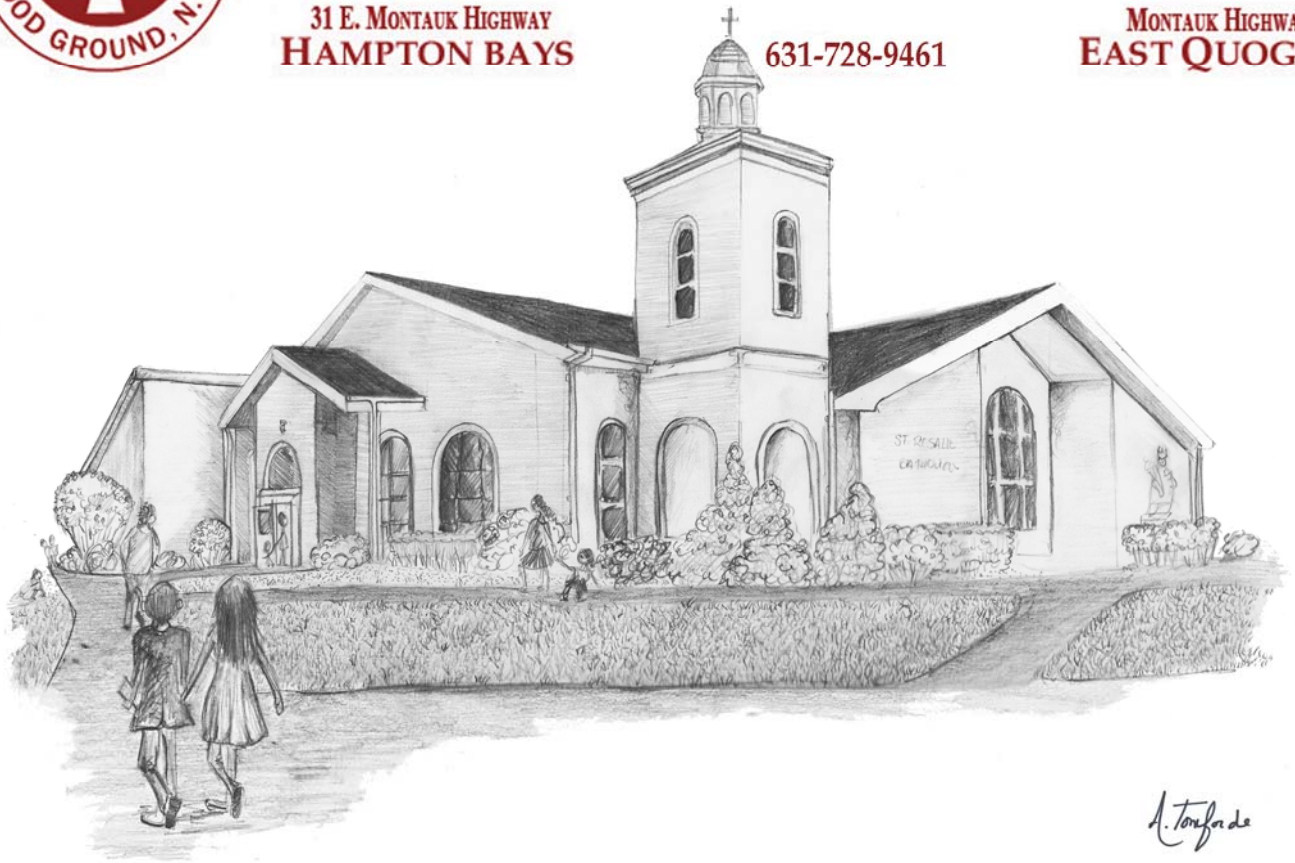

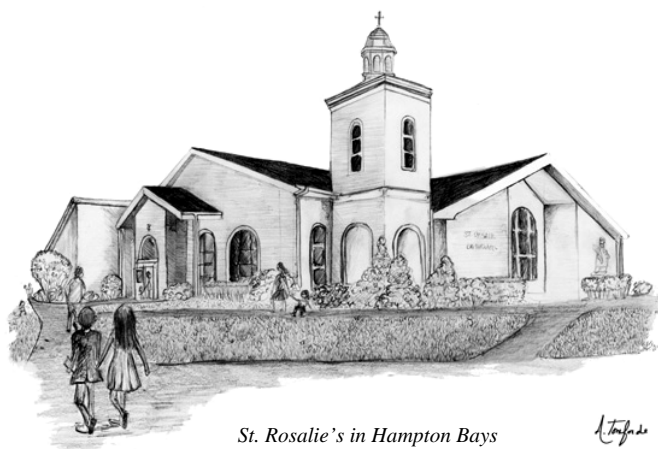

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

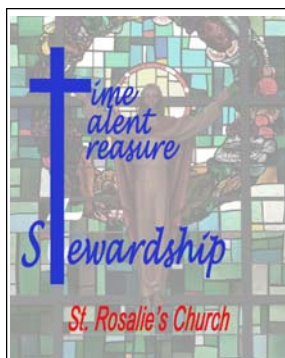

Brothers and sisters, patience, one of the virtues, is one of the actions of the Season of Advent. Yes, to be patient takes work, it is an action.
