Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.


#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK



## From the Desk of Father Maddaloni

The readings today deal with eschatology, the theology of the end of time. They give us the opportunity to consider some of those teachings that often get pushed aside, maybe because they strike us as unpleasant, or as being about things so distant as to be irrelevant to our lives, or as just too difficult to believe.

In the first reading this week, we hear about the final resurrection and the two different ultimate fates of the resurrected: "some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace." Quoting the Gospel of John, the Catechism of the Catholic Church confirms this: "Who will rise? All the dead will rise, "those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment" (CCC 998).

Every so often, I meet someone who believes in heaven but not hell, who believes that everyone goes to heaven, who believes that how we live our lives and what we do have no effect on our eternal life. These beliefs are contrary to Scripture and the teachings of Christ, as the last paragraph shows.

We are reminded in these teachings that God does not force his eternal friendship on us, but offers it to all who truly embrace it.

Will our bodies really be resurrected? Yes. Why not? The resurrection of the fully human Jesus proves the possibility of our resurrection. Why should our bodies be resurrected? Humans are body and soul. That is our nature. Our bodies are not our possessions to treat as we please. They are part of who we are, and we are God's.

Will the world really pass away? Yes. This reality reminds us that it is not in the material world that we place our hopes, but in the love of God which endures forever.




