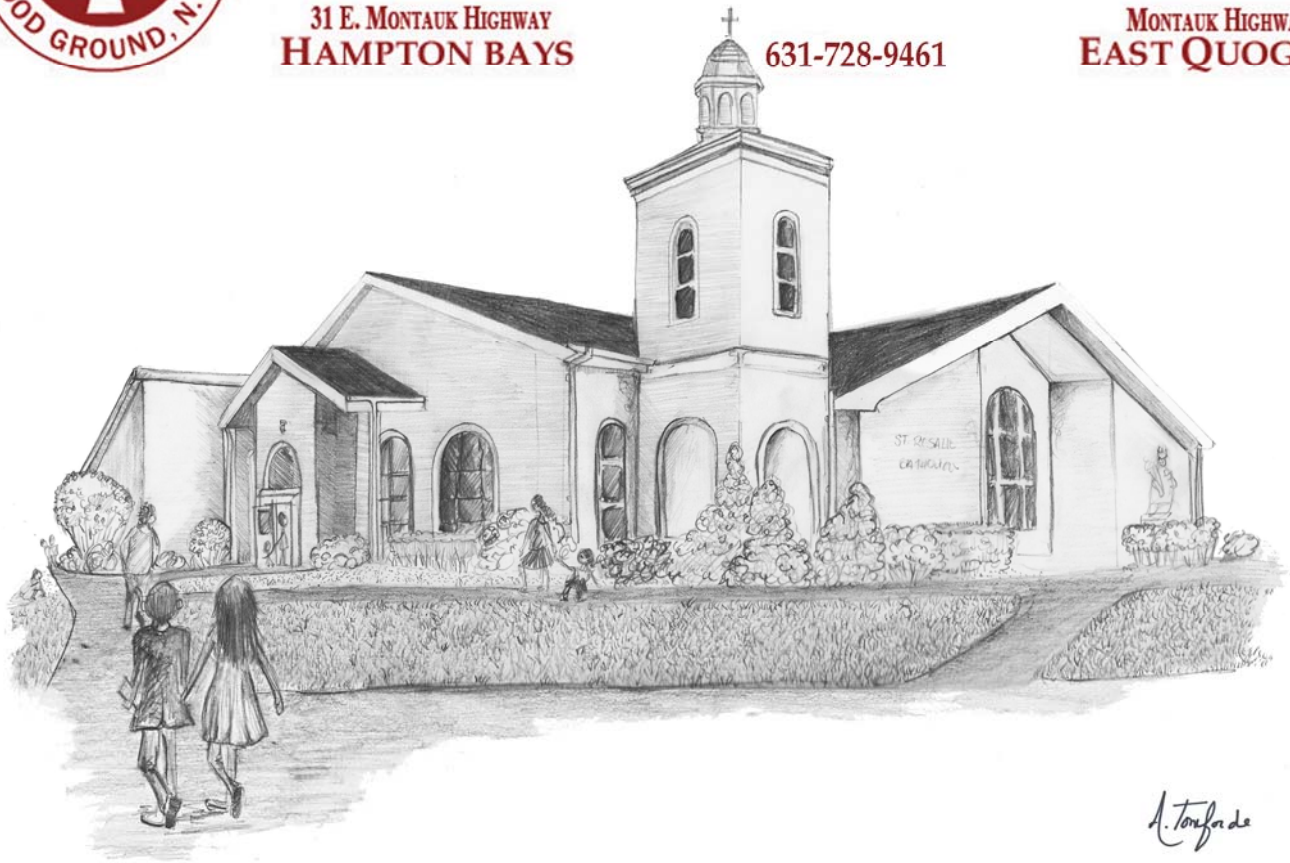

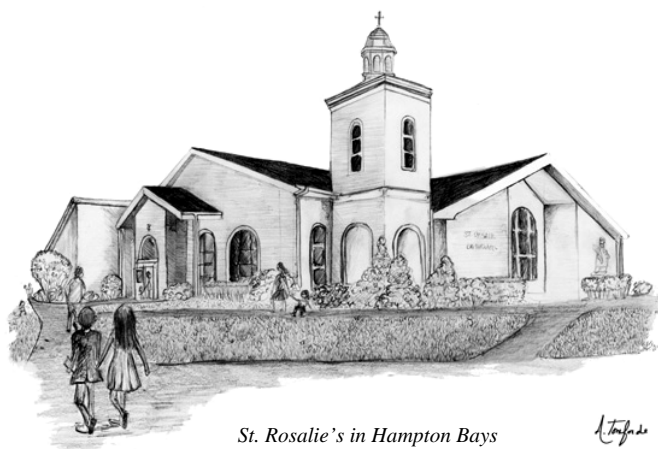

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

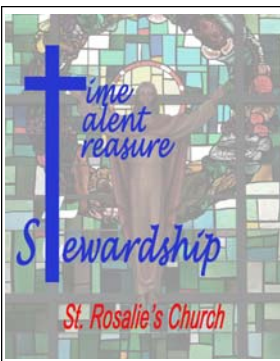
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From The Pastor's Desk

### First Holy Communion

Last weekend we celebrated our first day of First Holy Communion Masses on April 29. This weekend we celebrate two more and again on May 13 at Saint Rosalie's. ### Jesus, The Good Shepherd

Today is the fourth Sunday of Easter, 2017. Last Sunday, we recounted the beautiful story of the disciples encountering Jesus on the road to Emmaus and focused on the "breaking of the bread". We spoke about our family story in the context of Jesus' story.

As the Easter Season unfolds, we enter into a greater understanding of what the Eucharist means to each and every one of us, at Mass and how our lives are changed by this very celebration. Our openness leads us to our participation in the celebration, and ultimately how we integrate this gift into our own lives and therefore become the Eucharist for one another. This week we have the Gospel of Jesus the Good Shepherd. As we hear in John chapter 10: "... he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice." John 10:4. And later:

*So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep.*

*All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.*

*I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture.*

*A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy;*

*I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." JOHN 10:7-10*

Our story comes alive when we integrate it with the story of Jesus Christ. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. As a shepherd, He leads us to life, and as the Good Shepherd, he leads us to life through the Eucharist—the Gift of His Body and His Blood. That's what brings our faith alive. That's what makes our story alive. The last line that we read is "I came so that they might have life and have it to the full." That's what our story can become, a very full story, a story filled with life and in fact with LOVE! When we recognize Christ in our lives, our story, our lives become alive. They become holy. Life lived in union with Christ becomes the most beautiful expression of the love of the Blessed Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – in the world!

For the elderly on Long Island, **Meals-on-Wheels** is a lifesaver. Every weekday, the program delivers hot, nutritious meals to seniors who are homebound in Nassau and Suffolk counties. Meals-on-Wheels case managers can also assist these clients in accessing other services they might need.

*“I knew something was wrong as soon as I saw him,”* explains Steve, a driver for Catholic Charities’ Meals-on-Wheels. Steve had been delivering meals to Ed for several years and upon arriving that fateful day, immediately observed that he seemed disoriented.

Steve knew Ed was diabetic, so he checked his blood sugar and saw that it was low. He poured him some orange juice but sensed there was something more serious going on. *“I kept asking him to let me call 911 but he resisted. I couldn’t accept that so I just casually stuck around, making my case. He finally admitted that he didn’t have anyone to care for his dog if he was hospitalized, so I promised I would, and that’s when he gave me the green light to call.”*

It was a good thing, too. At the hospital Ed was diagnosed with a serious blood infection that kept him there for nearly four months. In the meantime, Steve cared for the dog until Ed’s sister arrived from out of town.

Para los ancianos que viven en Long Island, el programa de entrega de comidas **Meals-On-Wheels** es vital. Durante la semana laboral, este programa entrega comidas calientes y nutritivas a ancianos enfermos que viven en los condados de Nassau y Suffolk. El programa Meals-On-Wheels también ayuda a los ancianos a acceder otros servicios que pudieran necesitar.

Steve nos dice *“Cuando lo vi me di cuenta que algo andaba mal”*. Steve es un chofer que trabaja para Meals-On-Wheels de Caridades Católicas. Durante varios años Steve había estado llevando comidas para Ed, y en uno de esos días apenas llevo notó que Ed parecía estar desorientado.

Steve sabía que Ed era diabético así que chequeó su nivel de azúcar y se dio cuenta que estaba en niveles bajos. Le sirvió a Ed un vaso con jugo de naranja y se lo dio para que lo bebiera, pero Steve sentía que la situación de Ed era mucho más seria. *“Le dije que llamaría al 911 pero Ed se opuso tajantemente a que lo hiciera. Me quedé con él pues me parecía que algo no andaba bien. Ed no tardó en decirme que si fuera hospitalizado nadie cuidaría de su perro. Al saber esto, le ofrecí cuidar de su mascota, solo así Ed aceptó que yo llamara y pidiera la ayuda de emergencia que requería.”*

Este fue un buen arreglo para todos: El hospital encontró que Ed sufría una grave infección en la sangre y lo hospitalizaron por casi cuatro meses. Mientras tanto, Steve cuidó al perro, hasta que la hermana de Ed –quien vivía lejos- pudo finalmente llegar.
