



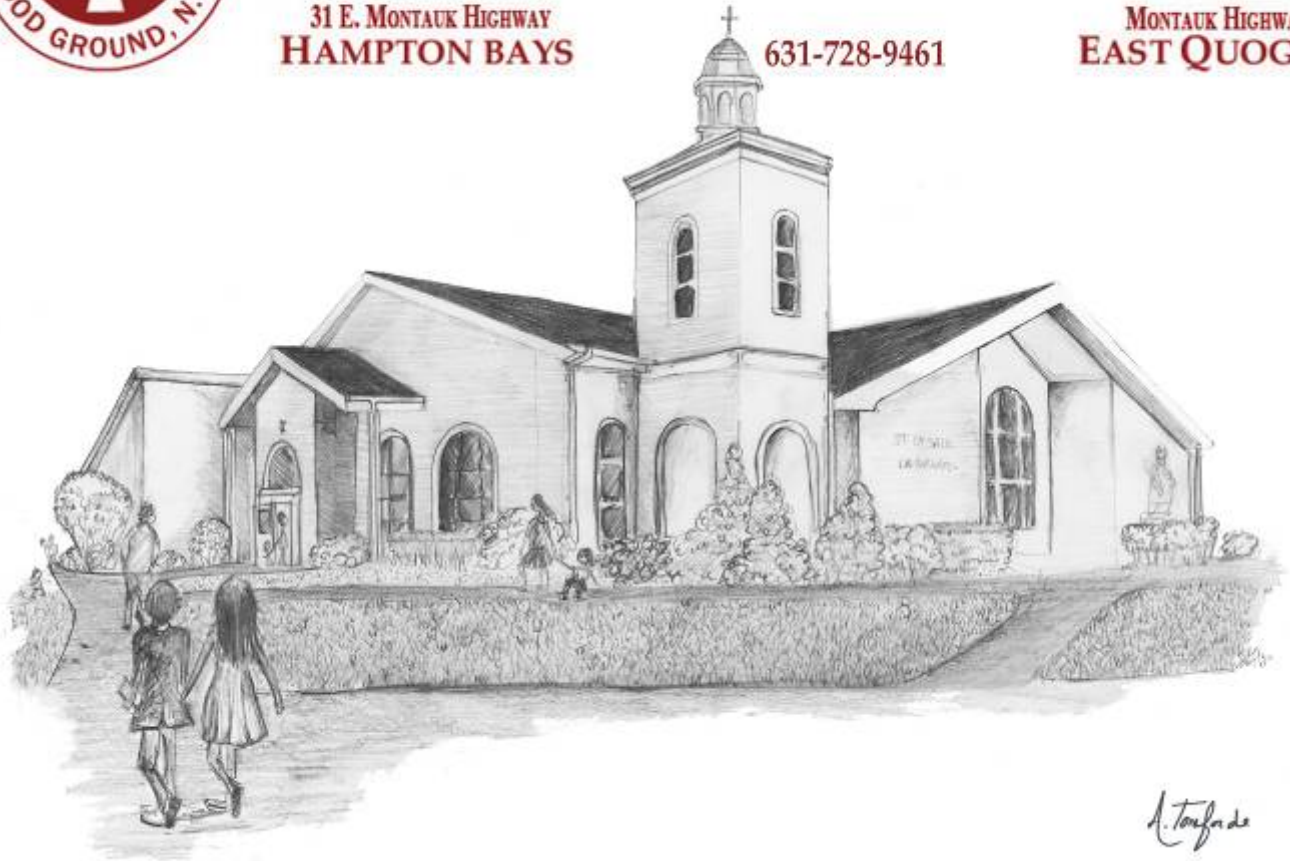

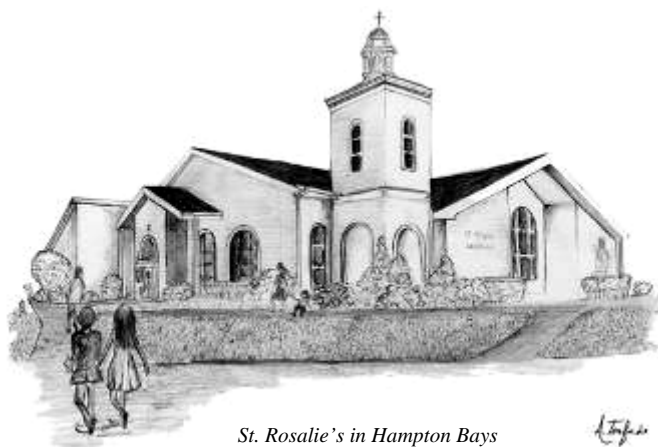

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

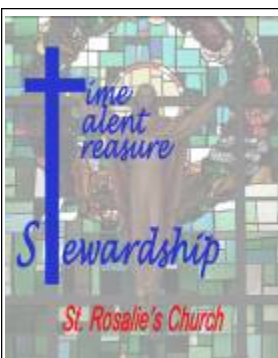
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From the Pastor's Desk

Brothers and Sisters, we are now just about one month into 2018. We look around and we think we see heroes around us. Whether they be from the sports world or the entertainment industry our children yes even those of us we call adults, are enamored by these "stars." However at times some of these so called "stars" fall from grace. Whether it is a sports hero or an entertainer who makes mistakes, we need to realize that we are all imperfect people living in an imperfect world imperfectly. Father Dietz, who recently died, was my philosophy professor at Cathedral College who taught us this in the college seminary. I had him for Epistemology (the philosophy of Knowing) and Metaphysics (Being insofar as Being exists). I always remember a maxim he taught us in philosophy: Never Deny, Seldom Affirm, Always Distinguish!



We need to make good judgments in our lives, but we need to base these judgments and decisions on our Faith. Our faith comes from Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

In today's gospel the last line reads:

*His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.* MARK 1: 28

Christ is not a rock star; not a sports figure, entertainer, a president, CEO of a major corporation. But He is more than these: HE IS OUR GOD! In the fullness of time God the Father sent his Son, so that we could have life and have it to the full! Not only that but after Jesus' death and Resurrection, He sent us the third person of the Holy Trinity – the Holy Spirit to help us, to guide us. We are so blessed as Catholics, as members of St. Rosalie's parish. Let us live in God's Blessing. Let us realize that Christ's fame is real. That Jesus Christ talked the talk, but he also walked the walk for you and me.

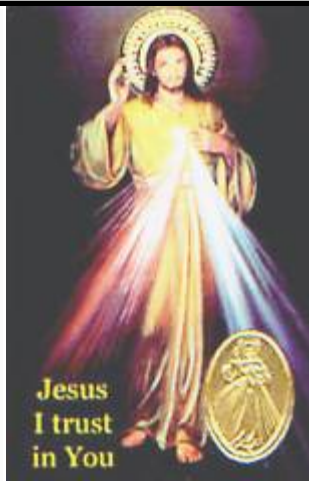



# Centro Corazón de María

As if offering the merest crumb from a rich banquet, Centro Corazón de María, a local ministry to Latino immigrants, offers an explanation of the term DACA which is frequently used in current news stories.

## WHAT IS DACA?

### DACA Is A Program

DACA is the acronym for "Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals." It is a program begun by the previous administration to grant legal protection to youth (children under the age of 16) who came to the U.S. without permission. Youth who meet strict criteria are granted permission to stay in the U.S. They are given a social security number and a work permit. Thus, youth without documents then have the means to earn a living, and move ahead in their lives.

### DACA Is A Controversial Idea

DACA has been constantly in the news. Congress is laboring over whether and how to transform the temporary permission into a law, called the "Dream Act" that grants permanent legal status to **Dreamers**.

### DACA Is Closely Connected To The Project Of The "Dreamers"

Youth who came to the U.S. without permission call themselves "**Dreamers**" – echoing their understanding of the "American Dream" and our country's ideals.

**Dreamer** is the face of idealistic young people who surround us here in Hampton Bays. All the names have been changed to respect privacy.

**Dreamer is Teresa**, a committed Catholic and youth leader who works, studies and pays her own tuition. **Dreamer is Samuel**, who graduated from college on scholarship and left a lucrative job to be a bi-lingual teacher aid. **Dreamer is Zitlaly**, who overcame many problems at home to finish college and work in advocacy for other immigrant youth. **Dreamer is William**, the first in his family to finish high school, who looks forward to learning a trade and helping his mom and little sister.

## ¿QUE ES DACA?

### DACA Es Un Programa

DACA son las siglas para el Inglés "Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals." Es un programa iniciado por la administración anterior para otorgar protección legal a los jóvenes (niños menores de 16 años) que llegaron a los E. U. sin permiso. Los jóvenes que cumplen con criterios estrictos reciben permiso para permanecer en los Estados Unidos. Se les proporciona un número de seguro social y un permiso de trabajo. Por lo tanto, los jóvenes sin documentos tienen los medios para ganarse la vida y avanzar en sus vidas.

### DACA Es Una Idea Controversial

DACA ha estado constantemente en las noticias. El Congreso está trabajando sobre si y cómo transformar el permiso temporario en una ley, que se llama "Dream Act" que otorgue estatus legal permanente a DREAMERS.

### DACA Está Conectada Al Proyecto De Los "Dreamers."

Los jóvenes que llegaron a los Estados Unidos sin permiso se autodenominan "**Dreamers**" haciéndose eco de su comprensión del "Sueño Americano" y los ideales de nuestro país.

**Dreamer** es la cara de los jóvenes idealistas que nos rodean aquí en Hampton Bays. Todos los nombres han sido cambiados para respetar la privacidad.

**Dreamer es Teresa**, una católica comprometida y líder juvenil que trabaja, estudia y paga su propia matrícula. **Dreamer es Samuel**, quien se graduó de la universidad con una beca y dejó un trabajo lucrativo para ser un tutor bilingüe. **Dreamer es Zitlaly**, que superó muchos problemas en el hogar para terminar la universidad y trabajar en defensa de otros jóvenes inmigrantes. **Dreamer es William**, el primero de su familia en terminar la escuela secundaria, que espera aprender un oficio y ayudar a su madre y a su hermanita.

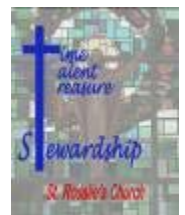
