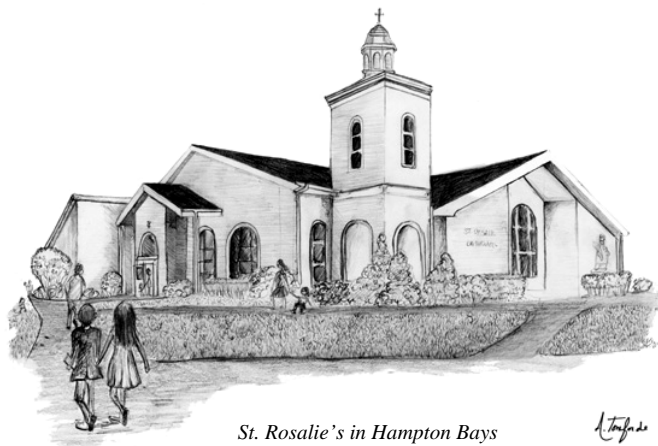

# From The Pastor's Desk

## Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 CORINTHIANS 12:31 — 13:13. The second reading from today's Mass on the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, is probably the reading most used in wedding ceremonies. Perhaps what Jesus even had in mind at the wedding at Cana, His first miracle. Love that's what is all about; love is patient, love is kind. It bears and endures all things.

Just a thought for this week: Can I be more patient with those I love, work and worship with in my life? What a beautiful world we might transform if we tried to love more fully. Be patient with one another...it's about love.

In this Year of Mercy please look at the Holy Father's message for the fiftieth World Day of Social Communications:

VATICAN CITY, 22 JANUARY 2016 (VIS): "Communication and mercy" is the title of Pope Francis' message for the fiftieth World Day of Social Communications, to be held on 8 May. The message is symbolically signed by the Holy Father on Sunday 24 January 2016, feast of St. Francis of Sales, patron of journalists. The Holy Father began his talk, "Dear Brothers and Sisters: The Holy Year of Mercy invites all of us to reflect on the relationship between communication and mercy.

"The Church, in union with Christ, the living incarnation of the Father of Mercies, is called to practice mercy as the distinctive trait of all that she is and does. What we say and how we say it, our every word and gesture, ought to express God's compassion, tenderness and forgiveness for all. Love, by its nature, is communication; it leads to openness and sharing. If our hearts and actions are inspired by charity, by divine love, then our communication will be touched by God's own power.

"As sons and daughters of God, we are called to communicate with everyone, without exception. In a particular way, the Church's words and actions are all meant to convey mercy, to touch people's hearts and to sustain them on their journey to that fullness of life which Jesus Christ was sent by the Father to bring to all. This means that we ourselves must be willing to accept the warmth of other Church and to share that warmth with others, so that Jesus may be known and loved. That warmth is what gives substance to the word of faith; by our preaching and witness, it ignites the 'spark' which gives them life."

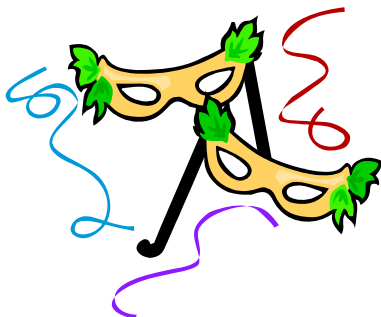

## Lenten Almsgiving

Almsgiving and mite boxes are a rich part of Catholic Lenten tradition. The act of sharing with the poor the benefit of sacrifices we may choose to make during Lent can teach each of us and our children important lessons about the value of self-discipline, charity and compassion. Many of you may remember with fondness the mite box traditions from your youth.

To encourage this practice as a parish community, our Committee for the Common Good will once again be handing out mite boxes after all weekend masses the weekend of February 6/7 for people who wish to donate their alms. It may be the money from the fancy coffee, ice cream, candy or other treats we give up during Lent.

The mite boxes will be collected on Palm Sunday. Most of the alms money donated will go directly to benefit the community food pantry that helps our neighbors in need. The remainder will be sent to Catholic Relief Services to help the millions of impoverished souls who benefit from their charity. This will help remind us all that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, both near and far, we do unto Jesus.

To help develop this tradition in our youth, we will also be distributing mite boxes at religious formation classes. Most of their money will likewise go to the community food pantry with a portion going to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association to help the victims of violence in the Middle East, some suffering as a direct result of their faith. We want to encourage parents to take the lead in making this a family endeavor. Tell them what a difference their contributions can make from the money saved from those small things they choose to give up. Explain to them that our Lord is as interested in the positive things we can do in this world as with the things we give up in His name.

We hope this Lenten season is a time when all in our community can grow in their love for the Lord and their neighbor in multitudes, for it is in prayer, fasting and giving that we receive the blessings of a grateful heart.

No podemos escapar a las palabras del Señor y en base a ellas seremos juzgados: si dimos de comer al hambriento y de beber al sediento. Si acogimos al extranjero y vestimos al desnudo. 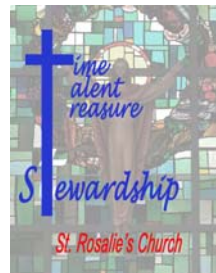
## Happy Valentines Day!!
