



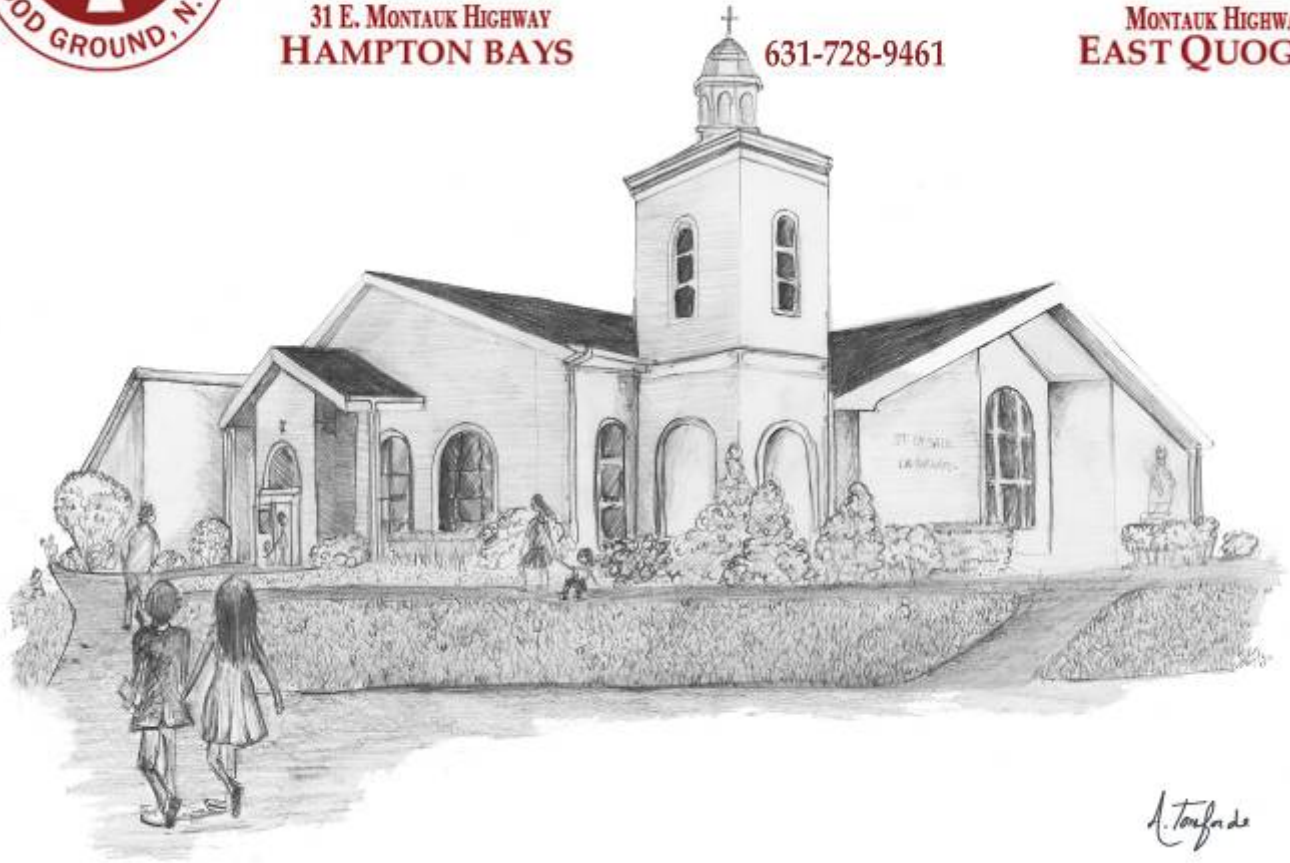

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

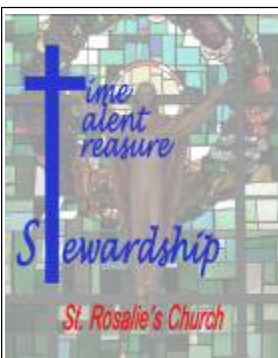
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Desk of Father Maddaloni



In this Sunday's second reading from Hebrews, the author emphasizes an obvious difference between the sacrifices offered by the priests of the Temple and the sacrifice of Christ. The Temple priests offered many sacrifices, pouring out the blood of many sacrificial victims. Jesus Christ offered himself as the one effective sacrifice for the redemption of mankind. God offered God to God. Unlike the sacrifices of animals in the Temple, this sacrifice need never be repeated.

"But wait!" you may object. "Don't we repeat the sacrifice at every Mass?"

No, we do not. We repeat the same words of consecration, but we do not repeat the sacrifice of Christ. We *participate* in his one sacrifice. "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, she commemorates Christ's Passover, and it is made present: the sacrifice Christ offered once for all on the cross remains ever present." (CCC 1364). "The Eucharist is...a sacrifice because it *re-presents* (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross..." (CCC 1366).

Thus Jesus's Body is present in a special way in what we consume at Mass. We do not believe that this is merely symbolic. We participate in the very real sacrifice at Calvary.

Awesome.

In light of this, the mandated one hour fast before receiving communion makes sense. That little fast is a show of reverence; we are to receive Christ himself into our bodies. This is special food.

It is good to reflect upon this truth often. We can become accustomed to hearing about the presence of Christ and become a little too casual in our approach to him in the sacrament.

I urge all to keep in mind what we are doing when we consume the host or drink from the cup. As we approach in the communion line, it is traditional and respectful to keep hands together and out of pockets. As cold weather approaches, please remember that the consecrated host should not be placed on a gloved hand so that particles do not attach to the wool, leather or cloth of the glove. Please remember not to chew gum or suck on candy during Mass, especially if there is an intention to receive. Finally, we should be in a state of grace to receive the Body of Christ; confession is offered every Saturday at 4 p.m. and by appointment.

How blessed we are. Our God sacrificed himself for our redemption. We are privileged (and obligated) to participate in this very same offering of God to God every week (even if we are unable to receive).

Goodbye to Father Ed

It was great to see so many people at the 11 a.m. Mass on October 28 and at the reception afterwards. I am happy so many of us could come together to show Father Ed that we love him. I am sure that was gratifying for him who loves all of us so much. Let's keep him in our prayers.

East Quogue Masses

With the departure of both Father Ed and Father Paul Dahm, we are effectively down from four priests who serve regularly in East Quogue to two. Also, attendance at many holy day Masses in East Quogue is low. Because of these two facts, we will plan on NOT HAVING Mass in EQ on the Feast of the Ascension, All Saints Day, or the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in 2019. Also, we will have to move the time of the Mass on December 24 to 7 p.m.

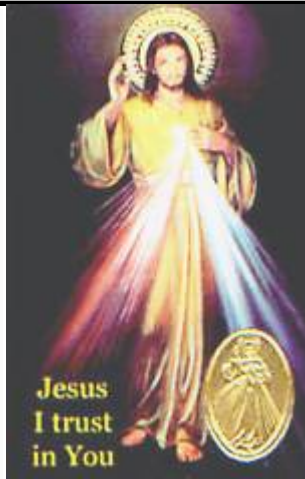

2018 Fourth Quarter Summary of SVdP Outreach To Neighbors in Need in Hampton Bays

The volunteers of our SVdP Conference at St. Rosalie's Church have had a busy and successful past three months helping our "neighbors in need" (NIN) thanks to your generous donations to the SVdP Poor Box located in the back of the entrance vestibule. Below is a summary of our activities for July, August and September 2018:



- We provided assistance with moving expenses to a neighbor in need (NIN) moving into Bishop Ryan Village
- We purchased beds, mattresses, bed linens and living room chairs for several senior NINs
- We have continued to assist NINs in the Hampton Bays community with their PSEG bills and arrears payments
- We initiated a dental referral and provided dental care to a senior NIN
- Several large purchases of diapers were donated to St. Rosalie's Parish Social Ministry's food bank for distribution to needy families in Hampton Bays
- We were involved with initial plans for our SVdP conference's financial support for the "Blessings in a Backpack" program for needy Hampton Bays elementary school students on weekends
- We donated SVdP funds to Centro Corazon de Maria's 2018 summer camp program which was used to provide lunches and snacks for the campers
- As is our practice, our volunteers had spent many hours conducting home visits to our NINs prior to assisting them with any of their emergency needs
- We continued to impart important information about the time, talents and treasures that our SVdP Conference at St. Rosalie's provides to our NINs
- We supported a fellow SVdP Conference at St. Jude's parish in Mastic Beach that was in need of emergency help
- We continued to provide rental assistance to a NIN in Hampton Bays

Our SVdP members supported a call to serve by conducting an informative presentation and sign-up opportunity at St. John the Evangelist parish in Center Moriches for parishioners there interested in forming a SVdP conference.

Assistance by our conference members had been provided to many who called our parish contact number wishing to donate clothing, furniture and housewares to the SVdP Store in Huntington. If you have anything to donate, please directly phone the Huntington Store at 631-858-0380 to set up an appointment for a pickup by the SVdP truck.

One of our Vincentians was a keynote speaker at, and several others attended, a SVdP Voice of the Poor presentation at the SVdP central office in Bethpage.
