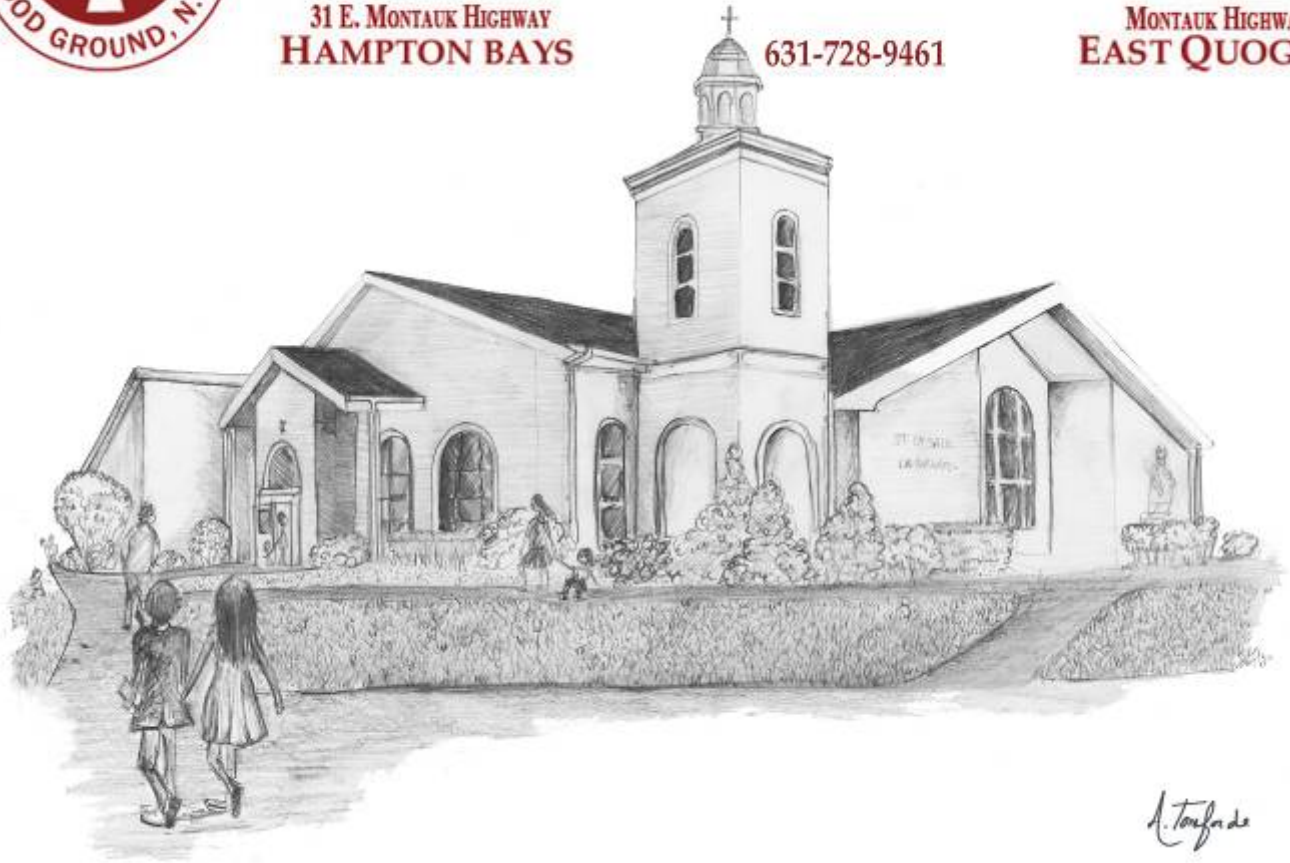

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

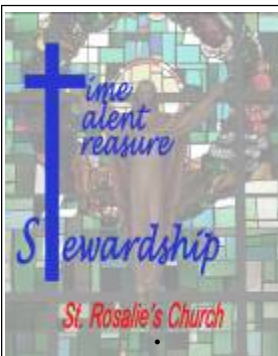
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In today's Gospel, after Jesus invited all to eat his flesh and blood, it became clear that this was difficult for those that heard the Lord to understand. Then many of his disciples who were listening said, *"This saying is hard; who can accept it?"* JOHN 6:60

Sure, it must have seemed like a shock to the disciples and people. He wants us to eat His flesh and drink His blood? It didn't make sense to them at first. But isn't being a Christian hard? Is it not hard to take up Christ cross and follow him? Isn't it difficult to raise a family? Isn't it hard to be understanding all the time of husband and wife, children and extended family and friends! But that's in fact why Jesus gives us food for the journey. Marian Shrines Pilgrimage Rescheduled

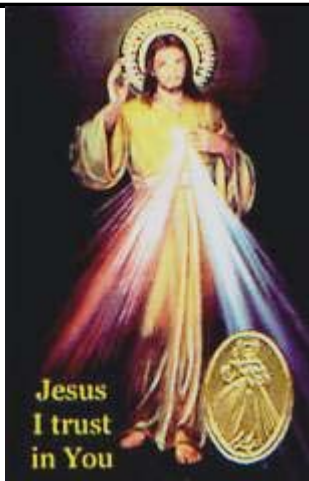

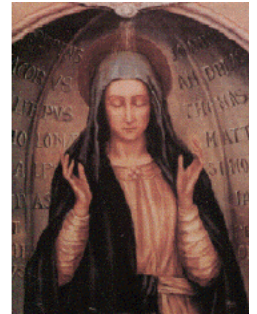
Releasing the Power of Prayer:
