SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

Last week I shared our initial experience travelling to Lithuania and

Poland for a Discernment Retreat



with some 20 young people ages 17-24. What a great experience to be traveling with these young vibrant young pilgrims.

Together with

my classmate, Father Joe Fitzgerald, Vocation Director and Sister Bonaventure and Sister Catherine,



Missionary Sisters of St. Benedict. I loved conducting this Retreat with them at the Diocesan Seminary in Bialystok in northeastern Poland. After the five days on this

beautiful retreat with this wonderful group of discerners we travelled to

motherhouse outside Warsaw and then arrived at our Hotel in Krakow. At Krakow when we



arrived Monday night there was so much going on with groups at our hotel from Florida and from the land down under in Australia.

What a beautiful experience World Youth Day is meeting so many different people of faith from Bishops and Cardinals, young people hungering for Christ, Religious Brothers and Sisters, men and women and all so alive in our Catholic Faith!

We participated in the Welcome

Ceremony with the Pope. The pilgrimage hike from the Center of Krakow to the Camp Misericordia was an endurance part of this WYD Pilgrim-

age. We walked about 7 kilometers after travelling on different jam-packed Trams to a location to begin the hike. We needed to



travel on multiple trams as it was difficult for all 25 of us plus Father Janus' group from Copiague who were travelling with us for part of the Day. Then at the Saturday night Vigil, we heard Pope Francis tell the young people of the world not to be "couch potatoes," that we were all

made in the image and likeness of God and we were created to leave our mark on the world! What



an inspiring message for all of us to take to heart!

On Sunday morning, I was up early and after waking up and meeting other pilgrims up early, we all



prepared for the Sunday Mass with

Pope Francis. Father Joe and I had credentials to get closer for Mass. However, to be at that location for Mass, it required us to go through metal detectors like at JFK airport to concelebrate Mass in front of the altar with the Holy Father, Cardinals and Bishops present.

What a wonderful experience. It was very hot. Most of the priests had a hat and they gave us some umbrellas for shade as well. It was a very moving experience for all of us, and I think particularly for those with us who were discerning what God may, in fact be calling them to. Next week we will discuss returning from the pilgrimage at Camp Misericordia and the visit to Auschwitz before we left Poland.






