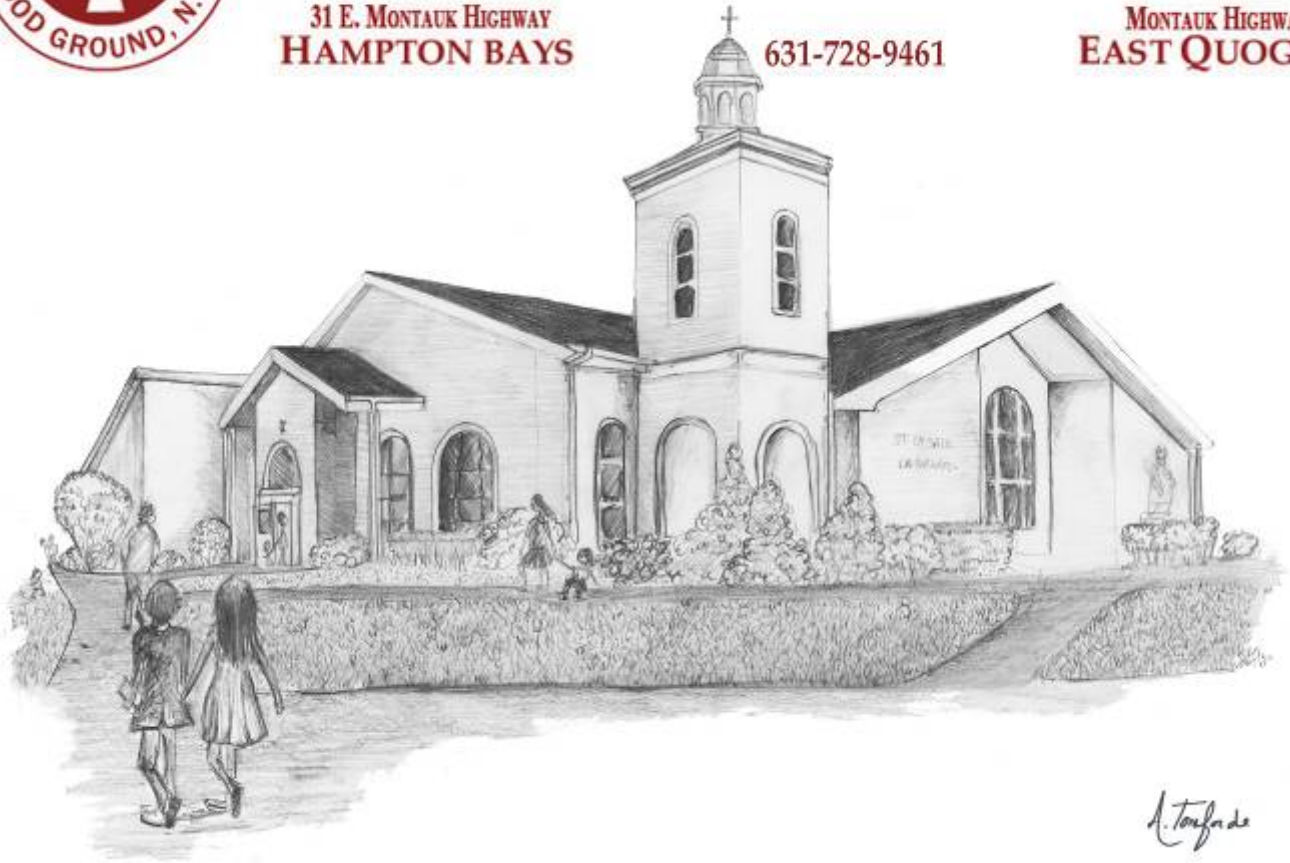

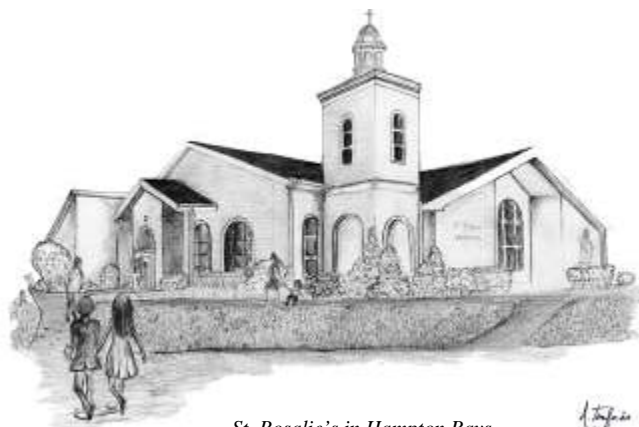

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

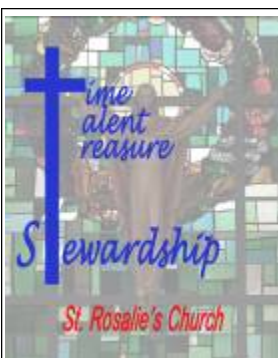
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4-4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Desk of Father Maddaloni

"Then you **are** a king?"

This is the question Pilate puts to Jesus. Just who does this Jesus think he is? If he really thinks he is a king, and if his followers think so too, he is a threat to Caesar's authority. According to Pilate's understanding, a king desires worldly wealth, status and power. Can we blame Pilate for his concern?



"**You** say that I am a king." Jesus tries to distance himself from the kingly image in Pilate's mind. "For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth." Jesus seeks to lead others to the truth, to the Father. Christ the King is the Good Shepherd who guides us.

The term "common priesthood" refers to the way in which all the baptized share in the priesthood of Christ. "The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to his own vocation, in Christ's mission as priest, prophet, and king" (CCC 1546). Sometimes the word "king" is replaced with "shepherd." The idea is the same. The kingship in which we share looks nothing like the worldly kingship of Herod, but the kingship of the Good Shepherd. We, too, share in that mission of Jesus "to testify to the truth."

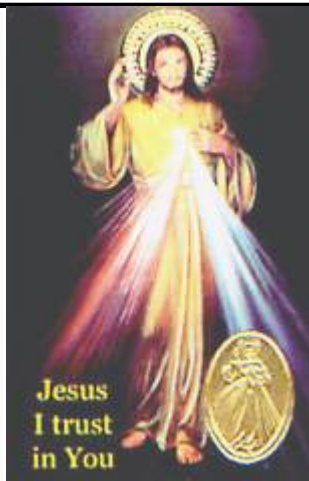
