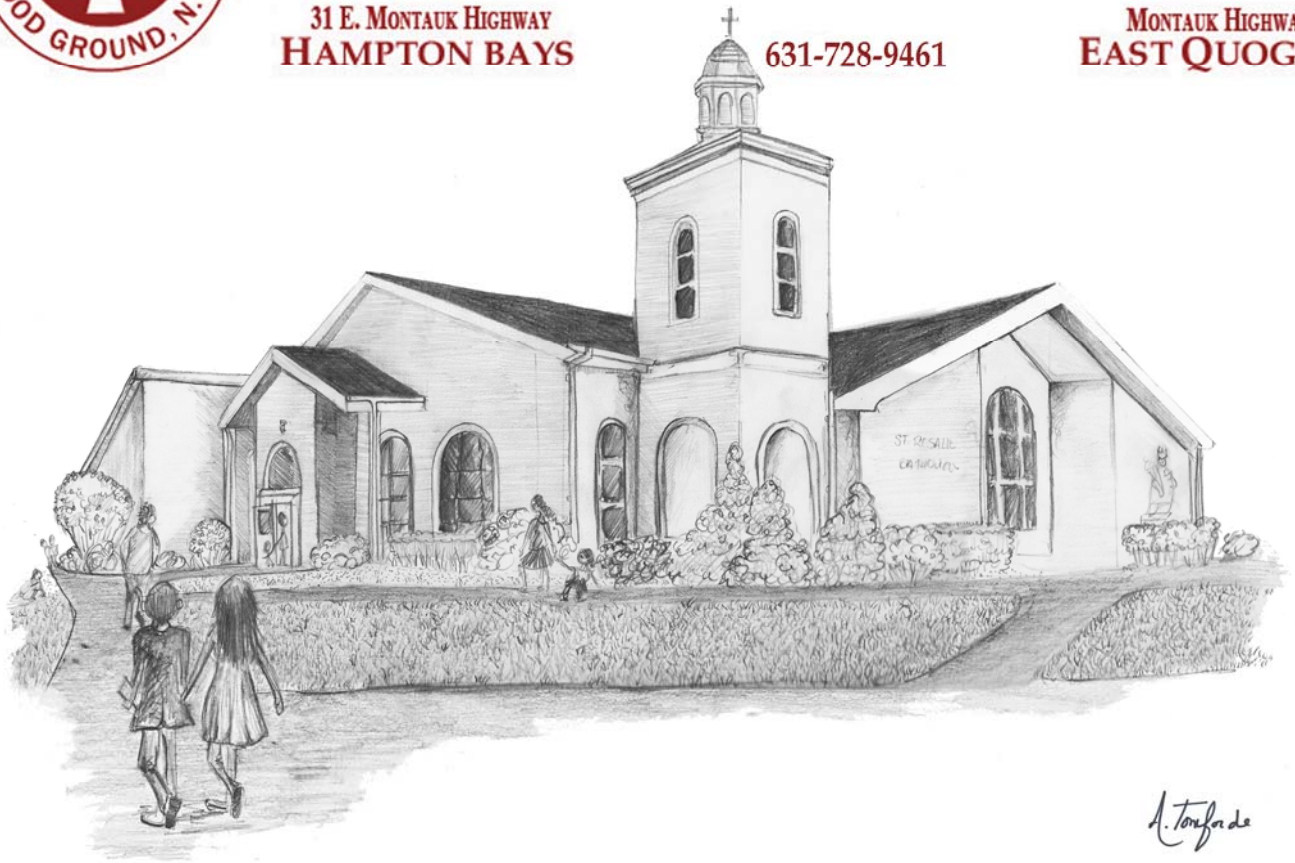

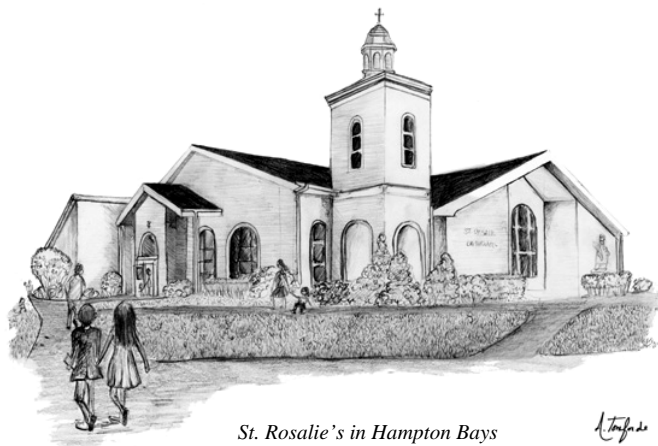

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

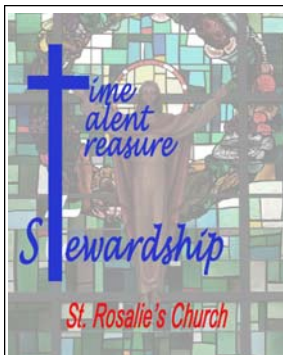

From The Pastor's Desk

The Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany of the Lord is the manifestation of Jesus Christ to all. The Nativity is the moment that mystery of the Incarnation happens. Christ is born as a human being with two natures: divine and human. On the Epiphany we show that Christ came for all men and women, boys and girls to save us!

Today we complete the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord! Jesus is baptized by his cousin, John the Baptist in the Jordan River. After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven. John testified further, saying, *"I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from the sky and remain upon him. I did not know him but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."* JOHN 1:32-34

When we are baptized we receive the Spirit. After Jesus' Resurrection, Jesus sends the Advocate, the Holy Spirit to illuminate our hearts and minds and souls so that we might live in the best way that we can! We exercise the gifts of the Holy Spirit such as knowledge, understanding, wonder and awe! Just as the three wise men returned home by a different route in fear of Herod, we must also return to the Lord with a fixed gaze on Christ! The images/sounds of the world are not always in synch with living according to the gospel. Baptism frees us from original sin, and incorporates us into the Church! As a sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace – let those graces flow. On this day of the Baptism of the Lord, let us identify with Jesus who calls us into Living Waters of Salvation.

The March for Life Friday, January 27

As Catholics we need to think, that life is important to us from the moment of conception till natural death! I will celebrate a Mass for Life at 4:15 a.m. at St. Rosalie's Church. Bus departs Saint Rosalie's parking lot at 4:45 a.m. We will stop at Immaculate Conception in Westhampton Beach for others who join us. We will arrive about noon attending the Rally for Life March to the U.S. Supreme Court and finish at Parish of St. Joseph's on Capitol Hill. We will join others from the Diocese of Rockville Centre to receive a blessing for our return trip, arriving about 11:30 p.m. Please join our parishioners and young people to represent St. Rosalie's, Immaculate Conception, Our Lady of the Hamptons, McGann-Mercy High School, Knights of Columbus Councils and East End Catholics, so that our voices may be heard. Financially Speaking

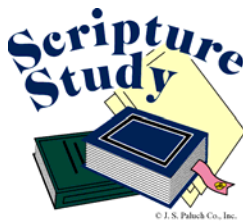

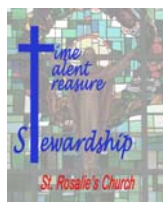
