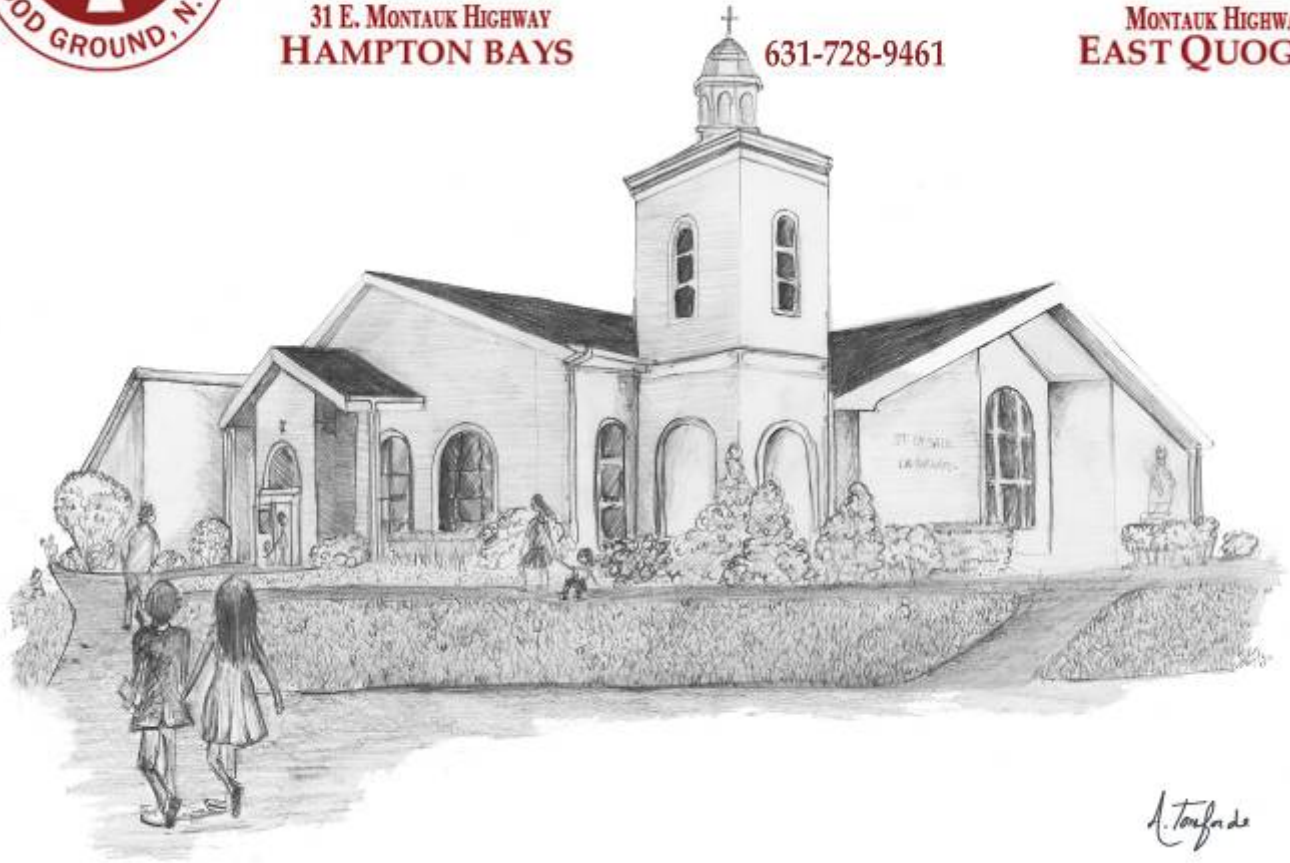

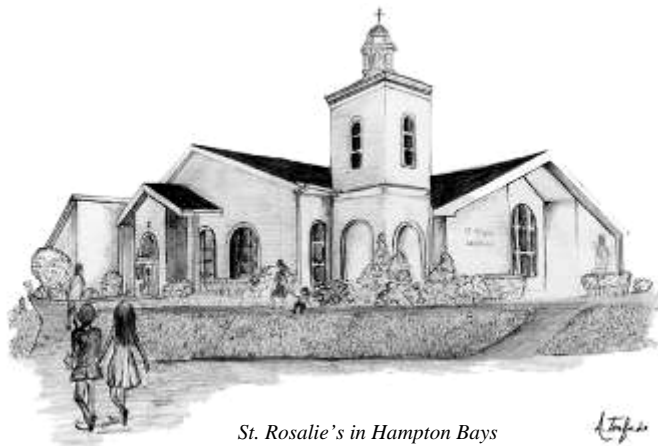

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

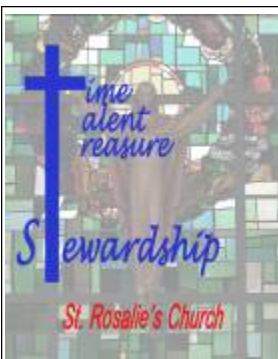
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Pastor's Desk

Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

The Procession with Palms, from the Gospel of St. Mark

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethpage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you, 'Why are you doing this?' reply, 'The Master has need of it and will send it back here at once.'" So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. Some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They answered them just as Jesus had told them to, and they permitted them to do it. So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. And he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out:

"Hosanna!

*Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come!
Hosanna in the highest!"* MARK 11:1-10

Palm Sunday is one of those Liturgies in which the mood changes so quickly reflecting that day when Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem! The palm branches and the cloaks are the welcome mat for Jesus and trumpet the jubilation as Jesus enters Jerusalem! When Jesus rode into the Holy City, people were so filled with the fascination and cheering into the Holy City, it appeared he was truly the King hailed and adored by all. As we celebrate Mass on Palm Sunday, 2018 the music, the very tone of the liturgy reflects the loud celebratory Hosannas and is followed at the conclusion of Mass with a solemnity and often silence. Within a few days the happy exuberance of the crowds is turned in to jeers. The crowd is now ready to crucify Him who healed, who touched and who loved. How often they, and we forget! Let us enter into these days prayerfully and re-enacting together the beautiful liturgies of Holy Week, which will help us to appreciate more and more fully the mystery of our faith: Christ has died, Christ has risen, and Christ will come again!

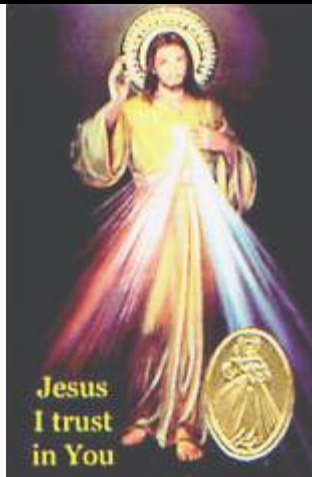

Centro Corazon de Maria

Children's Program

Since its founding in 2002 Centro Corazon de Maria has encouraged the participation of women in English classes and life skills workshops by providing free babysitting for their pre-school children. Six years ago when B.O.C.E.S. would no longer fund its pre-school program for the two to five year old children whose parents attended its ESL classes at St. Rosalie's Parish Center, Centro Corazon de Maria, realizing the importance of this service in preparing children for kindergarten, decided to take over the program. At present Sr. Mary Lang oversees the program; Brandee Torakis is the pre-school teacher and Emilia Aparicio and Liliana Villa are the bilingual teacher aides for the thirteen students who attend class on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. The program teaches Christian values and provides a stimulating environment where the children learn English and learn how to socialize and play with others. The curriculum includes opportunities to acquire the readiness skills needed for entering kindergarten and time for music, movement and art activities. What the children seem to enjoy the most is going outside to use the playground when the weather permits. A minimum monthly fee is charged for materials and healthy snacks. When any delay in development or on-going behavioral problem is observed, the staff works with the parent to find the necessary resources for the child.

The Children's Program offers Latino families in the area an excellent opportunity for their children to have a solid foundation in preparation for their future education.

Programa para niños

Desde su fundación en 2002, el Centro Corazón de María ha alentado la participación de las mujeres en clases de inglés y talleres de habilidades para la vida al proporcionar cuidado de niños gratuito para sus niños en edad preescolar. Hace seis años cuando B.O.C.E.S. ya no financiaría su programa preescolar para los niños de dos a cinco años cuyos padres asistieron a sus clases de ESL en el Centro Parroquial St. Rosalie, Centro Corazón de María, dándose cuenta de la importancia de este servicio en la preparación de niños para el jardín de infantes, decidió tomar sobre el programa. En la actualidad, Hna. 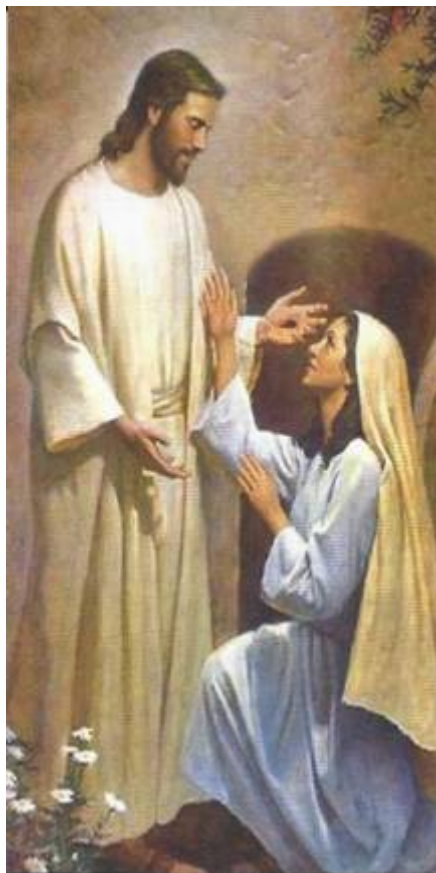
