



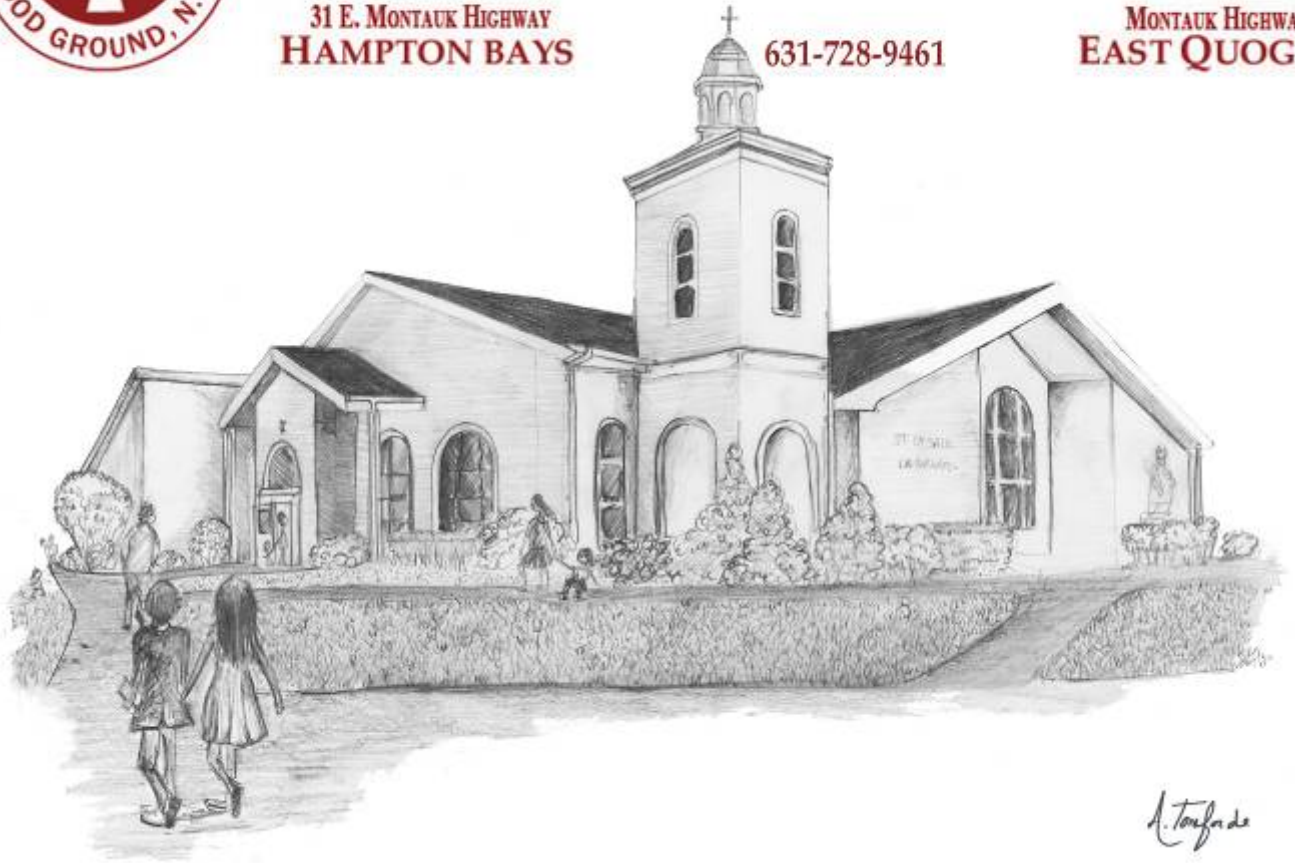

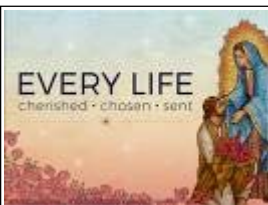

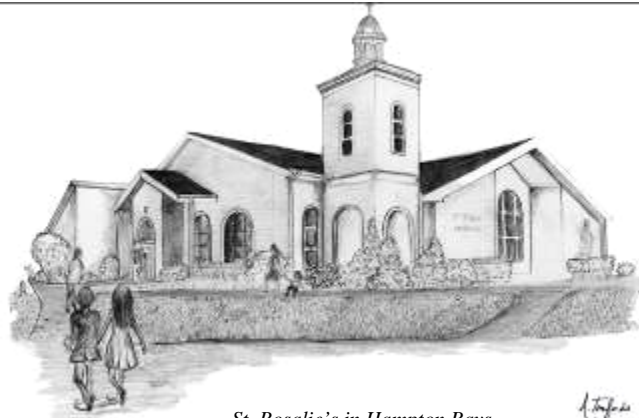

From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters:

As we move more into the Fall Season, first we will begin to see the beautiful trees lining the parking lot ablaze in red and orange. Then we will see the leaves begin to fall. These are signs of the Fall Season. It's time to prepare for the colder weather, clocks "falling back," checking the heating systems, perhaps, and other checks and balances.

We also occasionally need to perform a "spiritual tune-up" – we need to prepare ourselves spiritually as well. In today's gospel we hear Jesus reviewing the 10 Commandments and then the interchange between the rich young man and our Lord. When Jesus asks the rich young man to sell all he has for the kingdom of God, the rich young man goes away sad.

And then we hear that famous line we are all familiar with: *"It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."* MARK 10:25

Our Lord is not telling us that wealth is bad, of course not. We need possessions and money to live. We also are able to help others, those in need, as our means allow. But I think Jesus is suggesting that we shouldn't let anything come between ourselves and our God. Our God who loves us so dearly, our God who has given us the gift of life and sustains our very existence. Let us take comfort in the prayer our Savior taught us:

"Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Then that beautiful line: Give us this day our daily bread ..." He loves us, He cares for us, He is always here for us, even when we might be alone or lonely. Know that He is with you always...even until the end of the world (to be continued).

Trying to Keep Up with Repairs and Unexpected Expenditures

To give you an idea of some of our recent efforts and plans for the New Year

Rectory

In these past few days, we had to locate and have the cesspool serviced, with the system backing up. Roots from a large Forsythia bush had infiltrated the line. With Sean's help we contacted Vincenzo at Three Brothers. As I write this article I want to again say how generous Vincenzo and family have been to Saint Rosalie's parish. Three Brothers have maintained the parish landscape, and plowed our snow for many years. They have been very generous to our parish. Thanks to Vincenzo and son Mario for their help to Saint Rosalie's!

Parish Center

With a faulty large dehumidifier, we had to act quickly in preventing a large buildup of mold in our basement classrooms. This happened in August just a month before we began Religious Formation. We did act quickly and removed the carpeting, completed the necessary remediation and placed a floor that will last for a long time. We were able to use the repaired classrooms when Religious Formation opened a few weeks ago.

Church

2018: As you may remember our Rogers Organ had been sent back to the company as a continued service over many months over the past year had not fixed the problems that had been intermittent. It was determined that lightning may have compromised the electronics on the organ. We are happy to say as you know that the Rogers Organ has returned. I am hopeful that some of the expense can be recouped by insurance.

2019: As we approach next year, there are certain repairs and maintenance which must be done. E.g. there are no weddings scheduled in January 2019. In discussion with the Finance Council and the Parish Council, we have decided to complete a few of these repairs which must be done. We will dedicate this year's profit from the Parish Gala, a little over \$50,000 toward this work and some savings as well. At the beginning of the New Year we will finally replace the Church doors which are difficult to open and close and in dire need of replacement. If anyone would like to memorialize a possible door, please let us know at the Parish Center. We will attempt to also attempt to fix the buckling tile floor on the East side of the church. The Church is also in need of painting and we'll do so at the same time. We may need to celebrate Mass in the Community Center for two weeks or so, while work is completed. More information to follow.

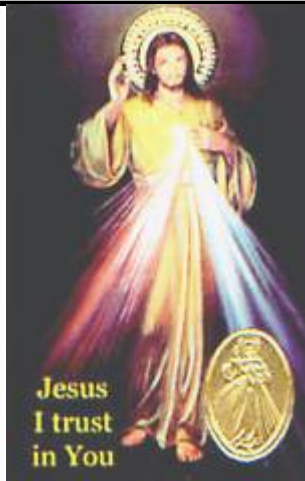

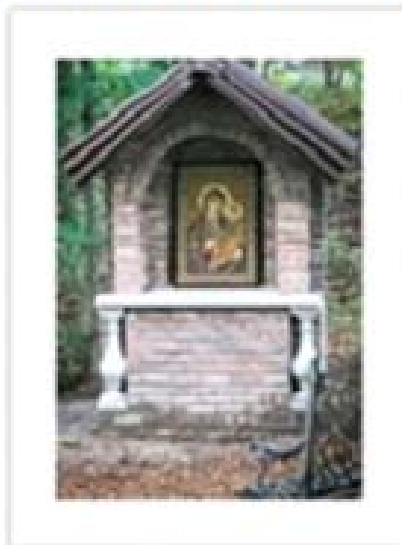
