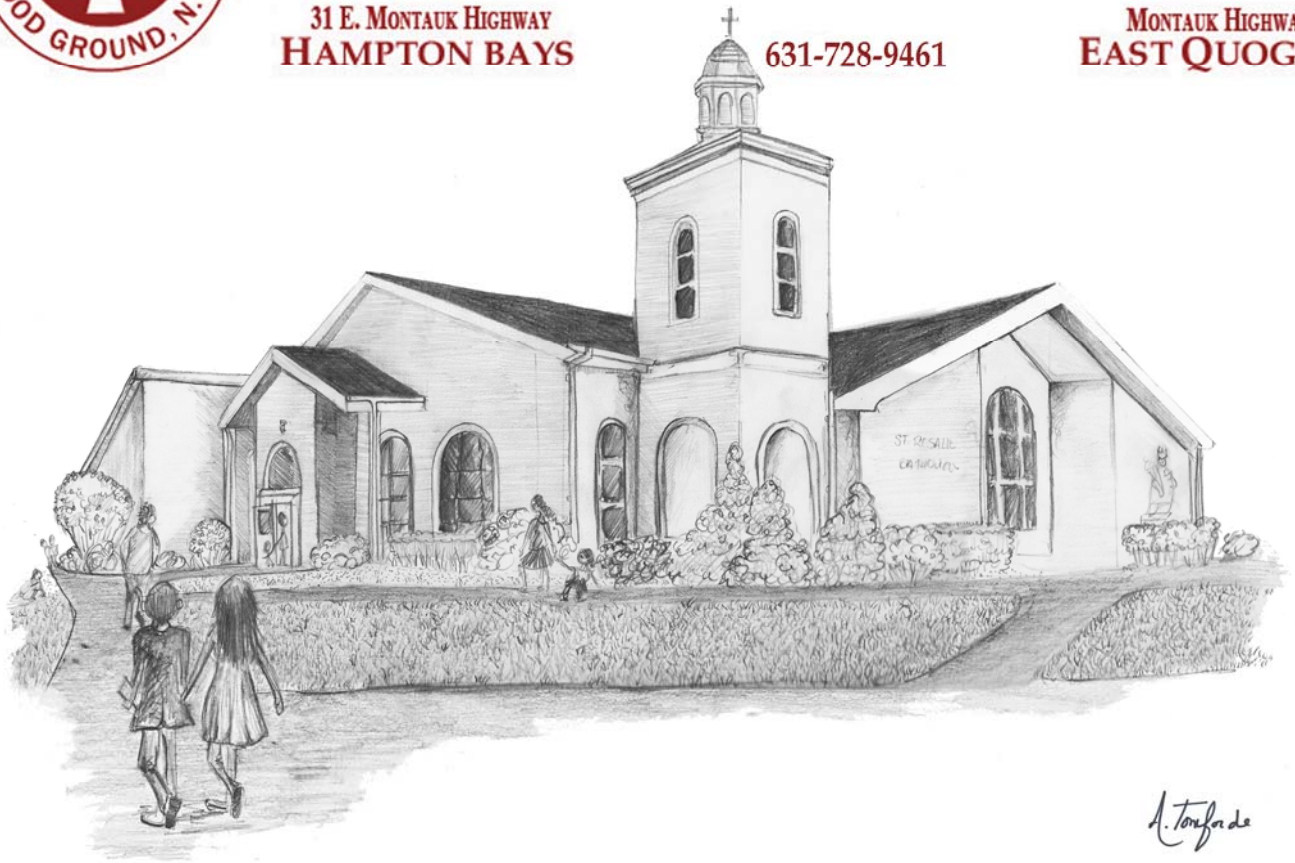

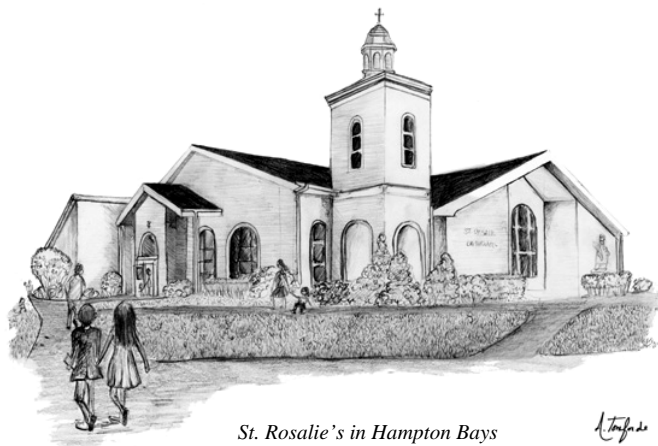

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

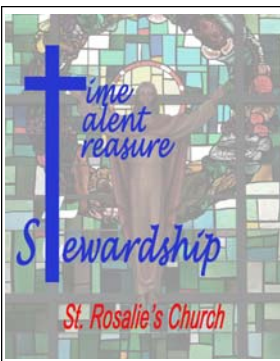
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From The Pastor's Desk

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Verse seven of Acts of Apostles in the first reading: *"The word of God continued to spread."* We celebrate together during this Easter season the fact that Christ Has Risen! In today's Gospel we hear the interchange between Jesus and Thomas, the disciple who on the Second Sunday of Easter wanted to touch Christ's wounds and Jesus allowed him to do, so that he and all might believe. In this Gospel of John, Chapter 14, we hear Jesus telling Thomas that He (Jesus) is going ahead to prepare a place for all who follow Jesus.

Jesus says: *"I AM THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE, and NO ONE COMES TO THE FATHER EXCEPT THROUGH ME!"* JOHN 14:6. And then we hear Jesus' words to Phillip: *"Believe me that I am in the Father and Father is in me."* JOHN 14:11.

Jesus directs us to the One God who is Father, Son and Spirit! He leads us to the beautiful intimacy of the relationship that He has with His Heavenly Father. It is possible for us. Why don't we all try to integrate the story of Christ and weave it into our lives? Jesus shows us the Way, for He is the Truth and the Life!
