SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION


Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.



From the Pastor's Desk

In today's gospel we hear: Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two. MARK 6:7 If we recognize that Christ came to proclaim the kingdom of God, we realize that the kingdom cannot come about simply by wishful thinking. Certainly, Jesus Christ established the beginning of the kingdom. Yes, it is what we might call "eschatological", a big theological word which means already here but not yet fulfilled. Just as He sent the apostles out two by two, Jesus also sends us out two by two. After all we are the hands and feet of Christ in the world.



What a beautiful time of year it is here on the East End to celebrate the Gift of God's love for each and every one of us. Starting two weeks ago on July 1 we started the second Mass at 10:15 a.m. at Saint Rosalie's in East Quogue. We welcome all our summer residents and visitors to East Quogue, and Hampton Bays. June has been such a blur this year – but I guess it always is, with graduations and end of school year for our children in religious formation as well.

REPAIRS NEEDED IN THE CHURCH

Update on our Rogers Organ

As we mentioned a while ago, our beloved Rogers organ installed in 1996 when our beautiful church was opened, has not been working properly. Tom Humbert had arranged for our specialists from Connecticut to conduct various diagnostics on it. Eventually because components kept failing we decided to have the organ sent back to the Rogers people. It appears the electronics had been possibly hit by lightning which affected the proper functioning. We are of course making an insurance claim, but it will cost us at least the \$5,000 deductible. The good news is that we hope to have the organ back, with your prayers assisting, by the Feast of Saint Rosalie's in September. I'll keep you updated. Also, be aware that on the East side of the Church we have had an issue with the shifting of some floor tiles. I have been aware that the expansion joints in one aisle near the Blessed Sacrament Chapel would require some maintenance. Looks like we will need to do a more immediate repair with the tiles in the roped off area more quickly.

- Met with school staff and the parent of a student at a local school who was in dire need of affordable housing,

- Travelled to SVdP Bethpage to attend the planning meeting for the 2018 Walk for the Poor in Bethpage and start to formulate plans for our local effort here in our parish this September 29,
- Arranged to pick up a mammoth supply of Girl Scout cookies earmarked for distribution to local Suffolk County Veteran groups and housing sites, and
- Invited and met with members of the Common Good here at our parish to one of our SVdP meetings to discuss our support for their "Blessings in the Backpack " program they're intending to implement with the staff at the elementary school here in Hampton Bays for students in need this October.

On behalf of our SVdP Conference, we thank you for your donations to the Poor Boxes at the church entrances and exits. Without your charitable assistance, our help to our neighbors in need here in Hampton Bays would not be possible.

Our SVdP Conference meets twice a month with regularly scheduled sessions every other Monday, in the Parish Center, at either 7 p.m. or at 1 p.m. We always welcome those who might be interested in the work of our SVdP Conference here at St. Rosalie's.
