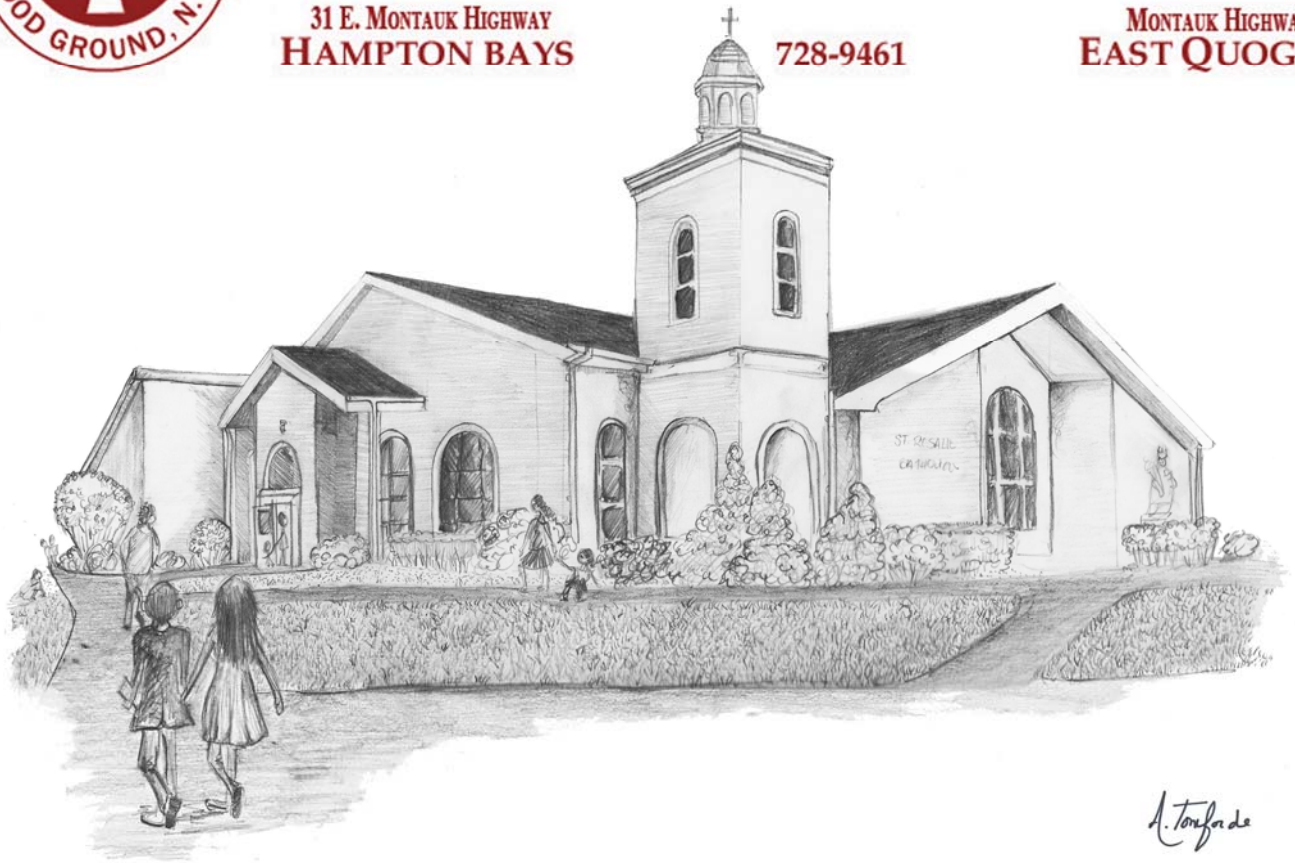

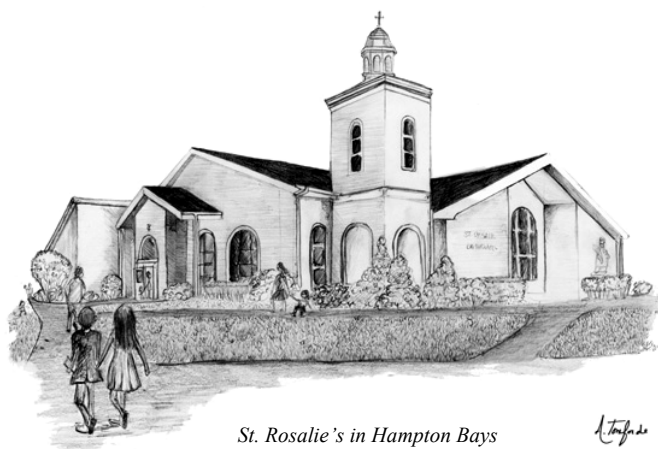

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

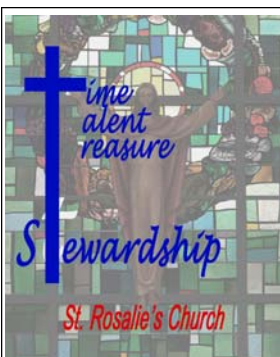
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## Reflections From Our Deacons

As you know Father Ed along with Seminarian Matt Browne attended World Youth Day 2016 in Krakow, Poland. What a wonderful opportunity it is to attend this spiritual pilgrimage. It reminded me of the pilgrimage I attended in Cologne, Germany in 2005. It was a wonderful experience to see young adults from around the world partaking in this faith-filled journey with Pope Benedict XVI.

One such moment I will always remember about World Youth Day was in Cologne right next to the Three Kings Cathedral right off the Rhine River waiting for Pope Benedict XVI to arrive. We waited for eight hours in a public square in the summer heat with just enough room to sit because there were so many youth in this square. The local fire department came out and sprayed cold water on us in a mist like fashion to keep us cool while we waited. It was so much fun spending time talking singing praying and getting to know the people around you, but it was the kindness from total strangers from different countries sharing our love for Jesus Christ and our newly elected Pope.

When Pope Benedict XVI got off the boat and walked through the cathedral out into the square the place just erupted, everyone shouting for the Pope. It was an unbelievable sight to see and experience. The noise was deafening. When Pope Benedict finally calmed us down he was shushing us to be quiet. I was somewhat taken back to see him do that to us especially after we spent so much time waiting for him. Pope Benedict spoke to us and blessed us and continued on walking back through the cathedral. It lasted only about fifteen minutes and he was gone – off to another venue.

When I got home and back to the parish I spoke to Father Dennis about the experience in the square. Father Dennis smiled at me and told me that Pope Benedict was shushing us all because the attention shouldn't be about him, but about God.

That was such a surreal moment for me, having Father Dennis explain it to me and for me to understand how humble and modest Pope Benedict was to share his love for God with us. I will never forget that experience and I too try to live and reflect on that daily. My love and blessing for you all.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his little flock (meaning his followers that were small in numbers but humble in spirit) that they will inherit the greatest of all gifts, the kingdom of heaven.

The readings today are thematic of God the Father as the keeper of his promises and his covenant. The second reading attests to the faith of Abraham and the eventual faith of Sarah. Paul reminds us that God fulfilled his promise to them by the blessing them with a child although they were both advanced in age. When we read this scripture we call to mind once again how the goodness of God is truly overflowing when we consider that Abraham's progeny eventually outnumbers the stars in the night sky. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom speaks of God's fidelity to his people and his desire that those he calls his own will live in freedom and be delivered from bondage in a promised land given by God.

The Gospel speaks of the promise of a true heavenly land for the people of God of the new covenant. Jesus calls his people to keep vigilant and to order their priorities in the hopeful anticipation of the fulfillment of this heavenly spiritual destination.

Jesus also desires that his people realize and seek the gifts of his Spirit through his sacraments especially reconciliation and receiving the Eucharist.

**Homilía de Papa a los Jóvenes en Polonia** - Dios nos salva haciéndose pequeño, cercano y concreto. Ante todo, Dios se hace pequeño. El Señor, «manso y humilde de corazón» (Mt 11,29), prefiere a los pequeños, a los que se ha revelado el Reino de Dios (Mt 11,25); estos son grandes ante sus ojos, y a ellos dirige su mirada (cf. Is 66,2). Los prefiere porque se oponen a la «soberbia de la vida», que procede del mundo (cf. 1 Jn 2,16). Los pequeños hablan su mismo idioma: el amor humilde que hace libres.



Además, Dios es *cercano*, su Reino está cerca (cf. Mc 1,15): el Señor no desea que lo teman como a un soberano poderoso y distante, no quiere quedarse en un trono en el cielo o en los libros de historia, sino que quiere sumirse en nuestros avatares de cada día para caminar con nosotros. Pensando en el don de un milenio abundante de fe, es bello sobre todo agradecer a Dios, que ha caminado con nuestro pueblo, llevándolo de la mano, como un papá con su niño, y acompañándolo en tantas situaciones.

Por último, *Dios es concreto*. La Sabiduría divina «obra como artífice» y «juega» con el mundo (cf. Pr 8,30); el Verbo se hace carne, nace de una madre, nace bajo la ley (cf. Ga 4,4), tiene amigos y participa en una fiesta: el eterno se comunica pasando el tiempo con personas y en situaciones concretas. También vuestra historia, impregnada de Evangelio, cruz y fidelidad a la Iglesia, ha visto el contagio positivo de una fe genuina, transmitida de familia en familia, de padre a hijo, y sobre todo de las madres y de las abuelas, a quienes hay mucho que agradecer. *Częstochowa, jueves 28 de julio de 2016.*

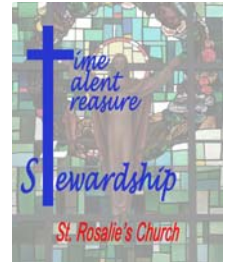
