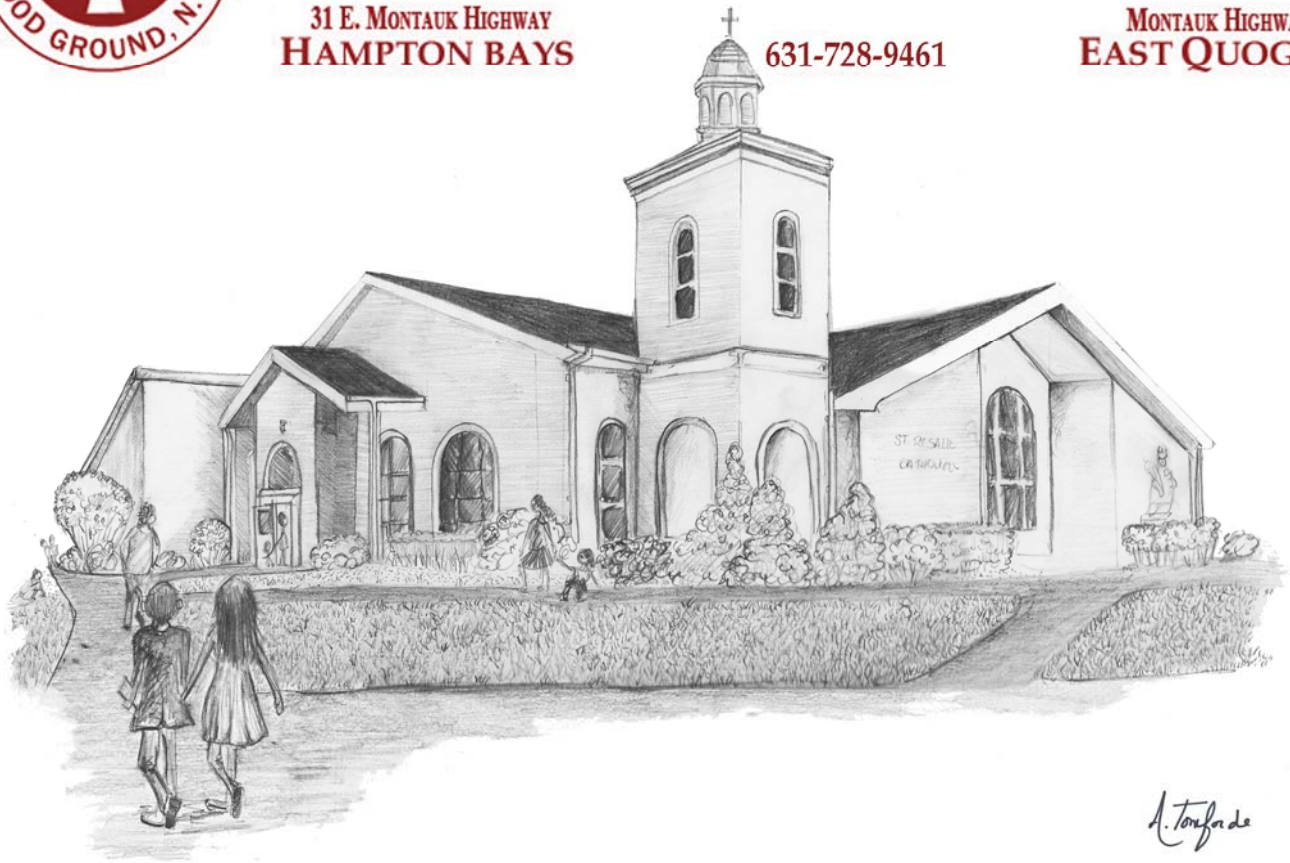

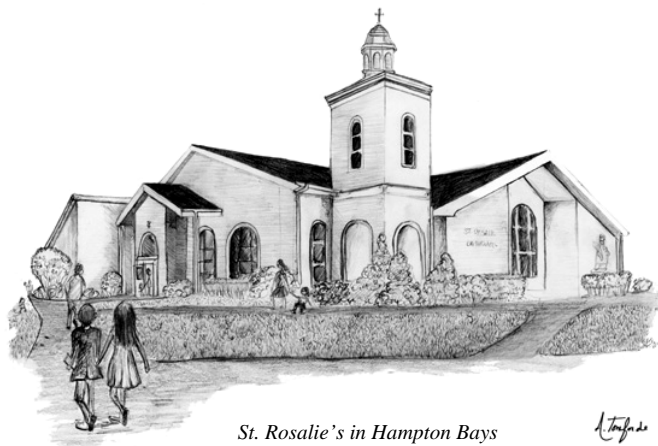

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

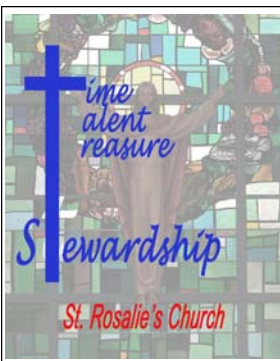
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From The Desk of Father John Wachowicz



There is a story about Mother Teresa that may be apocryphal, but illustrates an important point. As the tale goes, a Catholic priest asked the Saint what she thought of eastern mysticism and new age spiritualities. Without missing a beat, Mother Teresa responded, “But Father, we have Jesus.”

Unfortunately, we live in a time and place in which Christianity is not associated with mysticism and prayer. Many of us learned our basic rote prayers as children, and have never had the opportunity to go much deeper than the rote recitation of words. As a result, many of us think of prayer as a tit-for-tat relationship with God – ‘I say x number of prayers, and God will do x.’ While there is great value to these prayers, there are many ways to go deeper in the Christian life.

St. John Damascene famously defined prayer as “the raising of one's mind and heart to God.” And Pope Benedict XVI affirmed that “Christianity is not a new philosophy or new morality. We are Christians only if we encounter Christ.” This personal encounter with the Crucified and Risen Lord is at the essence of every legitimate Christian spirituality. From the ancient desert, to the mediaeval monastery, to the modern suburb, the essence of the spiritual life has always been **friendship with Jesus**. In John 15:15, Christ Himself affirms that, “*I have called you friends.*” Because of your baptism, then, you have been created and called to be a close friend of Jesus.

Just as with any friendship, our relationship with Jesus requires some time and effort. Just as our friendship with our spouse requires a different sort of time and effort from our friendship with our neighbor, so too does our mystical relationship with Jesus require a unique sort of time and effort. Hence, in Luke 11:1, a disciple asks Jesus to, “*teach us how to pray.*”

In the interest of continuing that proclamation of prayer, on **Monday, September 25** at **7:00 p.m.** in the **Fellowship Room** (in the back of the Church), St. Rosalie's will be holding a session on an **Introduction to Christian Mysticism**. All are welcome to attend, as we will be focusing on developing that friendship with Jesus by praying with the Scriptures. We will also have some resources available on prayer. See you then!

## Beginning A New Season

### Class Registration

Registration for children, grades 1-11, is open. Each registration needs two forms: one for parent information, and one for the children's information. The policy sign-off form is also required. Information of days and times available and fees are there as well. Some session choices may no longer be available as registration has been open for several weeks.

As there are levels in the faith formation process, working towards receiving the Sacraments, each child, who is *not* in continuous faith formation will need to be evaluated on their faith formation knowledge, in order to place him or her in the proper level. We have many programs to help guide every child under age 18 toward the goal of becoming a fully initiated Catholic. Beyond age 18, adults are welcome to enter into the RCIA process.

### Confirmation Candidates (Confirmandi)

All confirmandi are scheduled to attend the required confirmation retreat on Sunday, September 17, from 12:30-5:30 p.m. at St. Joseph's Villa in Hampton Bays. This retreat is in preparation to receive the sacrament to become fully initiated Catholics. I ask all of our parishioners to keep the Confirmandi in your prayers as they draw closer to the day of Confirmation, Sunday, October 8.

## An Invitation From The Committee For The Common Good

On Tuesday, September 12, at 7 p.m. the committee will have its annual organizational meeting. We would like you to join us that evening to learn more about The Committee for the Common Good: who we are and what we do and hopefully to join us as we plan for the year ahead.



A good general definition of the common good can be found in the document *Gaudium et Spes* from Vatican II. It says these involve "... human rights: food, housing, work, education and access to culture, transportation, basic health care, the freedom of communication and expression, and the protection of religious freedom."

Obviously one small parish committee cannot address all of these! So, we must frequently evaluate our options. Do we limit those concerns to local issues or do we involve ourselves in them on a much broader scale? What will our priorities be for the coming year? How much can we do and do well?

Currently the Common Good Committee sponsors several projects you may be aware of. One is Maureen's Haven. Although we do not have the facilities to house the homeless overnight, we do host several evenings a year at nearby churches. St. Rosalie's provides the volunteers, the food, haircuts, toiletries and needed clothing to help our homeless neighbors.

Another project is our Lenten Mite Box Collection. The money raised is used for St. Rosalie's Parish Social Ministry which, among other services, runs the food pantry. Some of the money also goes to help those people displaced by violence in the Middle East, many of whom are in tent camps in Lebanon and other nearby places.

We also participate as a parish in an annual Earth Day Clean-up sponsored by Southampton Town. Along with other local organizations, we pick up litter and debris along Montauk Highway and other local roads to make the hamlet visually more attractive after the winter.

We hope you will join us in the Parish Center on Tuesday, September 12, at 7 p.m. to learn more about what we do and what we would like to do. And, of course, we hope you will decide to come to our monthly meetings and volunteer for our various projects. We will not pressure you in any way. The purpose is really one of introduction. One added incentive: you will meet like-minded parishioners trying to do their part to make the world a little bit better and also partake of the cake and coffee and fellowship each meeting provides!

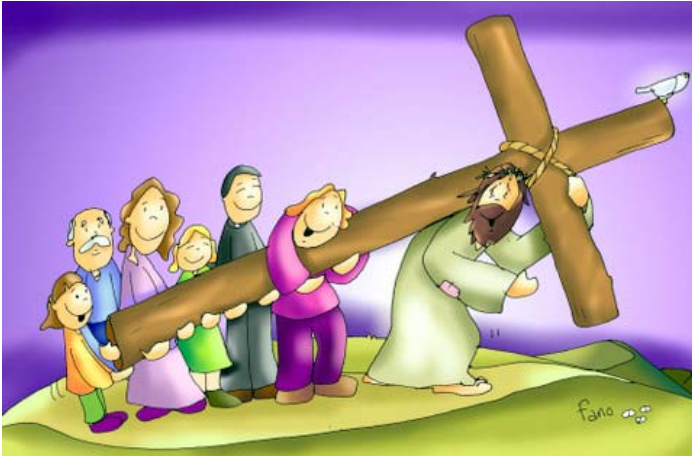
### Bishop Barres Authorizes Special Collection to Aid those Affected by Hurricane Harvey

**ROCKVILLE CENTRE, N.Y. – August 28, 2017** –The Most Reverend John O.
