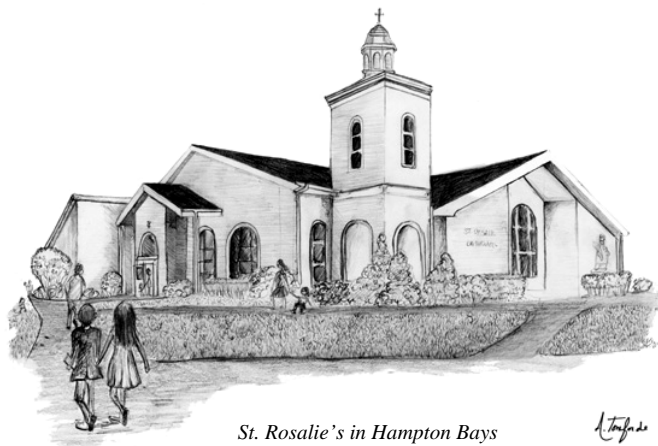

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday/Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence. That means anyone from their 14th birthday until age 59 in good health, can have one full meal and two lighter meals, and nothing in between meals, and also abstain from meat. Lenten Fridays are days of abstinence, (we do not eat meat).

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent we hear so beautifully in the gospel, Jesus inviting all to see how we might need to look at ourselves not just in looking at the faults of others.

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders.

So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her,

"Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir."

Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." JOHN 8:7-11

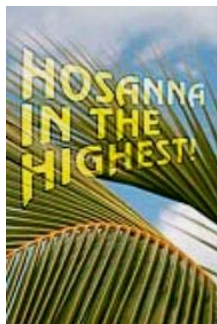

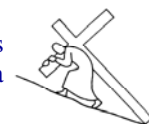
