavering faith? When times get tough, do we put our faith in God like Abraham did? When finances, work or school loom over us, do we cave to the fear and anxiety? Or do we, like Abraham, place our trust in a Loving God?

No one ever said life would be easy; in fact, most have said the opposite. Jesus, however, offers us hope. He tells us to come to Him and to take His yoke upon ourselves. In this week's Sunday reading, we learn from Abraham that we can - and should - trust in God. St. Paul mentions Abraham's faith because it is a model for us as Christians, especially in these challenging times.

Today we also celebrate the feast of St. Patrick, a man who despite living in a hostile and dangerous environment, accepted suffering and success with equal measure. By placing his faith in God, Patrick was able to live out his missionary call to evangelize Ireland. In so doing, he exemplified his formation as a disciple.

This week's Gospel is about Formation. God is forming us to be His disciples - do not be afraid! Listen to His call and trust in His will. As He guides us through life's problems, allow God to form you, like Patrick, into His disciple. He will if you let Him!
