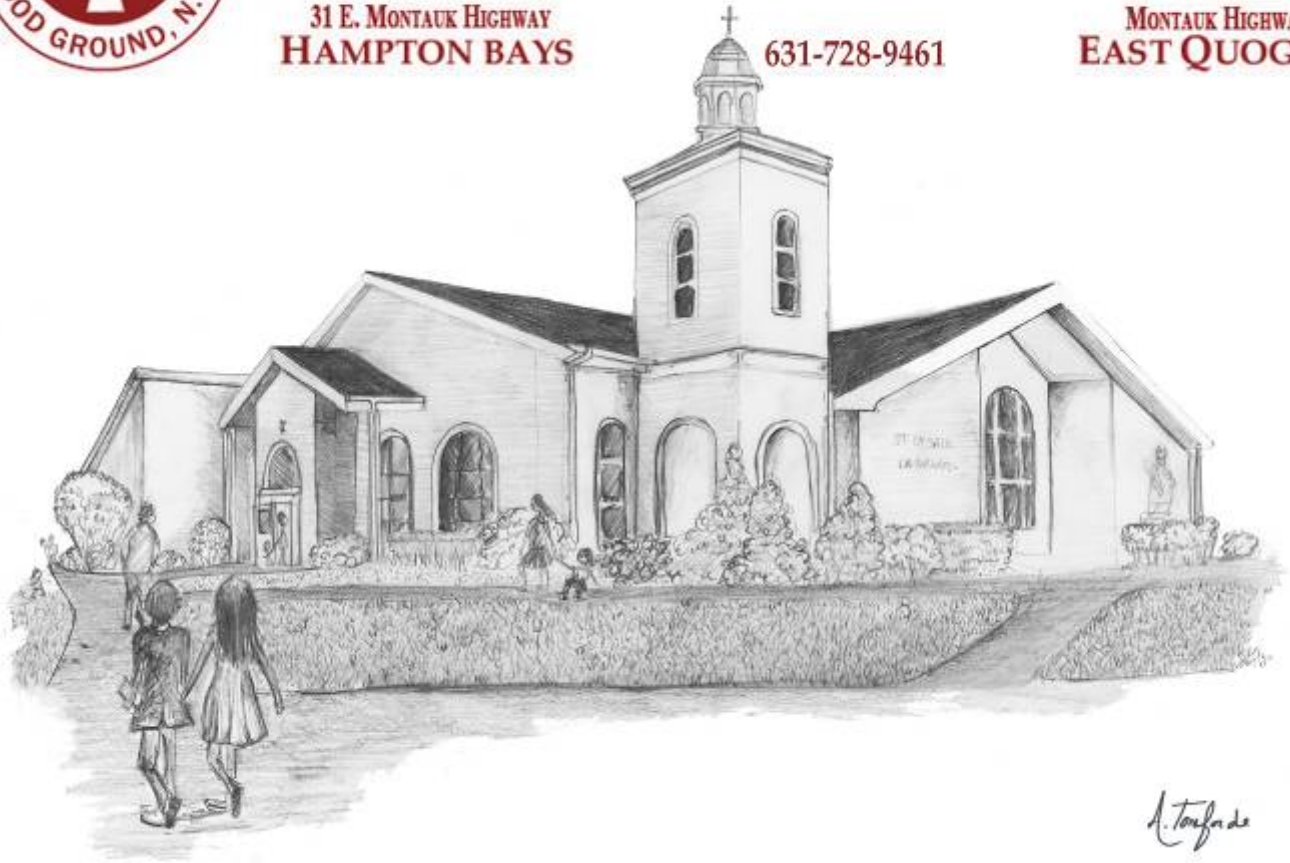

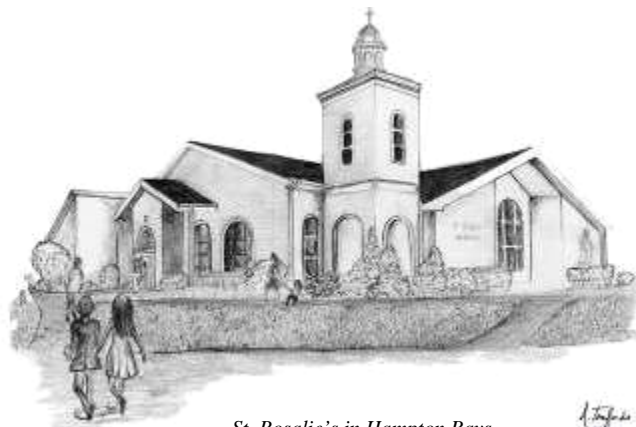

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

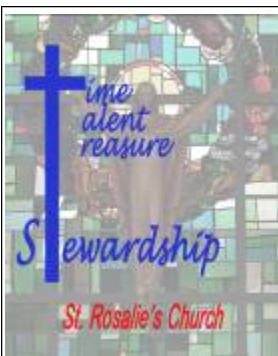
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Desk of Father John



In Ein-Kerem, in the western suburbs of Jerusalem, there is a church dedicated to the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. We know that this is where Elizabeth and Zechariah lived due, in fact, to military history. Following Pentecost, the Church began gathering for Sunday Liturgies at places of great importance, one of which was the birth place of St. John the Baptist. As persecutions came and went, pagan or Muslim rulers would build temples or Mosques on top of these locations, to demonstrate their subjugation of the Christian population. Whenever the land was liberated, the Christians would put a church back up in the same spot. So for the past two millennia, we have been quite certain of the location of these places; they include Calvary, the home of the Holy Family in Nazareth, and the birthplace of John the Baptist.

It is not only archaeological evidence which speaks to the great devotion to St. John the Baptist of the ancient Church. Eucharistic Prayer I, the only ancient Western Eucharistic prayer (the paper trail leads back to the fourth century, although it may have been used before that), names him first among the martyrs whose intercession is invoked. The Cathedral of the Archdiocese of Rome, St. John Lateran, was named for and dedicated to St. John the Baptist. In the Byzantine Rite, the Baptist is the only saint invoked after the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary in the Anaphora of the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom. In short, any time an ancient expression of the Catholic Church is used or discovered, St. John the Baptist is sure to be found.

But why was, and is, the Baptist such a big deal for the Church? Simply put, just as the Church recognizes the singular importance of the Virgin Mary's role in the advent of the Messiah, so too does she recognize the singular importance of St. John the Baptist. St. Ambrose, the great fourth century bishop of Milan, explains that "*John, the forerunner of the Word, is rightly called the voice, because the voice, being inferior, precedes; the Word, which is more excellent, follows.*" Just as a spoken word is necessarily preceded by the vibration of the vocal cords and the movement of air, so, too, was the Word of God necessarily preceded by the preaching of the Baptist and the movement of the Spirit. It is for this reason that he is the patron saint of baptisms and of converts, as he continues by his intercession to point souls to Christ. Consequently, his intercession is particularly appropriate for family or friends who may be thinking about becoming Catholic or reverting to the Church, as well as parents who are on (or off!) the fence about having their children baptized or raised in the practice of the Faith.

Two Updates

First – our implementation of the LifeTeen youth group program is moving quickly forward; we anticipate beginning this coming summer. Everything so far has been 'behind the scenes;' within the next few weeks, we will begin the visible work.

Second – from January 11 through February 22, I will be leading a series on prayer for the parish. Each session will focus briefly on the life of a saint, followed by a practical explanation of some aspect of prayer. They will be held in the Knights of Columbus hall on Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m.; the hall will supply beer, wine, and snacks at a discounted rate.

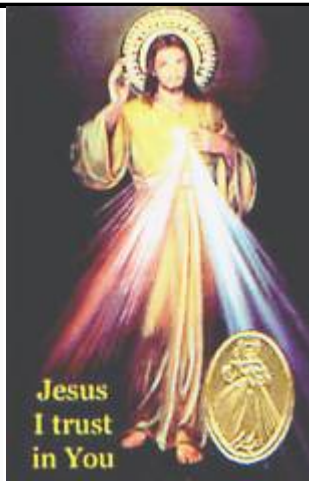

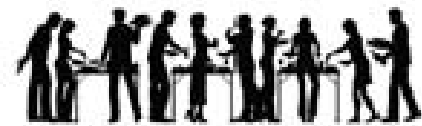
