

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.



From The Pastor's Desk

The Son of Man

In our second reading this Sunday from Romans 11, verses 33-34, we hear:

Oh the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways! For who has known the mind of the Lord or who has been his counselor?

This reading from Romans, so beautifully frames the question Jesus asks today in the Gospel: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" In Romans, we may think of God as mysterious. Really who can know the mind, the ways of God. The passage has such richness for us in living out one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wonder and Awe.

But when we are faced with the question Jesus asks in today's Gospel, we can hear Peter's reply: You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God. In Jesus we begin to encounter Him in His Divinity and His Humanity. In the God-man we encounter the Father's love for each and every one of us! In the fullness of time The Father sent the Son so that one day we could all be with Him in eternal happiness. In the meantime, after the Resurrection and the Ascension, Jesus sent us the Holy Spirit, as our Advocate to illuminate our way!



St. Vincent de Paul Society News




