



### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From The Pastor's Desk

Today on the Twelfth Sunday of the year we hear Jesus say, "Who do you say that I am?" As I'm writing this our newly ordained Deacon Jim just stopped by the office to speak about this passage. According to Deacon Jim, Jesus is surprised by Peter's answer. My question to everyone is why ... Why is Jesus surprised? In order to understand this, we need to break it down. Prior to this, Jesus had been speaking to the crowds. He then turns from the crowds to His Twelve, and he wants to hear their response, as they have intimate knowledge from being in his presence. At this point Jesus has already raised the dead, healed the cripple, forgiven sins. So it is easy for them to turn to Jesus and easy for them to say you're the Son of God. And there is no surprise there. But Jesus is surprised at Peter's response. Why? Why, because Peter is the first to acknowledge the "hypostatic union" that Jesus is one person having two natures both DIVINE and HUMAN. Jesus recognized that only the Father could have given the apostles this knowledge. It is from GOD!

## St. Vincent de Paul Society

Dear St. Rosalie's family, we at St. Vincent de Paul want to thank all of you for your generous support of the Poor Boxes. As you know, we report our monthly collections, but we really don't tell you what we use it for. Please understand that we keep all of our Friends a secret, and we never use names. However, we would like to tell you about some of our meetings with Jesus through our Friends.

In a case we have been co-sharing with St. Rosalie's Parish Social Ministry, a family of five, three children ages two to five with the mother having brain cancer and father who works two to three jobs a week, has needed a bit of help. Without making you all cry as we often do, what a family! Upbeat does not even come close to how they are. When recently their landlord told them that he sold the house and they had to move, Mom simply said God will help us, and that He did. Just two doors away, a vacancy opened and they were in. Sadly their rent went from \$1,500 to \$2,600 per month, though. Rent here in Hampton Bays, as on most of Long Island, is high. From what we see, rents average over \$2,000 for a two bedroom apartment. Whole houses are much higher, often topping \$3,000 per month.

Getting back to our friends, now you might say they should look more for better rent, but when you are sick five out of seven days and three out of four weeks because of chemo, you take what you can – when you can. Speaking of chemo, after all is said and done, mom still has to pay roughly \$400 per month for her pills. So there are a lot of needs, but no wants. St. Vincent helps out paying some monthly bills, and our food pantry makes sure they don't go hungry. We are now seeking to pay the monthly prescription cost, but we have a lot of others that need help, so we really need help.

We receive calls asking for rent assistance, car insurance payments, electric bills, emergency oil, and medicine and in some cases furniture. Yes, furniture! You would be amazed how many people are not sleeping in a bed, or sitting on a chair, and if you are thinking that these cases are undocumented people you would be wrong. 95% of our works are those established families who have been in this country for generations and are experiencing difficulties now. So we never know when it's going to be you asking for help. Jesus comes to us daily, and sometimes He is recognizable as someone we know with a different name, but he or she is also known to you as a neighbor or friend.

The poor boxes are located at all the doors in the church, so please think of putting your loose change in every week. Every penny helps us do the work of Matthew 25. Yes, we also accept folding money. God Bless you, and please know that we pray for you all at every meeting.

## Centro Corazon de Maria Job Opening






