



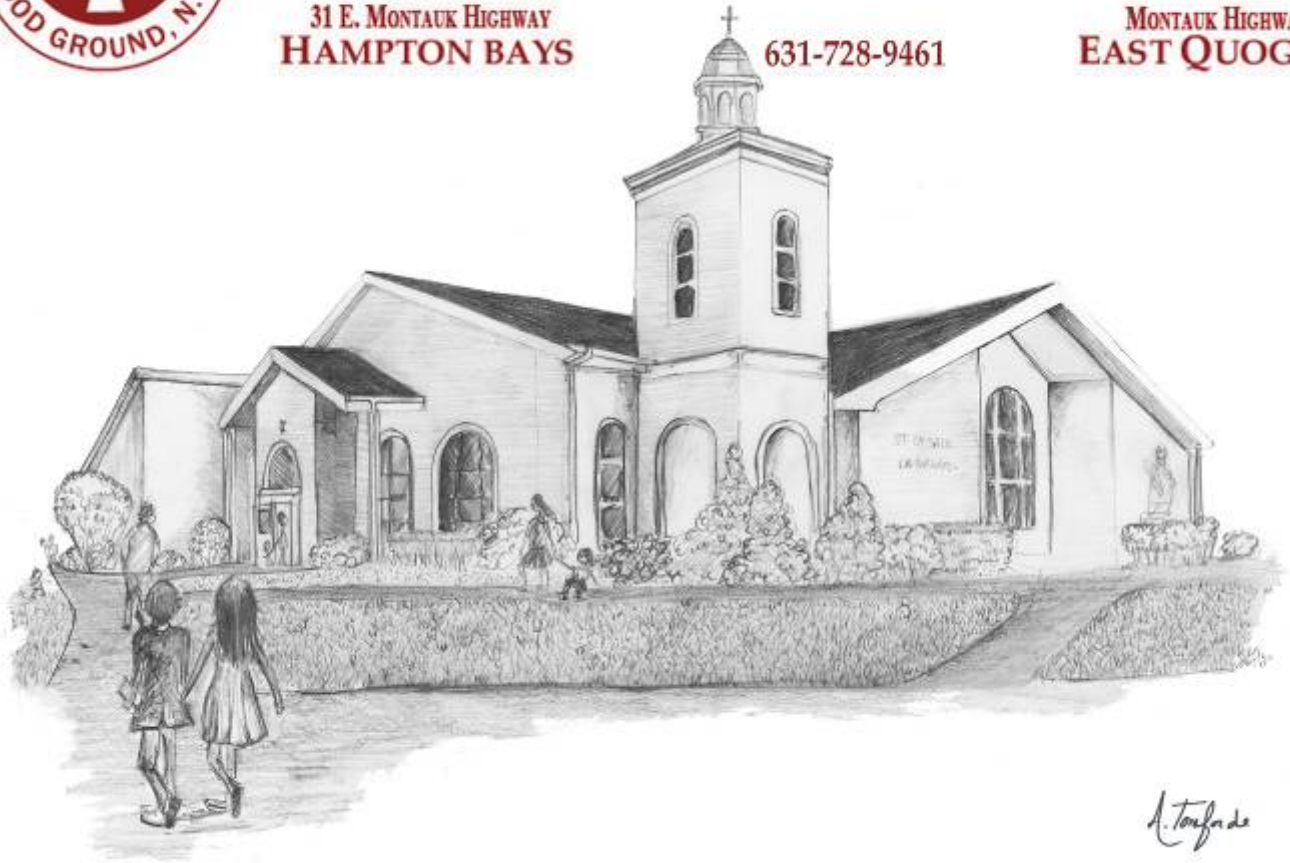

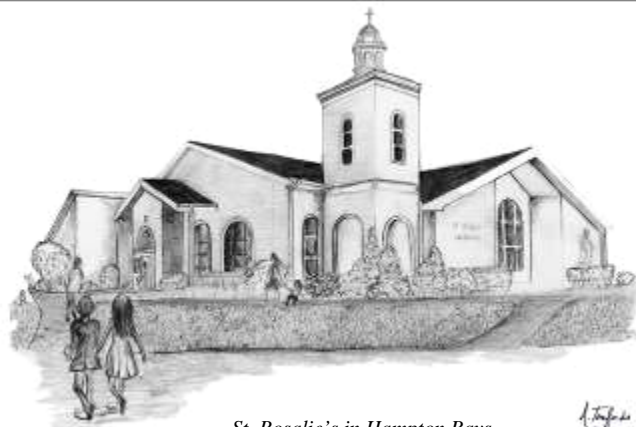

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

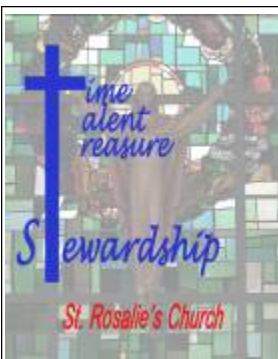
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Pastor's Desk

We begin all things – In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. On this Trinity Sunday we celebrate this great mystery of our faith. We believe by this mystery that there is one God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is a mystery, that we embrace and through the richness of practicing our faith, we become caught up in the Trinitarian life we celebrate!

In today's gospel we hear that the disciples approached the mountain to which Jesus ordered them:

*Then Jesus approached and said to them,
 "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
 Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations,
 baptizing them in the name of the Father,
 and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,
 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*

And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." MATTHEW 28:18-20

Jesus speaks to us of evangelizing through the Blessed Trinity! We baptize in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit! It is the Love of God we celebrate today on Trinity Sunday. This love is expressed so beautifully by the love of God the Father in sending His only Son as well as the invocation of the Holy Spirit, when Jesus Christ returns to the Father. That's what we celebrated, last Sunday on Pentecost Sunday – the coming of the Holy Spirit.

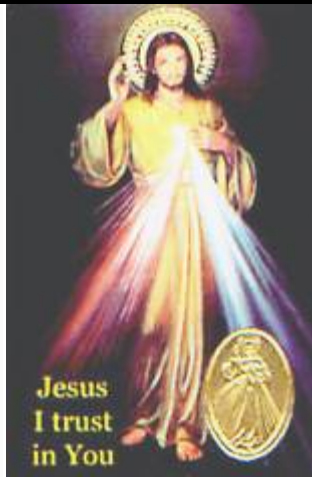

The camp is coed, but during the day the boys and girls will split off for talks and activities, returning together for mass, free time, and adoration in the evening.
