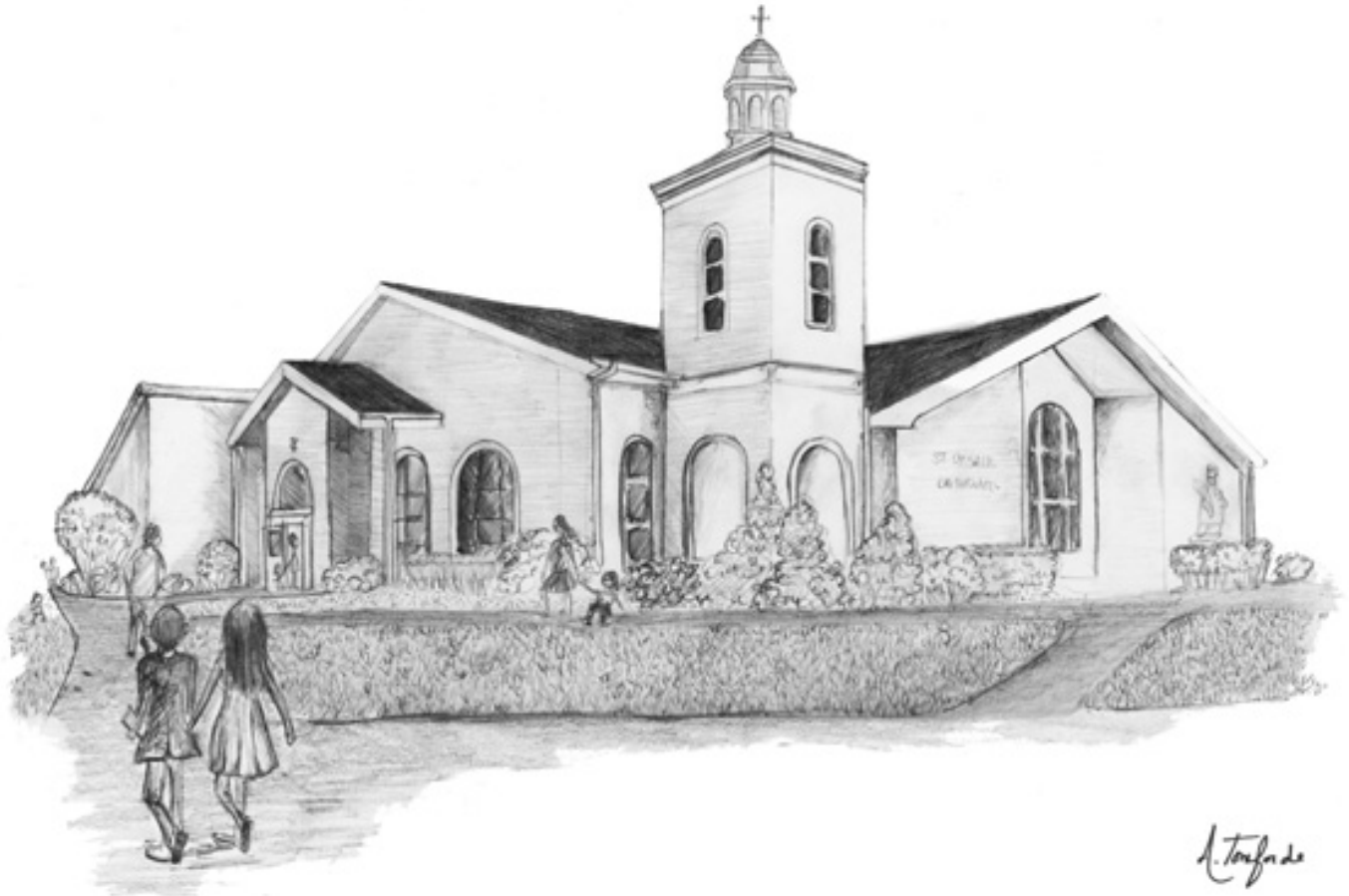

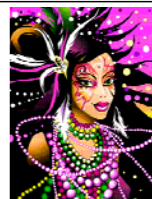

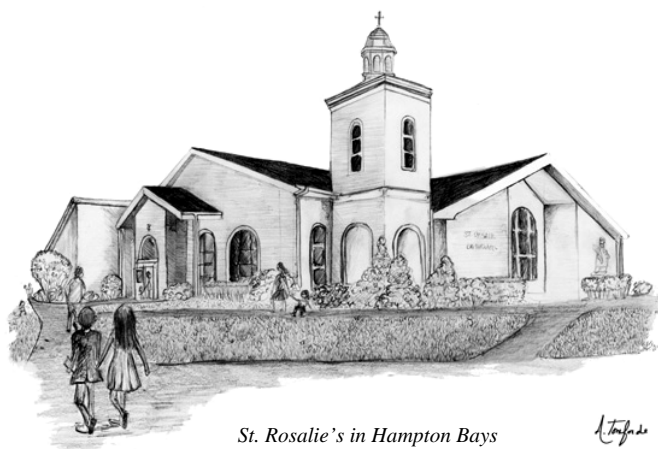

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

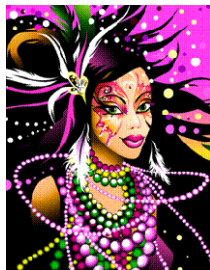

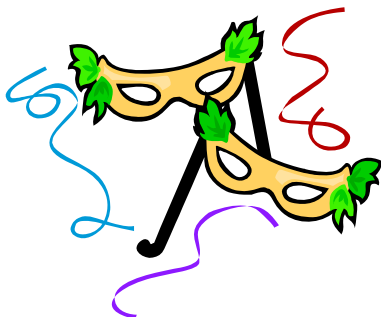

Lenten Almsgiving

Almsgiving and mite boxes are a rich part of Catholic Lenten tradition. The act of sharing with the poor the benefit of sacrifices we may choose to make during Lent can teach each of us and our children important lessons about the value of self-discipline, charity and compassion. Many of you may remember with fondness the mite box traditions from your youth.

To encourage this practice as a parish community, our Committee for the Common Good will once again be handing out mite boxes after all weekend masses the weekend of February 6/7 for people who wish to donate their alms. It may be the money from the fancy coffee, ice cream, candy or other treats we give up during Lent.

The mite boxes will be collected on Palm Sunday. Most of the alms money donated will go directly to benefit the community food pantry that helps our neighbors in need. The remainder will be sent to Catholic Relief Services to help the millions of impoverished souls who benefit from their charity. This will help remind us all that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, both near and far, we do unto Jesus.

To help develop this tradition in our youth, we will also be distributing mite boxes at religious formation classes. Most of their money will likewise go to the community food pantry with a portion going to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association to help the victims of violence in the Middle East, some suffering as a direct result of their faith. We want to encourage parents to take the lead in making this a family endeavor. Tell them what a difference their contributions can make from the money saved from those small things they choose to give up. Explain to them that our Lord is as interested in the positive things we can do in this world as with the things we give up in His name.

We hope this Lenten season is a time when all in our community can grow in their love for the Lord and their neighbor in multitudes, for it is in prayer, fasting and giving that we receive the blessings of a grateful heart.

The Church in Need Collection

On February 14, next Sunday, a collection will be taken for "The Church in Need." The monies collected at this time will be shared among three areas of the world where there is particular need for help:

Church in Central and Eastern Europe

The Collection provides support for basic pastoral programs and makes scholarships available for students studying to serve their local church. These students become vital participants in the renewal of the Church in the region.

The Church in Latin America

We face many difficult challenges. Natural disasters in many areas caused lasting damage to the Church, while a significant loss of parishioners to migration and to other faiths, the inability to support itself financially, and a lack of priests and religious to help effectively minister to the large number of Catholics continue to trouble the region.

The Church in Africa

The funds will go to assisting African countries where poverty, sickness and political strife prevent people from living in dignity.

El Papa Francisco nos Habla sobre la Misericordia - En el Evangelio de Lucas encontramos otro aspecto importante para vivir con fe el Jubileo. El evangelista narra que Jesús, un sábado, volvió a Nazaret y, como era costumbre, entró en la Sinagoga. Lo llamaron para que leyera la Escritura y la comentara. El paso era el del profeta Isaías donde está escrito: «El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para anunciar a los pobres la Buena Nueva, me ha enviado a proclamar la liberación a los cautivos y la vista a los ciegos, para dar la libertad a los oprimidos y proclamar un año de gracia del Señor» (61,1-2). “Un año de gracia”: es esto lo que el Señor anuncia y lo que deseamos vivir. Este Año Santo lleva consigo la riqueza de la misión de Jesús que resuena en las palabras del Profeta: llevar una palabra y un gesto de consolación a los pobres, anunciar la liberación a cuantos están prisioneros de las nuevas esclavitudes de la sociedad moderna, restituir la vista a quien no puede ver más porque se ha replegado sobre sí mismo, y volver a dar dignidad a cuantos han sido privados de ella. La predicación de Jesús se hace de nuevo visible en las respuestas de fe que el testimonio de los cristianos está llamado a ofrecer. Your gift to the poor can bring the love and peace of Jesus to those who live in fear and doubt, loneliness and dread.

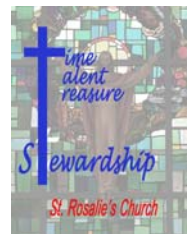
