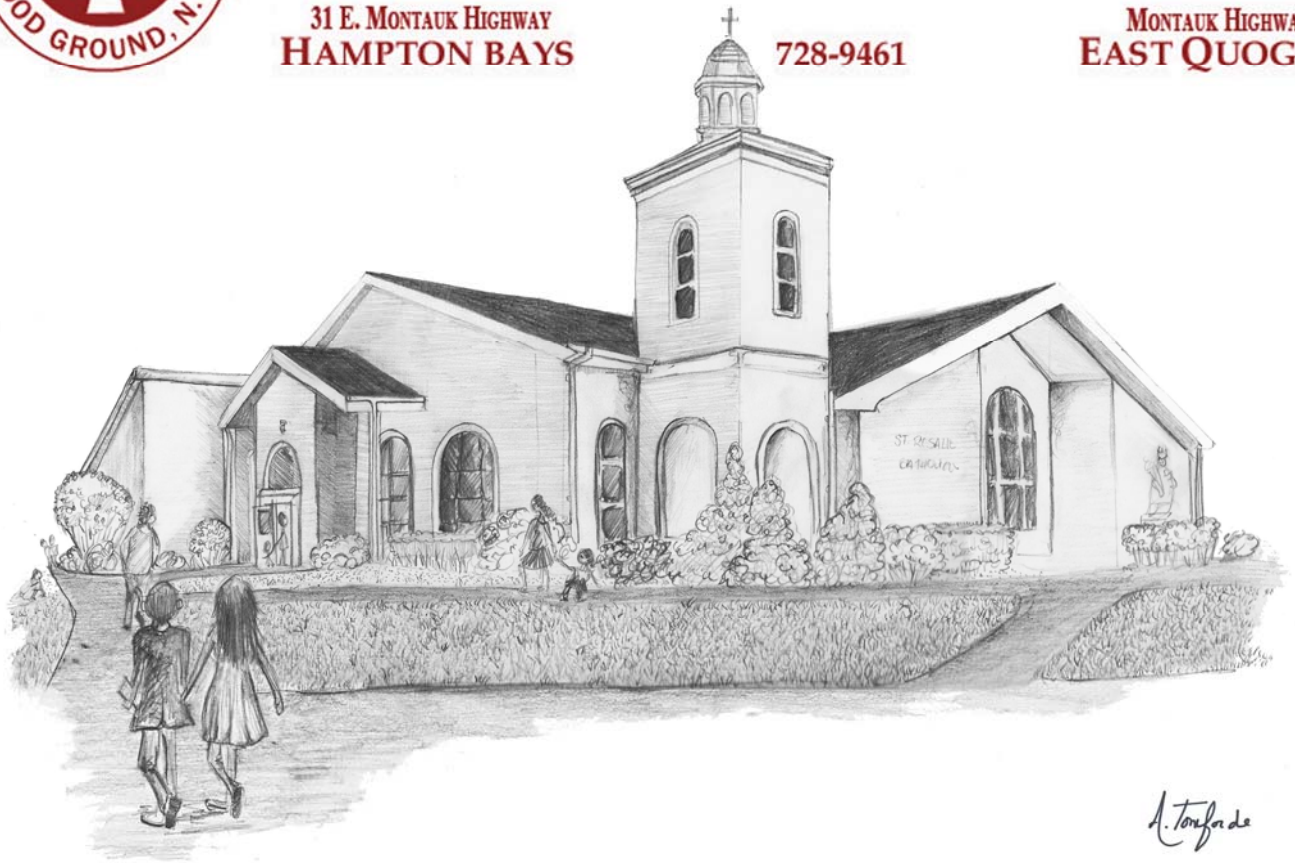

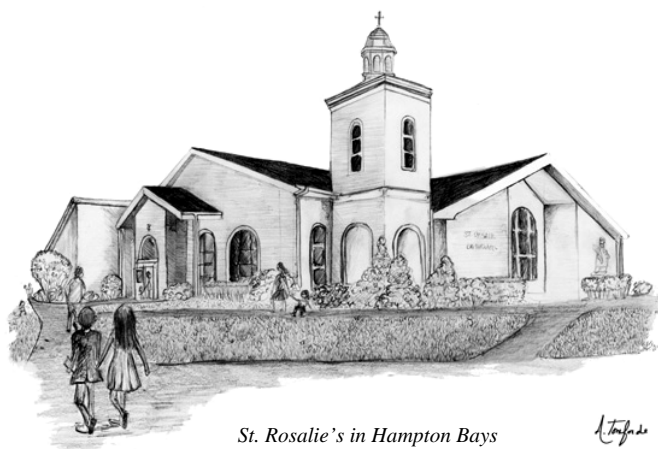

I was ordained to the priesthood on June 25, 2011. I was 55. People had asked me how I came to my vocation so late in life. My answer was,

"God calls you when He calls you, and He brings you where He needs you."

I still believe this. I came to realize that God had trained me for priesthood my whole life, enriched me with unusual skills, and when He was ready to call me, He made it easy for me to respond, "Here I am Lord!" Then he rewarded my willingness to follow Him by placing me, as my first assignment, in St. Rosalie's Parish.

You, my St. Rosalie's family, have been a gift to me. Our Lord called you to train me to be a priest. You have done so by opening your hearts to me from the very first day. You allowed me to grow with you, to laugh and to cry with you. We were together in good times and in truly hard times. You stayed right by my side when my mother died. (I thank you.) I stayed by your side when your mothers died. (I thank you again.)

People ask me how I feel about leaving St. Rosalie's. I'm honest; I tell them I don't want to leave. But I have known from the day that I walked into this parish, five years ago, that my assignment here would end. This is the life of a priest; to go where God sends you, when God sends you. Jesus, I trust in You!

Joyfully, I am not losing my St. Rosalie's family! Just as my sister and brother and nephew had been my family before I entered the priesthood, and continue to be my family now, so it is with St. Rosalie's: you are my family – and now I am adding an additional family of Sacred Heart Parish in North Merrick. God doesn't take his gifts back; He adds to them. My family grows, and my heart grows with it.

St. Rosalie's will always be my family and my home. Please keep me in your hearts and in your prayers, as I will you. Let us look forward to each joyful reunion as it occurs. And know that, at St. Rosalie's, all is well; God continues to bless you with my good friend and pastor, Father Ed Sheridan, to continue to lead the parish to peace and holiness. You are in good hands.

May God pour His blessings upon you, now and forever. May you rest, always, in the palm of His hands. May our paths soon meet again!

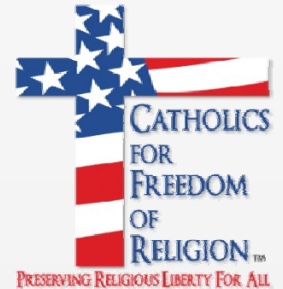

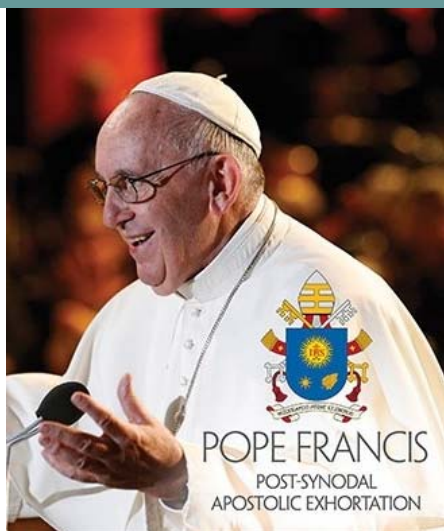

En el horizonte del amor, central en la experiencia cristiana del matrimonio y de la familia, se destaca también otra virtud, algo ignorada en estos tiempos de relaciones frenéticas y superficiales: la ternura. Acudamos al dulce e intenso Salmo 131. Como se advierte también en otros textos (cf. Ex 4,22; Is 49,15; Sal 27,10), la unión entre el fiel y su Señor se expresa con rasgos del amor paterno o materno. Aquí aparece la delicada y tierna intimidad que existe entre la madre y su niño, un recién nacido que duerme en los brazos de su madre después de haber sido amamantado. Por eso el salmista canta: «Tengo mi interior en paz y en silencio, como un niño destetado en el regazo de su madre» (Sal 131,2). De modo paralelo, podemos acudir a otra escena, donde el profeta Oseas coloca en boca de Dios como padre estas palabras conmovedoras: «Cuando Israel era joven, lo amé [...] Yo enseñe a andar a Efraín, lo alzaba en brazos [...] Con cuerdas humanas, con correas de amor lo atraía; era para ellos como el que levanta a un niño contra su mejilla, me inclinaba y le daba de comer» (11,1.3-4)..
