



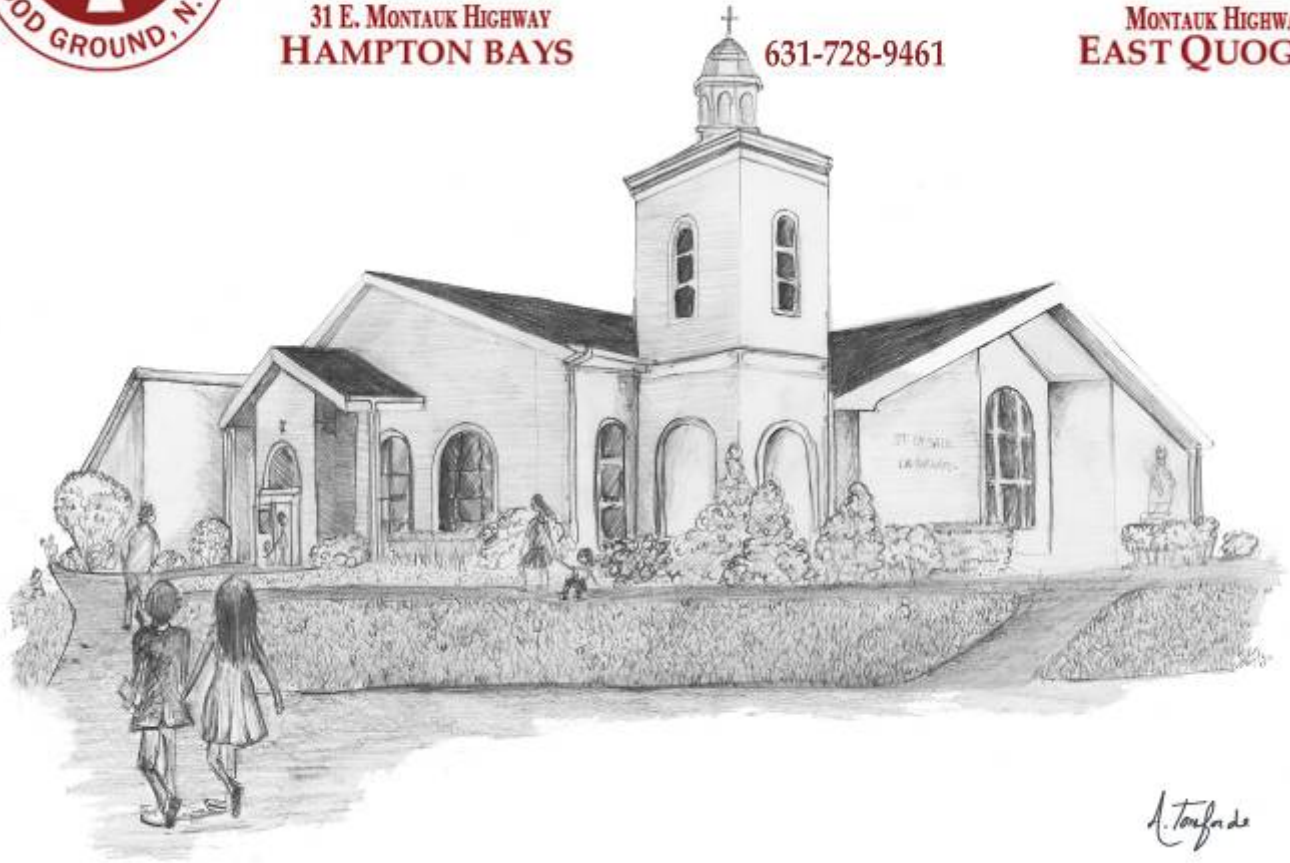

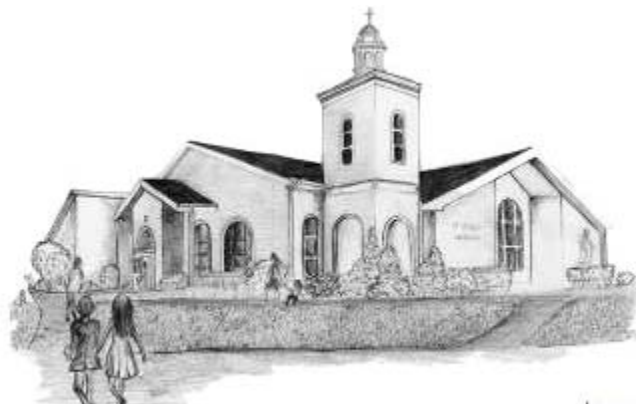

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

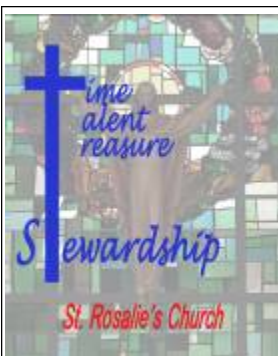
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

From the Desk of Father Maddaloni

“W

hile they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her first-born son. She wrapped him in swaddling

clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.” LUKE 2:6-7

Simple. Humble. Pure.

When I was small, my parents had a rule. We could not open any presents until we had said a prayer before the nativity scene on the mantle. We knew that the celebration, with all its thrills, was imminent, but this small ritual started the day. It helped ensure that the horse was firmly before the cart and not the other way around – first the nativity of Jesus, then the celebration of it.

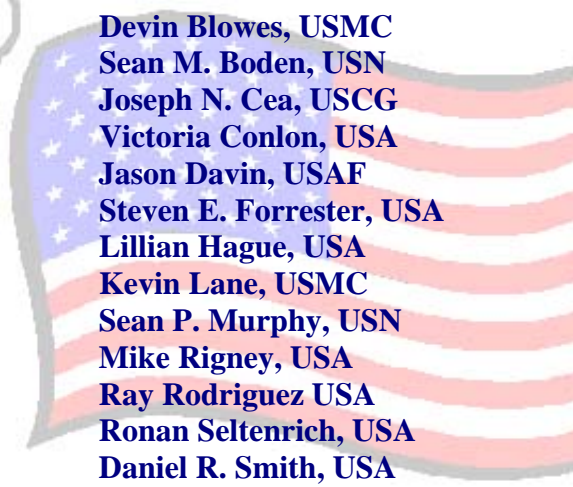

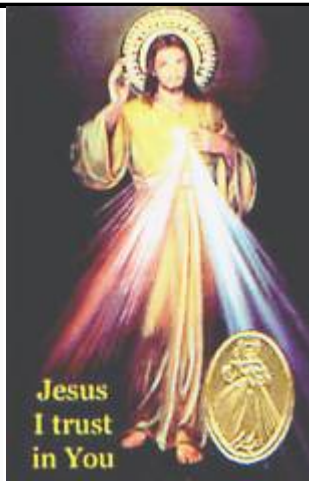
