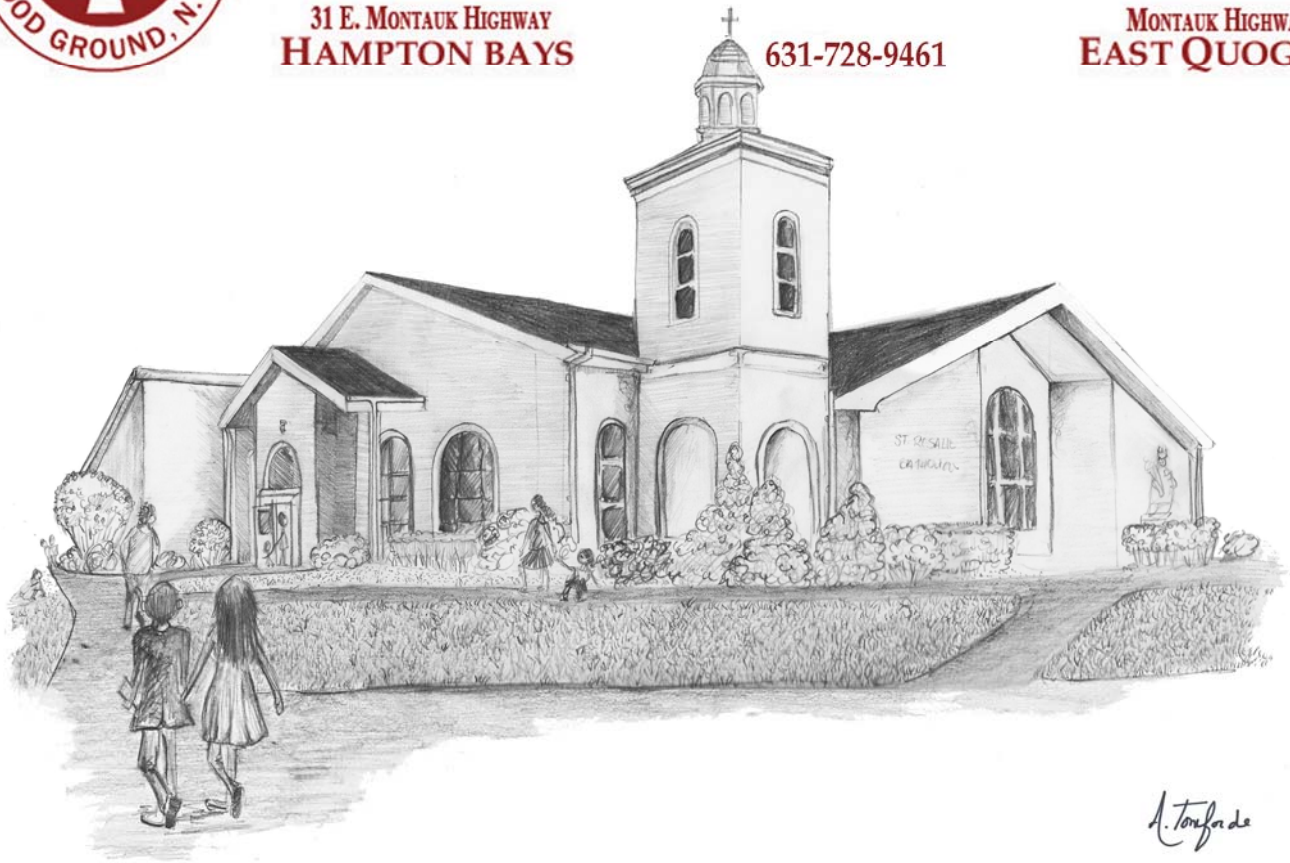

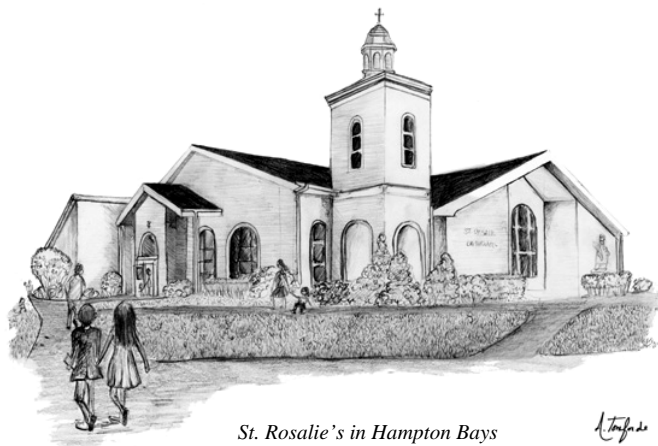

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

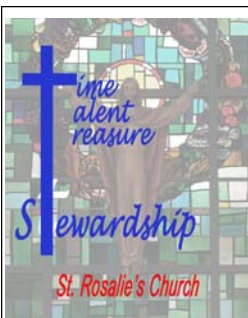
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From The Pastor's Desk

Temptation

Believe it or not, we are now in LENT with Ash Wednesday a few days ago! Repent and hear the good news! In today's gospel of St. Matthew, we have the image of the temptations of Jesus by the devil in the desert. Our Lord was tempted because even though he was fully divine, he was also fully human. As men and women, we are tempted, but because we are not perfect we can fall into sin. But even though Our Lord was tempted – he never entered into sin.

The devil tempts Jesus to turn the stones into bread...*"man does not live on bread alone"* MATTHEW 4:3. Jesus, of course, is fasting in the desert. The devil then takes Jesus to the parapet of the Temple and he commands Jesus to throw himself down from the top and references the Scriptures where it is said: *"He will command his angels concerning you and 'with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone.'* MATTHEW 4:6 But Jesus responds so beautifully that *"one should not put the Lord thy God to the test."* MATTHEW 4:7. Then Satan brings Jesus to the highest mountain, so he can see all the kingdoms of the world commanding Jesus to bow down in worship, and the devil will give Jesus all this. Jesus responds: *"Get away, Satan! It is written: 'The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve.'"* MATTHEW 4:10

What an example we have in our Lord Jesus Christ! Here He is the Son of God, and he allows himself to be put to the test! What about us? Can we withstand the rigors of being tested? The daily grind, the rat-race that we go through in order to provide for our families. Are we tempted to be impatient, sometimes angry or upset because of difficulties? When we have disagreements with a loved one? Do we lose our focus, our very faith in Jesus Christ? Perhaps we need to remind ourselves of those Lenten practices that will call us as Jesus calls us to live in a new way, His way. Perhaps your own Lenten practices of almsgiving, prayer and fasting will give you the strength to be strong in your resolve this Lent! Perhaps using the Mite boxes (for Lenten almsgiving) provided this Lent for you, and focusing on the weekly Sunday homilies and encouraging the attendance at our Parish Mission will give you the extra strength and resolve also.

Lenten Mission, March 19-21

Sunday March 19, Monday, 20 and Tuesday 21 join parishioners for our Lenten Mission with Dr. Margaret Schlientz –on Anger, Forgiveness and Healing.

"You don't ask too much from God, you ask too little," the silver-haired, Dr. Margaret Schlientz scolded her audience during a talk at the Thirst Conference in Bismarck, ND. She spoke with confidence, infusing her audience with the certainty of the Gospels and the fire of the Holy Spirit. Dr. Schlientz has the authority of one with three master's degrees; in theology, spirituality, and psychiatric nursing, as well as a doctorate in psychiatric nursing, and many years as an administrator and teacher at Marquette University. But it is her no-nonsense, cut-to-the-chase style that gets an audience's attention. Dr. Schlientz knows of what she speaks. She is the assistant director at the Institute for Priestly Formation at Creighton University where she teaches and ministers to seminarians in an intensive spiritual renewal program. "The Jesus of the Bible is still the Jesus of today," she said. "He did miracles then and he will still do them for us today but we need to have faith and ask." I found Dr. Margaret Schlientz' lectures and interaction very helpful. Margaret was my mentor during my three-year program in Spiritual Direction for Diocesan priests, which I just completed this January. This mission will be great! Please join us!

Just a gentle reminder that Daylight Savings Time will begin next weekend. Before you go to bed next Saturday evening, turn your clocks forward one hour.

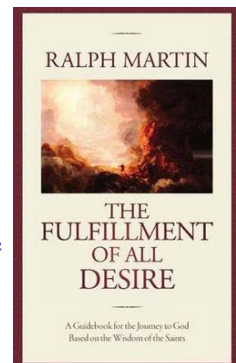

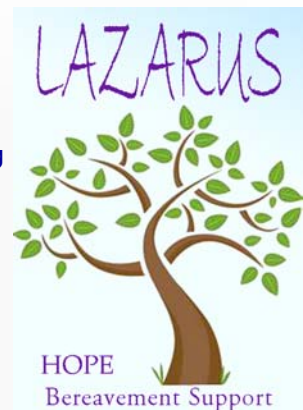

The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program at St. Rosalie's Church

We have all suffered the loss of someone near and very dear to us. It may have been a spouse, child, parent, sibling or friend. Often our grief can be so devastating that we may feel completely lost and alone.

The Lazarus Bereavement Support Program is a nine-week program in which healing can begin. It provides members with an opportunity to understand grief in a way that rebuilds our identity and strengthens our faith in ourselves and in our Lord. Now in its fifth year, the **Lazarus Bereavement Support Program** helps members to understand that grief is experienced in each person differently, and that it often takes a very long time for the pain to heal. Participants will learn strategies for dealing with grief, and will receive (and give) valuable group support and fellowship throughout the healing process.

"Adorarás al Señor, tu Dios, y a Él sólo Servirás" – Después de su bautismo Jesús fue conducido por el Espíritu al desierto. Allí, con ayunos y oraciones, se preparó para su ministerio. El primer reto grande que tuvo que enfrentar y superar fue la tentación. Su

respuesta nos ofrece un guía para nuestro camino de la cuaresma. Nos dice que uno debe servir sólo a Dios, que uno se alimenta con la Palabra de Dios, y que uno nunca debe tentar a Dios, o más bien en vez de presumir que Dios le debe algo, tenemos que confiar en el amor incondicional de Dios.

Vivir la cuaresma, es un entrar espiritualmente al desierto y nuestras oraciones y privaciones, son nuestra manera de recordar que poner Dios primero en nuestro corazón y nuestra vida.

Ayuno, Abstinencia y Actos de Penitencia para la Cuaresma: Los obispos de los Estados Unidos prescriben, como obligación mínima, que todas las personas que han cumplido los catorce años y los mayores de catorce están obligadas a abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes de cuaresma. Además, todas las personas desde los dieciocho años de edad hasta los cincuenta y nueve años, inclusivas, están obligadas a ayunar limitándose a una sola comida completa el viernes santo, mientras las otras dos comidas en esos días deben ser ligeras.

Acusación (Nuestra diócesis nos pide que pongamos este aviso en el boletín para siempre informar y proteger nuestra gente.)- En febrero 14, 2017, Newsday reportó que el señor Efraín Villafane fue acusado de delitos sexuales cometidos contra una mujer adolescente. El Sr. Villafane había servido como Ministro de Música en la parroquia de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, en Patchogue y en la parroquia de San Juan Evangelista en Centro Moriches. Cuando se hicieron las primeras acusaciones, el Sr. Villafane fue retirado de inmediato del empleo. La Oficina para la Protección de los Niños y los Jóvenes de la Diócesis de Rockville Centre cooperó plenamente con las autoridades durante su investigación.
