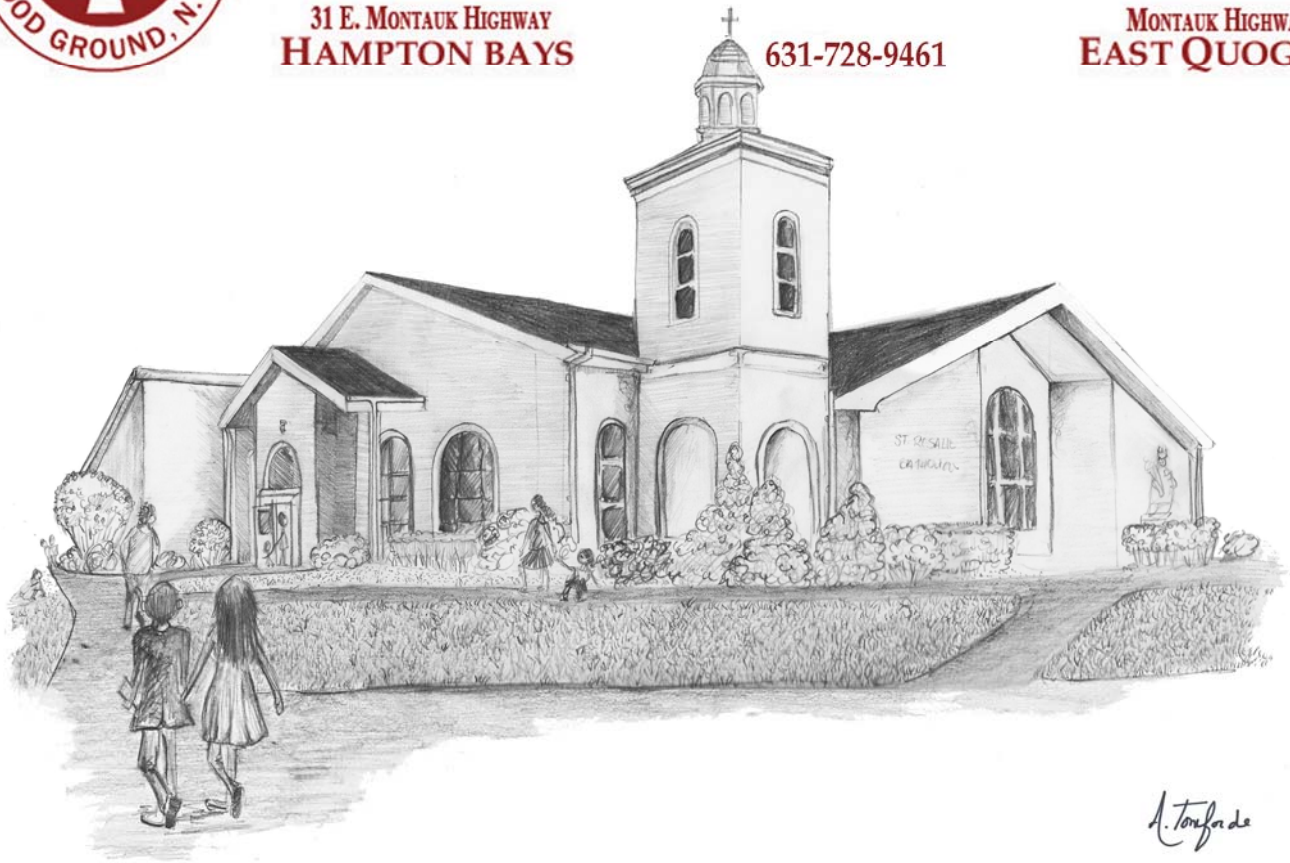

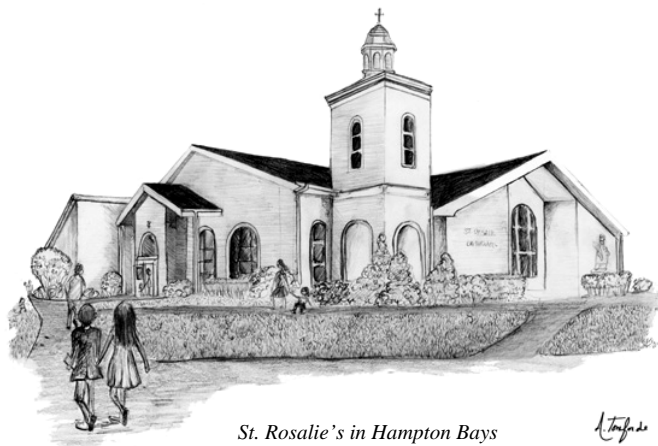

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

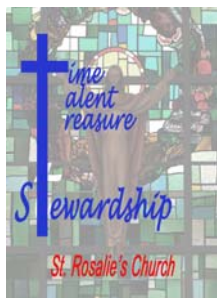
### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

## From The Desk of Father Maddaloni

**T**

his Sunday's readings emphasize the importance of praying constantly. We are reminded that prayer is at the heart of one's relationship with God. What kind of relationship can we expect to have with anyone with whom we do not spend time, to whom we do not speak, and to whom we do not listen?

In the excerpt from Exodus, as long as Moses holds his hands up, God comes to the aid of the Israelite army. This is not magic; Moses does not control God. The image presented reinforces the importance of Moses' prayerful intercession. Through prayer, we participate in the good work of God.

Paul reminds Timothy of the value of the prayerful reading of Scripture. Through Scripture, one *listens* to God. Invigorated by the Word of God, we become proclaimers of the Good News.

Finally, in the Gospel passage, Jesus contrasts God to the dishonest judge in his parable. If even the dishonest judge will listen to the petitions of an earnest supplicant, how much readier will our loving Father be to respond to us?

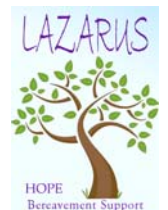

## St. Rosalie's Parish Outreach and Food Pantry

Dear Parishioners and Supporters,

Pope Francis said, *"An authentic faith always implies a deep desire to change the world."*

As we enter a new year in Parish Social Ministry, I wanted to share with you how your support, generosity and faithfulness has impacted so many community members through our Outreach and Food Pantry. During the past year:

- ✠ 4,571+ community members were fed (3 meals per person for 3 days = 41,139 meals)
- ✠ 1,470+ households accessed Outreach/Food Pantry
- ✠ 7,600+ total services/referrals directly to our community.

Many requests for financial assistance were also received throughout the year due to unforeseen events or a personal/family crisis. Each intake was completed with the deepest desire to alleviate the current difficult situation, as well as, a plan for moving forward. Last year, over \$18,000 was granted in direct services...

Homeless found shelter, seniors/children kept warm, lights turned back on, medicines purchased, car/home repairs completed, insurances reinstated, jobs found, children's clothing and warm coats received...lives changed. **Thank you.**

The Food Pantry and Outreach volunteers are the salt and light of Parish Social Ministry! They share their time, talents and treasures with an authentic faith. Every pantry guest is served with dignity and mercy every visit. **Thank you.**

Lastly this past spring, a woman visited our pantry for the first time and she was greeted by the volunteer with a grand smile and warm welcome. During the process of registering, the volunteer heard something in her voice and asked if I had time to meet with her. Within minutes of our visit, tears were streaming down her worn face. Her story was profoundly sad, her pain and sorrow overwhelming. I promised we would walk along side her. During the summer months, many miracles and blessings fell upon this broken woman through our Outreach, Catholic Church and St. Rosalie's community. Authentic faith in action changing her life forever. **Thank you.**

The change began through the open door of St. Rosalie's Community Food Pantry and a faith-full volunteer who responded to the cry of the poor. **Thank you.**

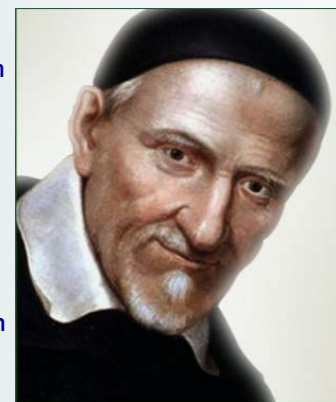
