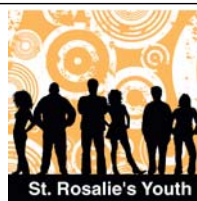

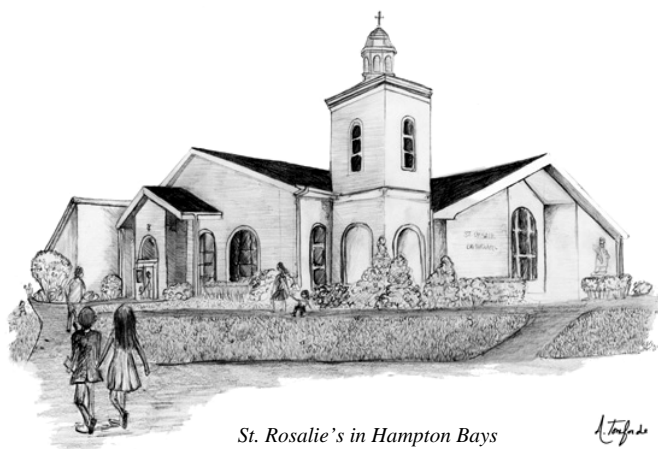

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

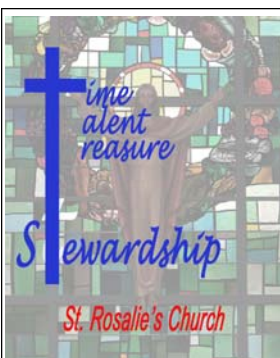
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From The Pastor's Desk

Brothers and sisters, boys and girls:

EASTER PEACE AND JOY TO YOU AND YOURS! How Blessed we are as the people of God of Saint Rosalie's parish to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In review of Holy Week, I could not be more joyful and thankful for the beautiful ways we celebrated Semana Santa/Holy Week. So many parishioners participated together. From the moment we began Palm Sunday including the beautiful Liturgies celebrated by Bishop Perez and our priests with the faithful at all the Masses including the opening of the Chapel in East Quogue with the 9 a.m. Mass. All were so filled with the faith that makes us Catholic parishioners of St Rosalie's!

Monday of Holy Week was an especially uplifting Day with many parishioners and visitors taking advantage of penance from 3 until 9 p.m. Tuesday of Holy Week many came for Confessions in Spanish with a number of priests and bishop hearing them.

Holy Thursday dawned with Morning Prayer led by Deacon Chris. The parish is alive with faith! I attended the Chrism Mass with our priests and with Bishop William Murphy, bringing back the holy oils of the sick, of initiation and the sacred Chrism used for Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. A beautiful moment took place on Holy Thursday evening as Father Kevin celebrated the Mass of the Lord's Supper with Father Steve Grozio, a Vincentian priest who helps me with the Spanish community preaching in English and Spanish! How moving was the procession with the Blessed Sacrament and how very prayerful! I was thankful we were able to have an outdoor procession and how beautiful was the repository. A number of parishioners were with us as we closed the Church at midnight.

Good Friday was an especially busy day with services all throughout the day and night. Father Collins, the celebrant of the day led us in Morning Prayer. So many parishioners again came for God's Divine Healing in the sacrament of Confession till 12 noon. Father Collins celebrated the Solemn Passion of Christ and Adoration of the Cross at 3 p.m. in English and Father Steve at 5:30 p.m. in Spanish. I led the Stations of the Cross at noon with Stations of the Cross for young Christians, and again Father Collins led the faithful in the Church at 8 p.m. with Stations and Adoration of the Cross.

Holy Saturday began with Morning Prayer led by Father Kevin. At 10 a.m. the children's Easter Activity Event was celebrated at the Parish Center! I and many were involved in various preparations including decorating the Church for Easter, rehearsals, all leading to the Easter Vigil in the evening in both Spanish in the Community Center and in English in the Church. I led the Vigil and also conferred the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism Confirmation and Eucharist on those adult candidates who chose to come back or be converted to the Roman Catholic faith. Easter Sunday dawned with some 350 joining Father Kevin at the Shinnecock Inlet on the beach for the beautiful Sunrise Easter Mass. People have been saying how it was such a joyful and meaningful celebration of the Holy Mass. To top it off, the Oakland Family again hosted us at Sunday's restaurant for a continental breakfast. This had been arranged for the last few years by Harry and Mary Regis! What a wonderful gift we were given by the Oakland Family. Please thank them by patronizing their restaurants. All Easter Masses were well attended and in addition we probably had about 900 at the 11 a.m. with another 200 plus in the Community Center Chapel.

Again, **Thanks** to everyone who helped with creating the atmosphere of Easter Peace and Joy: Priests, Deacons, Staff, Worship Committee, Music Ministry, especially Cantors, musicians, Altar Servers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Ushers. A special **Thanks** to Bernadette Johnston and Molly Doyle, who put their ideas and arrangement of the flowers in the nook, around the altar and the repository. A special **Thanks** to the Spanish Committee who decorated so beautifully. Gracias a la Comunidad Hispana for the beautiful care for the decorations in the Community Center!

Another cause for Joy: The Community Center renovations are underway. We see the installation of new windows and there is so much more to come!

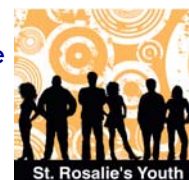

LA COMUNIDAD HISPANA



De la Homilía del Papa Francisco en la Fiesta de la Divina Misericordia - Todavía resuena en todos nosotros el saludo de Jesús Resucitado a sus discípulos la tarde de Pascua: «Paz a vosotros» (Jn 20,19). La paz, sobre todo en estas semanas, sigue siendo el deseo de tantos pueblos que sufren la violencia inaudita de la discriminación y de la muerte, sólo por llevar el nombre de cristianos. Nuestra oración se hace aún más intensa y se convierte en un grito de auxilio al Padre, rico en misericordia, para que sostenga la fe de tantos hermanos y hermanas que sufren, a la vez que pedimos que convierta nuestros corazones, para pasar de la indiferencia a la compasión.

San Pablo nos ha recordado que hemos sido salvados en el misterio de la muerte y resurrección del Señor Jesús. Él es el Reconciliador, que está vivo en medio de nosotros para mostrarnos el camino de la reconciliación con Dios y con los hermanos. El Apóstol recuerda que, a pesar de las dificultades y los sufrimientos de la vida, sigue creciendo la esperanza en la salvación que el amor de Cristo ha sembrado en nuestros corazones. La misericordia de Dios se ha derramado en nosotros haciéndonos justos, dándonos la paz.

Una pregunta está presente en el corazón de muchos: ¿por qué hoy un Jubileo de la Misericordia? Simplemente porque la Iglesia, en este momento de grandes cambios históricos, está llamada a ofrecer con mayor intensidad los signos de la presencia y de la cercanía de Dios. Éste no es un tiempo para estar distraídos, sino al contrario para permanecer alerta y despertar en nosotros la capacidad de ver lo esencial. Es el tiempo para que la Iglesia redescubra el sentido de la misión que el Señor le ha confiado el día de Pascua: ser signo e

instrumento de la misericordia del Padre (cf. Jn 20,21-23).

La Obligación Pascual - Todos los católicos ya iniciados en la Sagrada Eucaristía tienen la obligación de recibir la Sagrada Comunión por lo menos una vez durante la temporada Pascual: Domingo de Pascua, 27 de marzo, hasta Pentecostés, 15 de mayo. (En los Estados Unidos, la Obligación Pascual puede cumplirse hasta el domingo de la Santísima Trinidad, 22 de mayo). Se exhorta a los católicos a que reciban la Comunión con la frecuencia que les sea posible durante el año litúrgico, no solo durante la temporada pascual. Sin embargo, “Quien tiene conciencia de estar en pecado grave debe recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación antes de acercarse a comulgar.” (CCE, §1385)
