SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.



From the Pastor's Desk

I was privileged to attend the World Meeting of Families in Ireland between Aug 22 and 29. It's a gathering of members of our Church, every three years. Eileen McPhelin, our Religious Formation Coordinator attended in Philadelphia in 2015. We had a small delegation about 15 from our diocese with members of the Cursillo Movement and other representatives mainly from the Latino Community. On Saturday, Pope Francis was present at a Festival of families, with families from around the world talking about family issues and how their faith played a significant role in helping them to grow together in a positive way. It's incredible how some families have grown in the midst of suffering and have turned their lives around and have been so nurtured by our Catholic faith.



The Holy Father spoke directly during that weekend and during the Closing Mass, Sunday, Aug 26 at Phoenix Park in Dublin about the horrible abuse crisis that had taken over the news. He apologized to victims as well as asked for prayer and penance. Any of these heinous crimes must be vigorously condemned everywhere in the world! At St Rosalie's parish, my brother priests and I preached about a need for healing the Sunday of August 19, immediately after the Pennsylvania Report was announced. Having celebrated Mass at the chapel of Apparitions at the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock while in Ireland, I prayed when I returned through the intercession of Our Lady of Knock together with our parishioners at the Masses on Labor Day Weekend. On Thursday, September 13, I offered a Mass with my brother priests with prayers for Healing at St Rosalie's Church. We pray to seek the truth.

I would like to offer a story: It's about a Pre-K class. You see, Father Murphy was having a short show-and-tell with these young children in the church. Knowing 4-year olds, one has to keep in mind short attention span. There was a little boy named Johnny, who was always making noise in a somewhat disruptive way. Father showed them the chalice, the vestments and the beautiful cross in the church and the altar- you've got the Picture!

Father Murphy: What is your favorite part of today's visit to our Church?

Little Johnny is flagging down Father with both hands but Father calls on Little Mary and Little Peter etc. One said the altar, one seeing the Chalice – Johnny cannot contain himself. Finally Father says at the end, ok Johnny what is your favorite part of today's visit to the church?

Johnny: Father I like when I see the EXIT sign as I walk out of the Church.

Father Murphy: Oh really Johnny, and just why is that?

Johnny: You see Father when I walk out of this church; I want to see if I am different. I want to see how I might be changed because of this experience.

What about you and me? We just heard it from the mouth of Babes. Are we changed—do we even allow ourselves to be open to change—do we let God change us?

How are we changed by the Eucharist? Jesus Christ changed the Bread and Wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. Do we let the reception of the Holy Eucharist change us? At Holy Mass we re-present Christ's sacrifice on the Cross and we assent (agree) to the Real Presence of Christ. And we can enter into Communion—union with Him. What a gift is the Holy Eucharist! "This is My Body given up for you this is My Blood poured out for you." Like our little Pre-K fellow, let the healing power of the Eucharist change and transform us so that we may become what we eat, transformed by the miraculous mystery of Corpus Christi/the Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Let us pray that through the power of the Cross and the celebration of the Eucharist each and every day throughout the world, Christ may bring healing and peace to all: to victims, and to all who are hurting. We pray that the Peace which only Christ can give will take away the sins of the World


