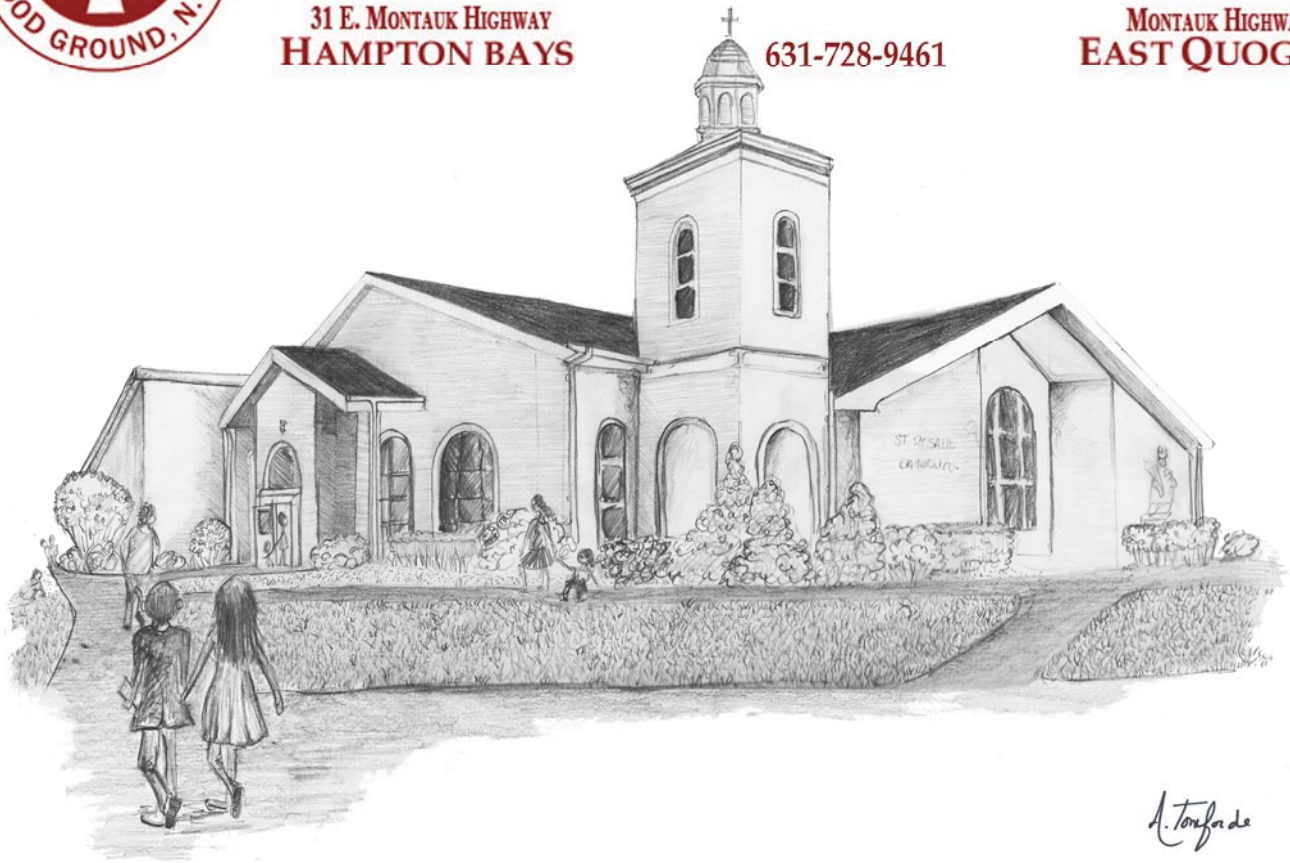

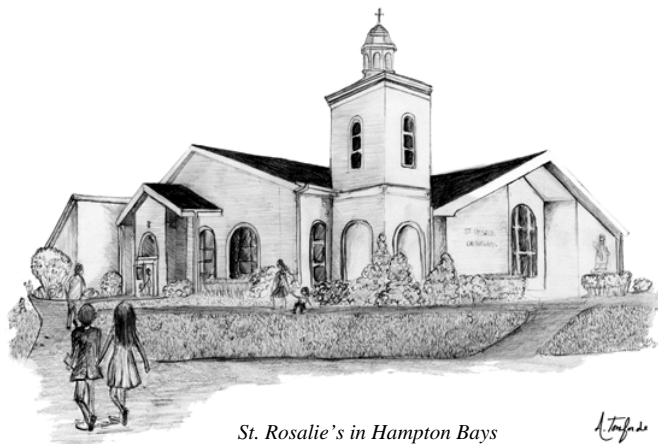

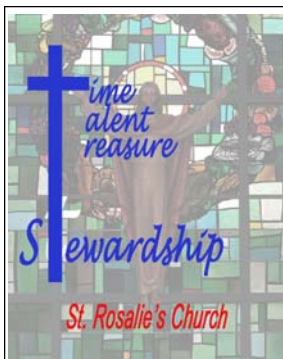

From The Pastor's Desk

Today throughout the world as Catholics, we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, in Latin: *Corpus Christi!* Let us first begin by giving thanks to God for the Gift of Himself in the Eucharist. When we speak of the Mass we speak of Christ's Sacrifice, the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and our Communion with Him.

Today on this great Feast, I would like to focus on the Real Presence of Christ! We as Catholics believe in the "REAL PRESENCE" of CHRIST in the EUCHARIST. What does the "Real Presence" actually mean? Over the years questions have been brought up regarding the meaning of the Eucharist. Karl Rahner, great theologian, spoke about a "symbolic reality." We can understand this as a Catholic believer as a symbol, not just a representation of a reality, but actually as presenting to us the reality. It is truly Christ's Body and Blood!

I remember as a high school boy asking how do I know I believe in the Eucharist? Have you ever wrestled with questions about your faith? I remember Brother Marcos, a Marist Brother at Archbishop Molloy High School, pointing out to me the institution of the Eucharist narratives in the Gospels. I would read these passages over and over. I knew that Jesus Christ has said: "Do this in memory of Me." I know that the priest took the elements of bread and wine, said the blessing (later in theology I learned this as the *epiclesis* –the invocation of the Holy Spirit to transform these gifts of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ!) But it wasn't enough for my inquiring mind at the time. I even think I pondered, this is really a searching to grow my faith. Perhaps like St. Anselm's "faith seeking understanding." I think I really just wanted to grow in my understanding of this great mystery. Do you know what it really came down to? We know we believe by how we live! It is the miracle of our faith which needs to be embraced and entered into, not analyzed. Don't get me wrong, we need to take the time to question, to understand and to practice our faith. But the bottom line is: We know we believe by how we live. Jesus gives us this gift for all of us to live.

Today on this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, after the 9:30 a.m. Family Mass and before the 11 a.m. Mass, we have a special procession on the Feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord. All parish societies have been invited to march with us, including our first Communicants.

Next weekend we wish to give thanks to Almighty God for our own Father Steve Maddaloni who will be celebrating his first anniversary as a priest. Father was ordained June 25, 2016. Also, next weekend, on Saturday, June 24, Bishop John Barres will be ordaining five new priests at St. Agnes Cathedral. We give thanks to Almighty God for the gift of the priesthood and we pray for Father Maddaloni and our new priests together with the other newly-ordained in the New York area and throughout the world to serve Christ's Church! *Ad multos annos!*

Due to NYS law, we cannot accept beds, mattresses, box springs, etc. We give only NEW beds to our neighbors in need.

When our trucks pick up donations at your house, the drivers will give you a receipt which can be used for tax purposes. If you need a receipt for clothing, please call our office in the parish center and we will send you a donation letter. Those of you who wish to make a monetary donation in the poor box, and would like a receipt, just put a check in the box and that will be your receipt. We are a 501(C)(3) Tax Exempt Corporation, and all donations are TAX EXEMPT.
